Select sales agents and supervise their activities in terms of programme interest and specific conditions of the geographical area.
- (d) Initiate and plan the promotion and publicity campaigns carried out by his assistants; manage part of the publicity budget; choose the most effective promotion methods in view of commercial requirements and the most priority objectives of the programme. Exercise general control over the preparation and production of catalogues, lists and other advertising material. Supervise all activities linked with the specialized press (literary criticisms, reviews, advertising, etc.).

Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) University degree or equivalent. Excellent knowledge (written and spoken) of French. Good knowledge of Russian. Knowledge of English and/or German would be an advantage.
- (b) Thorough knowledge of publishing methods and practices, particularly in the field of promotion, publicity and marketing. Experience of administrative work in an international organization.
- (c) Drafting ability essential (correspondence and miscellaneous texts).
- (d) Ability to—
 - (i) establish personal contact with staff in posts of responsibility;

- (f) Performing such other tasks as may be assigned.

Qualifications and experience required:

- (a) University degree in one of the natural sciences or in engineering or in science communication.
- (b) Several years' experience as a full-time communicator of science or technology in one or more of the print or audiovisual media, addressing both lay audiences and those within the scientific-technical community interested in learning outside their special fields. Experience in editing and preparing manuscripts, scenarios or film outlines.
- (c) Familiarity, as a result of professional contact, with media dealing with widespread, international dissemination of scientific and technical information for popular consumption.
- (d) Fluency in English, French or Spanish, with a documented ability to write, correct and edit in one of these; good working knowledge of at least one of the other languages.

Transport allowance.

1. The Kenya Union of Entertainment and Music Industry Employees shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Bomas of Kenya Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 12th and 20th June and 10th July, 1980, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 3rd November, 1979, duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 1st April, 1980, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute has an unfortunate background for several reasons. The first and foremost is the fact that the Respondents are not a self-supporting financially viable enterprise. Despite the fact that they receive revenue through their own resources like money received from admission tickets to their performances and through sale of handicraft and from the bar and restaurant, they have been heavily subsidized by the Ministry of Tourism through the K.T.D.C. in the form of loans.

The Respondents started their operations on 1st March, 1973, and are a limited liability company. They have a workforce of 128 employees including the manager and his personal secretary.

The Claimants forwarded their proposals to the Respondents for the first ever collective agreement between them on 17th March, 1976. A JIC meeting was held on 24th May, 1976, during which several items were agreed upon. The Claimants reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour on 7th March, 1976, and meetings were held in order to resolve the dispute with the final meeting taking place on 29th December, 1976. At this juncture a startling development took place in that there was a massive resignation by the Respondents' employees from the Claimants' membership with the result that the dispute was delayed. The next conciliation meeting had to be postponed to 27th May, 1977. As stated above, the Notification of Dispute Form "A" was dated 3rd November, 1979, so apparently there was a further delay of over two years and the matter was registered by the Industrial Court as recently as 1st April, 1980.

To make matters worse for both the parties the one very vital issue which figures prominently in such disputes—one of a general wage increase for the workers—is missing. The Claimants have, either through inexperience or for some other reasons which the Court cannot understand, tried to rely for getting a wage increase for their members through the issue of basic minimum wage only. The Employment Promotion Division analysis, however, reveals that the workers are actually receiving more than Claimants' demand on the basic minimum monthly wage in many categories! This serious omission coupled with the fact that the effective date of the collective agreement and the duration period were also not issues in dispute put the Court in a most embarrassing position as through the parties' own neglect and default an award made by the Court would have in many categories not helped the workers at all. In these circumstances the Court asked the parties to include the issues of a general wage increase and the effective date and duration in this dispute. This fortunately they have done.

The factual position on the basic minimum wage issue at the time of the hearing of this dispute is as follows:

The Court is now faced with a situation where the workers being fully aware that the Claimants have taken certain steps to negotiate a collective agreement on their behalf as far back as 1976 find that they have not benefited at all through the Claimants' efforts up till now.

The Respondents on the other hand strongly pleaded their inability to meet any high demands from the Claimants because of excess expenditure over revenue. They stated that for the period covering 1st July, 1979 to 30th April, 1980, the revenue and expenditure was as follows:

The Respondents further indicated that they have been informed by the Government that they would not be getting any further subsidy. Despite all this they pointed out that they had given the employees wage increases ranging from 5 per cent to 15 per cent in July 1975 and further increases ranging from Sh. 50 to Sh. 100 in April 1978.

After the conclusion of the hearing the Respondents indicated to the Court and the Claimants that they wanted to make an offer of 5 per cent salary increase with effect from 1st July 1980 and a further 5 per cent salary increase after the expiry of one year. They stated that this offer along with the adjustments to the minimum wages for the various categories as discussed with the E.P.D. should satisfy the workers during the next two years.

Under the aforesaid complex circumstances the Court has to establish some rationale for creating the first ever collective agreement between the parties so that in future years they will know where they stand and what steps to take to improve the workers' lot.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the Court makes the following award on the various issues in dispute:

1. Basic minimum wage and general wage increase

The Court awards that all the Respondents' unionisable employees should get a wage increase of 10 per cent with effect from 1st June, 1979, on their salaries which they were getting at the end of May 1979.

The Court further awards with effect from 1st June, 1980, the following minimum wages for the various grades:

The Court further directs that with effect from 1st June, 1980, all those workers who do not benefit from the new monthly minimum wages should get a wage increase of $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent with effect from 1st June, 1980. The Court further rules that no employee affected by the new minimum wages should get an increase of less than $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

2. Leave allowance

The Court awards that all the unionisable employees should get leave allowance of Sh. 120 when they proceed on their annual leave and that this award should be effective from 1st June, 1979.

3. Housing allowance

The Court was told that the workers are in receipt of consolidated salaries but the majority of them are provided subsidized housing accommodation by the Respondents at a monthly rate of Sh. 25 for two per room and Sh. 50 for one per room paid by the occupiers. In addition free water and electricity and in some cases free bedding are provided. Only 31 employees are not housed by the Respondents.

The Court awards that with effect from 1st June, 1980, the Respondents should provide free housing accommodation for all those who live in the premises provided by them. They should also not be charged for water and electricity.

With effect from the same date, i.e 1st June, 1980, those of the Respondents' employees who are not housed should get a house allowance of Sh. 60 in addition to the consolidated salary that they are getting.

4. Transport or allowance

The Court makes a nil award on this issue.

The Court rules that the duration period of the collective agreement should be two years with effect from 1st June, 1979.

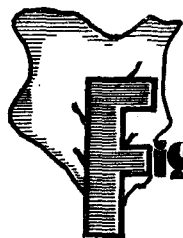

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- (1) *Kenya Gazette* contains notices of a general nature and which do not affect legislation, and may be submitted direct to the Government Printer.
- (2) *Legislative Supplement* contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government, and must be submitted through the Office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction into the National Assembly only.
- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of a foolscap sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible, and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

D.41. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready.
