IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 8 of the Rabies Act, the Director of Veterinary Services orders that the following provisions shall have effect and be complied with in the area specified in the Schedule hereto, which is an area in which rabies has broken out:

1. For a period of three months from the coming into operation of this order, or for such longer period as the Director of Veterinary Services shall by notice declare, all dogs shall at all times be secured on leads except when in enclosed premises, a dwelling-house, or a building and shall be kept in enclosed premises, a dwelling-house, or a building between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

2. After the expiration of three months or such longer period as aforesaid, all dogs shall be secured on leads at all times when on or near a public road and shall be kept in enclosed premises, a dwelling-house, or a building between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

3. (1) Any dog that is suspected of having been bitten by or been in contact with rabid animal may, if not destroyed, with the approval of a veterinary officer be secured in a place of isolation as hereinafter provided and kept under observation for a period of at least six months and shall be examined at least once a month by a veterinary officer during such period.

(2) A dog is deemed to have been in contact with an animal if it has been same building, kennel, field or other place as the animal.

4. For the purposes of paragraph 3, the dog shall be secured in a suitable place of detention in the immediate neighbourhood of the place where the dog is normally kept or in such other place as may be approved by the Director of Veterinary Services.

5. The place of detention shall comprise a kennel or other enclosure with sufficient adjoining space to provide for the full liberty of the dog in the open air, the whole being so enclosed as to prevent the escape of the dog therefrom or its contact with any other dog:

Provided that in the absence of such facilities the dog may, as a temporary expedient, be detained in such manner as may be approved by a veterinary officer or inspector.

6. A veterinary officer, or any person authorized by him in writing, may destroy any dog not controlled in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs 3, 4 and 5.

7. The carcass of an animal that has died from rabies or that has been destroyed on account of rabies shall be burned or buried by the owner or the person in charge of such animal.

8. No person shall move any dog or cause any dog to be moved out of or into the area specified in the Schedule without the prior written permission of a veterinary officer.

6. The buildings shall not cover a greater of the land than that laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.

7. The grantee shall not subdivide the land without the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands.

8. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the land or any part thereof or any building thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the Commissioner of Lands. CAUSE No. 79 OF 1979

Parties:

Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers
and
Sawarn Singh & Sons

Issues in dispute:

1. Employer's unilateral decision to declare Mr. Ignatius Mwangi redundant contrary to both the parties' collective agreement and the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act 1971.
2. Underpaying Mr. Mwangi below the agreed minimum rate as provided for in the parties' collective agreement.

1. The Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Sawarn Singh & Sons shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2 The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 2nd April, 1980 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Claimants also called I. Mwangi to give evidence, on oath.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 16th July, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 18th December together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The Claimants have brought this dispute on behalf of their member, Ignatius Mwangi, who they allege was declared redundant contrary to the parties' collective agreement and the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act 1971. They also allege that he was underpaid as per the parties' collective agreement effective during the material time.

The Respondents are members of the Electrical Contractors' Group which group has had collective agreements with the Claimants for the purposes of this dispute from 1975 onwards.

Mr. Mwangi was employed by them on 2nd May, 1975 at a monthly salary of K.Sh. 300. He received increments as follows during his service with the Respondents:

"August 1975	312
February 1976	330
April 1976	350

September 1977	500
October 1977	550
31st August, 1977 following a 10 per cent order for an increase	590"

He was served with a notice of termination dated 8th September, 1978 giving him one month's notice.

The dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and during the investigation the Claimants maintained that Mr. Mwangi had been underpaid to the tune of K.Sh. 17,838/80. The Ministry's findings and recommendations were conveyed to the parties on 26th June, 1979 in the following terms:

"Findings:

Mr. Mwangi's termination as a result of redundancy was found to be genuine since it was as a result of lack of new contracts to the firm of contractors. The employer while arguing that he did not contravene the agreement or Trade Disputes Act has not anywhere shown where they discussed with the union agreed on the redundancy or where they obtained the Industry Court approval for the redundancy. I find the redundancy wrongful. He was engaged in 1975 as a labourer and was paid wages that were legal at that time. It has been argued that Mr. Mwangi was an electrician's helper and not an electrician as claimed by the union. A case that Mwangi was an electrician has not been sufficiently proved.

Recommendation:

After careful consideration of the facts contained herein it is recommended that Mr. Mwangi be paid redundancy payments as per the parties' collective agreement. I however do not make any recommendation in respect of the arrears as the case is not proved."

During the hearing the Claimants stressed that Mr. Mwangi had been victimized for his trade union activities and not because the Respondents had suffered a reduction in their work. The Claimants gave a history of their attempts in recruiting the Respondents' employees into their membership and the frustrations which they had suffered at their hands. It appears that at one stage most of the Respondents' employees joined the Claimants but in the end very few of them remained in union membership with the Claimants alleging that 17 of their members had been victimized by the Respondents for one reason or the other. In any case, the Claimants maintained that the Respondents had not followed the proper legal procedure in the case of declaring redundancy and their member had therefore suffered wrongful termination in addition to having been underpaid.

The Claimants asked the Court to award Mr. Mwangi maximum compensation as provided for in the Trade Disputes Act and also to order his reinstatement along with an order to the Respondents that they should pay Mr. Mwangi K.Sh. 6,216 being the underpayment contrary to the parties' collective agreement.

The Respondents opposed this demand very vigorously and maintained that there had been no underpayment and referred to document which is Appendix 1 to their written submission which they claimed Mr. Mwangi had signed and which read as follows:

"I, Ignatius Mwangi, employed by Messrs. Sawarn Singh & Sons, P.O. Box 16603, Nairobi certify that I have received in full the due benefit in wages as per collective agreement made on the 8th August, 1977 between the Electrical Contractors Group and the Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers.

I certify that I have received the sum of K.Sh. 490 in full and final settlement of the above claim in respect of 10 per cent increase in my gross salary from June 1976 onwards and further additional increase in my wage from June 1977 onwards details of which are:

Basic gross salary 1st June, 1976 10 per
increase from June 1976 to 31st May, 1977

Salary 1st June, 1977 K.Sh. 590

10 per cent of original salary as at 1st
June, 1977 for June, July and August 1977

10 per cent increase for June, July and

August 1977. Dated 31st August, 1977."

On the issue of redundancy they admitted that they had not followed the procedure as laid down and on the advice of the Federation of Kenya Employers they had tried to rectify this mistake by offering to pay Mr. Mwangi the redundancy pay calculated at the rate of 15 days' pay for each completed year of service which would amount to K.Sh. 900. In addition to this they had offered to pay him three months' pay as compensation for wrongful termination and had rounded the figure to K.Sh. 2,500.

The Respondents asked the Court to reject the Claimants' demand for astronomical payments which were not genuine but were motivated by malice. They pointed out that the Claimants had at one stage increased their demand to K.Sh. 21,000 then dropped it to K.Sh. 16,838 and in their written submission they claimed the underpayment to have been K.Sh. 6,216 only.

The Court is confronted with two statements, one by Mr. Mwangi that he was engaged by the Claimants as an electrician's mate and the Respondents' that he was employed as a general labourer. The Court has to decide which is the true one. The Claimants' stand is somewhat inconsistent on this issue in that they have demanded various amounts from the Respondents ranging from K.Sh. 21,000 at the highest to K.Sh. 6,216 at the lowest as stated in their written submission. This sort of vacillating demand on behalf of Mr. Mwangi does not help the Claimants' claim on the issue of underpayment. In addition to this Mr. Mwangi signed a document which is quoted hereinabove. This coupled with the Ministry of Labour Investigator's finding that the claim in respect of arrears arising out of underpayment is not proved leaves the Court with no alternative but to find that Mr. Mwangi was not underpaid. If he had in fact been underpaid he would have taken up this matter through the Claimants much earlier and would not have waited to raise it after the termination of his services. The Court notes that Mr. Mwangi is now an electrician having passed in grade III the trade test in May last year.

As far as the other issue is concerned there is no doubt that the Respondents were at fault in not complying with the requirements of the Trade Disputes Act in force at the time before the so called redundancy of Mr. Mwangi. There is some truth in the Claimants submission that Mr. Mwangi's services were

terminated more because of his trade union membership than due to lack of contracts. The fact, however, remains that the Respondents also admit that they were at fault. In these circumstances the Court has no hesitation in coming to the conclusion that Mr. Mwangi suffered a wrongful dismissal. Although the Claimants had asked for his reinstatement the fact is that Mr. Mwangi is now working with the K.C.C. at Nyahururu since October 1979 and is earning K.Sh. 1,034 per month. In these circumstances the Court cannot order his reinstatement but he is certainly entitled to be paid compensation for the wrongful dismissal. The Court awards that the Respondents should pay Mr. Mwangi seven months' salary by way of compensation based at K.Sh. 590 per month which was the salary Mr. Mwangi was earning when his services were terminated. Since the Respondents have admitted to pay Mr. Mwangi redundancy benefits at the rate of 15 days' pay for each completed year of service amounting to K.Sh. 900 the Court awards that in addition to the compensation the Respondents should also pay this amount to Mr. Mwangi.

Issue in dispute:

Wrongful termination of G. H. Munyiri and
J. B. Khamala.

1. The Kenya Management Staff Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Settlement Fund Trustees shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.
2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 24th and 25 March, 1980 and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The Claimants also called the following witnesses to give evidence:

G. H. Munyiri.
J. B. Khamala.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 6th July, 1979 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 27th December together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute concerns two former employees of the Respondents whose services were terminated on 4th October, 1976 in accordance with the relevant clause in the Local Agreement clause 8 which reads as follows:

8 (1) The Trustees may at any time determine the engagement of the person engaged by giving him three months' notice in writing, or by paying him one month's salary in lieu of notice.

(2) The person engaged may, at any time after the expiration of three months from the commencement of his term of engagement, determine his engagement by giving to the Trustees three months' notice in writing, or by paying to the Trustees one month's salary.

(3) If the person engaged terminates his engagement otherwise than in accordance with this Agreement, he shall be liable to pay to the Trustees on demand as liquidated damages three months' salary."

In the case of G. H. Munyiri the agreement is dated 1st July, 1974 and was to run for three years. He was engaged as a senior accountant.

As far as J. B. Khamala is concerned he would have been offered exactly the same Local Agreement after it had been agreed that the Respondents would offer him employment had it not been for the lapse on the part of someone in the Respondents' organization in overlooking the drawing up and the execution of the agreement. Both parties, however, are agreed that to all intents and purposes Mr. Khamala was also bound by the terms of the same Local Agreement as in the case of Mr. Munyiri.

Mr. Munyiri had already completed three previous contracts with the Respondents effective from 1st January, 1969 and this was his fourth contract effective from 1st July, 1974 and was to expire on 30th June, 1977. It is not denied by the Respondents that during all this time there were no adverse reports on his work performance.

It appears that this was first contract of Mr. Khamala and he was appointed in August 1975 for 36 months.

In or about August 1976 it was found that there had been an overpayment of K.Sh. 20,000 through cheque No. 288839 which had been officially issued for a sum of K.Sh. 1,682 only. It is claimed by the Claimants that it was Mr. Khamala who had detected this overpayment during the course of his normal checking as it had not been reflected in the cash book. The Respondents however, referred the Court to the judgement of the Resident Magistrate, Kisumu in criminal case No. 942/76 in which Richard Awiti s/o Odago was the accused in connexion with the aforesaid fraud of K.Sh. 20,000. They referred particularly to the following passage in the judgement:

"There has been evidence that cheque No. 288839 was handed over at the office of Sugar Settlement Organization, Muhoroni by a clerk from National Bank of Kenya. That this cheque was later found missing. That in fact one clerk at the office of the organization saw this cheque when requested to tick cheques against bank statement and that this clerk handed all the cheques he had ticked including the cheques in question to account Mr. Khamala. I have considered this evidence and the suggestion that the cheque was returned for initialling by signatories Messrs. Munyiri and Ogoli. If need this cheque was handed over to Khamala by Muga (PW 12) when Khamala had asked Muga to tick cheques against bank statements, then Muga must have ticked this cheque 288839 and that the same cheque was present. In these circumstances the cheque disappeared with knowledge of Khamala but this does not exonerate accused from evidence that he had received from Otieno the cheque for K.Sh. 1,683 initially."

This dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and the Investigator came to the conclusion that the action of the Respondents in terminating the services of both these gentlemen was wrongful and unjustified and the Ministry made the following recommendation in respect of them:

1. "Munyiri:

Mr. Munyiri's Local Agreement would have expired on 30th June, 1977 but was terminated on 4th October, 1976. It had another nine months to go. The fund breached it on 4th October, 1976 and it is recommended that Mr. Munyiri be paid full salary for the balance of his contract i.e. full salary from 4th October, 1976 to 30th June, 1977. In addition he be paid his gratuity as laid in his contract. The contract should be regarded as having been unaffected until it expired on 30th June, 1977. If his contract stipulates he be paid transport on the expiry of his contract to his place of domicile, this should be paid.

2. Khamala:

Mr. Khamala's contract was wrongfully terminated as from 6th October, 1976 before the expiry date of 30th September, 1978. The management therefore breached the contract. It is therefore recommended that he be paid all his entitlements as if the operation and the terms of the contract were unaffected."

The Claimants have lodged a claim for K.Sh. 90,851 in respect of Mr. Munyiri and for K.Sh. 62,380 in respect of Mr. Khamala against the Respondents. The details of these claims appear in the Claimants' appendix 2 of their written submission. Their demand is based on the submission that the Respondents had absolutely no justification or reason to terminate their services before the expiry of their contracts.

The Respondents on the other hand pleaded very vigorously that they have exercised their right under the contracts between Messrs. Munyiri and Khamala and themselves in accordance with clause 8 of the said contracts the contents of which have already been set out hereinabove in the award. They added that

according to them Messrs. Munyiri and Khamala were entitled to the following amounts only:

The Court would first of all like to deal with Mr. Khamala's dispute. The Court is satisfied that the Respondents had sufficient evidence before them arising out of the incident relating to cheque No. 288839 to lose confidence in Mr. Khamala. The Magistrate's judgement in the criminal case as quoted hereinabove reinforces the Respondents' conclusion in this respect. The Court therefore finds that the Respondents were entitled and fully justified in terminating his services and therefore acted properly in utilizing the provisions of clause 8 of the Local Agreement which both the parties admit was applicable in the case of Mr. Khamala also. In these circumstances the Court upholds the Respondents' decision and rejects the Claimants' demand for a sum of K.Sh. 62,380. Instead, the Court awards that the Respondents should pay Mr. Khamala a sum of K.Sh. 7,328/65 in accordance with their offer.

Now coming to the case of Mr. Munyiri although his services were also terminated at the time of the incident of the above cheque No. 288839 the Court can find no evidence at all to implicate Mr. Munyiri in it. In fact the Respondents did not even try to suggest that Mr. Munyiri was in any way involved in the overpayment of K.Sh. 20,000 on this cheque. The Court was impressed by Mr. Munyiri's evidence when he described the behaviour of the then executive controller of the Respondents at Muhoroni who was not in his office most of the time and was found in a certain bar during working hours. Furthermore through his drinking habits this executive controller was not even in a position to sign the cheques properly with the result that the bank started dishonouring the Respondents' cheques. In these circumstances Mr. Munyiri had to do the needful in order to save the situation by taking the required measures. He admitted that he had a tractor which he used to hire to the Respondents but added that nobody objected to his tractor being hired.

In the case of Mr. Munyiri the Court cannot find the reason why the Respondents terminated his services unless it was because he was the head of the accounting section and the Respondents felt that because K.Sh. 20,000 had been overpaid by fraud therefore he should also go. This is most unfair and unreasonable attitude to adopt in a case of this nature. There is no evidence at all to suggest that there was any negligence of duty on the part of Mr. Munyiri. In these circumstances the Court finds that the Respondents' decision to terminate his services in accordance with the contract giving them the right to terminate his services by giving him one month's salary in lieu of notice is indeed colourable and subject to challenge. Mr. Munyiri had completed three contracts with the Respondents and was only nine months away from completing his fourth contract. After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court finds that Mr. Munyiri has indeed suffered a wrongful dismissal. The Court would like to draw the Respondents' attention to this Court's numerous decisions where submissions similar to the Respondents' in this dispute to the effect that once an employer has strictly complied with his obligations under the contract of employment then there can be no question of there being a wrongful dismissal, has been overruled. The Court need not give the reasons all over again in this dispute as it should be common knowledge by now in Kenya.

The Court must, however, uphold the Respondents' submission that Mr. Munyiri is entitled to only 30 days' special leave and not to an accumulated 118½ days' (K.Sh. 12,812) as claimed by the Claimants. Further, the Court rejects the claim

made on his behalf for nine months' house allowance from 1st October, 1976 to 30th June, 1977 (K.Sh. 10,800). The Court also rejects the claim made by the Claimants on Mr. Munyiri's behalf for K.Sh. 3,230 being payment in accordance with the Directorate of Personnel circular letter known by the Respondents as this claim was not substantiated. The Court also to Kitale/Kimilili being first class fare by rail and bus for him and his family. Having rejected the above items the Court awards that the Respondents should pay Mr. Munyiri his full salary for nine months from 4th October, 1976 to 30th June, 1977 amounting to K.Sh. 29,070 and all the gratuity that is due to him at the rate of 25 per cent of the salary actually earned by him during his contract including nine months awarded by the Court, K.Sh. 3,230 for the special terminal leave, three days' salary K.Sh. 312/60 and K.Sh. 1,670 being the transport cost from Muhoroni to Kitale/Kimilili.







THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the *Kenya Gazette, Supplements* etc.:-

- (1) *Kenya Gazette* contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) *Legislative Supplement* contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:-

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-**Kenya Gazette**

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.

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
