Issues in dispute:

1. Amendment to scope of the medical aid scheme.
2. Amendment to clause (i) and (ii) of the medical aid scheme.
3. Amendment to clause 2 (iii) of the medical aid scheme.
4. Amendment to clause 5 (1) (ii) of the medical aid scheme.
5. Amendment to clause 6 of the medical aid scheme.
6. Amendment to clause 8 of the medical aid scheme.
7. Amendment to appendix "B" of the medical aid scheme.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Kenya Bankers (Employers) Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 19th and 21st August, 1980 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 18th January, 1980 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 5th May together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The medical scheme in force for the employees of the Respondents' members was agreed upon on 26th July, 1974. This covers about 7,905 bank employees working all over the country.

The current medical aid scheme through Plan "A" covers technical and subordinate staff and through Plan "B" section heads and clerical staff. This is a medical insurance scheme and the insurance company is Crusader Insurance Co. Ltd.

The annual premium which was paid by the Respondents to begin was K.Sh. 120 in respect of Plan "A" and K.Sh. 150 in respect of Plan "B" covering a total maximum benefit payable in any one year of insurance for any member of K.Sh. 5,000 for Plan "A" and K.Sh. 6,500 for Plan "B". These premium were increased without the Claimants' agreement or consultations for Plan "A" to K.Sh. 150 and Plan "B" to K.Sh. 180 with the maximum benefits going up to K.Sh. 5,500 for Plan "A" and K.Sh. 7,000 for Plan "B".

Issue 1: Amendment to scope of the medical aid scheme

On the question of the scope of the medical scheme the Court fails to understand what the Claimants are after on this particular point. No one can dispute the Claimants' contention that in the first place it is the employer who is responsible for meeting the employees claims as agreed between them but since the employer has made arrangements with an insurance company with the active connivance and agreement of the Claimants the Court fails to understand how, unless the whole scheme is scrapped, the insurance company should be asked to take a back seat in the whole arrangement.

The Court is satisfied that the medical scheme is an agreement between the insurance company and the employer because it is the employer i.e. the Respondents, who continue to meet the full premiums to cover their employees in terms of the medical scheme. In these circumstances therefore unless the Claimants had demanded a complete cancellation of the present arrangement the Court must reject their demand which in any case the Claimants failed to put clearly to the Court.

Issue 2: Amendment to Clause 1 (i) of the Medical Aid Scheme and Issue 6 Amendment to Clause 8

The dispute between the parties on this clause is the Claimants' demand that it should cover the employee's wife and children as well. At present it is clearly spelled out in the parties' agreement in clause 8 as follows:

"Should either the union or the members concerned wish families of members to be covered by medical insurance, this will need to be the subject of an entirely private and separate arrangement between either the union or the individual employee concerned and the Insurance Company to which the employer will not be a party in any way whatsoever."

The main reason why the Respondents are not agreeable to any amendment to this clause is the cost as it would cost them

an additional £80,000 for wives and an additional £130,000 for children which would increase the amount to £350,000.

The Court notes that the only two companies who do provide medical benefits for wives and children run their own dispensaries as most of their employees work in one or two places whereas in the banks as their branches are all over the country with very few employees at some of these branches it would indeed be difficult to open clinics for them at these centres.

The Claimants laid great stress on the fact that the expatriates in the banking industry enjoyed a medical scheme which covered their entire families in addition to the very high salaries and other allowances which they were paid. The Claimants added that at the moment the Respondents' 14 member banks paid out a mere total of K.Sh. 160,000 p.a. for their entire 8,000 staff by way of premiums and if wives and children were included they will pay a total premium of less than K.Sh. 580,000.

The Claimants strongly submitted that this amount was an insignificant one which the banks could easily afford in view of the enormous profits they made in the country.

The Court has carefully considered this particular demand made by the Claimants but is not prepared to award an amendment to this particular clause and the Court accordingly directs that the scheme should continue to cover the Respondents' employees only.

Issue 2: Clause 1 (ii)

The Court would now like to move to the Claimants' demand in respect of clause 1 (ii) i.e. the cancellation of the employees membership. On this aspect of the scheme the Court can see the Claimants' arguments when they say that primarily it is the responsibility of the Respondents to discipline an employee for any false claims. The Respondents have pleaded that it would be inequitable for a person who infringes the rules to continue to benefit under the scheme.

The Court finds merit in the Claimants' demand on the amendment to this clause and awards that the insurance company should not have the right to cancel an employee's membership until such time as the alleged offence of the employee has been discussed, investigated and a decision arrived at through the recognized channels established between the parties to this dispute.

Issue 3: Amendment to Clause 2 (iii)

The Court accepts the amendments put forward by the Claimants on this clause. The Court awards that both parties should have the right to suggest amendments and variations and that while negotiations proceed the old arrangement, shall continue until negotiations are completed.

Issue 4: Amendment to Clause 5 (1) (ii)

The Claimants' demand is that there should be one unified plan for all bank employees to cover the technical and subordinate staff and the clerical and section heads and check clerks. The Court has already referred hereinabove in the award to these two Plans "A" and "B" with different premiums which were unilaterally increased by the Respondents.

The Court while not agreeing to the merger of the Plans awards that Plan "A" and "B" should be amended to offer a maximum benefit of Sh. 8,000 to those who fall under Plan "A" and Sh. 10,000 for those who fall under Plan "B" as the Court is satisfied that the Claimants did succeed in putting up a good case for these amendments. The Court accordingly awards and directs that the Respondents should undertake to pay the increased premiums to cater for the above amendments.

Issue 5: Amendment to Clause 6

The Claimants' demand here is that the Respondents' members should in the first instance settle the medical expenses on behalf of their employees and claim it from the insurance company who after all look after the interest of the employers. The Claimants emphasized that at present the employees suffer a great hardship in trying to meet their medical expenses in the first place and then in the end get only a small refund from the insurance company.

The Respondents have resisted this amendment very strongly on the ground that the system is working satisfactorily at present as there had been no cause to resort to arbitration in accordance with Clause 6 (vi) and that two months' period for members to furnish information to the insurers was a reasonable period.

The Court notes that what the Claimants are after through this amendment is for the Respondents' members to act as intermediate payers of claims to their employees for their medical expenses. The Respondents have pleaded that it would represent an unnecessary burden on the administration of their

member banks and that individual banks are in a position to make compassionate loans in cases of hardship pending settlement from the insurance scheme and the National Hospital Insurance Fund. Notwithstanding these points the Court sympathizes with the Claimants on their demand and awards that the Respondents should in the first place pay the employees medical expenses and then claim the same from the insurance company. Any amount which is in excess of the refundable claim should be treated as compassionate loan to be deducted from the employee's salary. The amount of these compassionate loans however will be entirely at the discretion of each member bank.

Issue 7: Amendment to Appendix B of the Medical Aid Scheme

The Court has already dealt with the aspect of the merger of Plan "A" and "B" and has increased the maximum benefits for these plans under amendment to Clause 5 (1) (ii).

The Claimants' other demand is that categorization of the ailments should be done away with as these left the employees at a great disadvantage. They quoted an example of Sh. 15 per consultation and termed this figure as totally inadequate and divorced from reality. The Court has also taken into consideration the cases of hardship in respect of which the Claimants produced documentary evidence.

The Court has carefully considered this demand and has come to the conclusion that categorization of ailments should stay as at present but the amounts which can be claimed in respect of each item should be proportionately increased to reflect renewed total maximum benefits in any one year of insurance provided that the amount claimable by the employees as at present is increased by an amount of not less than 50 per cent on each item. The Court awards that the Respondents should pay the increased premiums if that is necessary in order to meet this part of the Court award as well.

Finally the Court rejects the Claimants' demand that expenses incurred in connexion with pregnancy either normal or abnormal—childbirth, caesarean operations (except the first section), dental and optical treatment should be part of the medical scheme. The Court rules that they should continue to be excluded from the medical scheme as at present.

The Court appreciates that the Respondents need time to finalize arrangements with the insurance company to cater for the award made by the Court in favour of the workers. The Court accordingly awards that the Medical aid Scheme as amended by the Court award should be effective from 1st January, 1981.

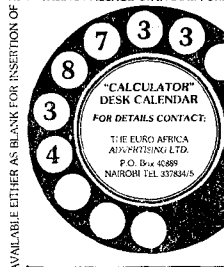

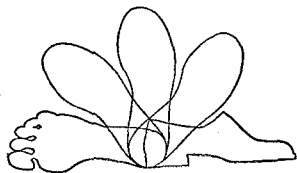

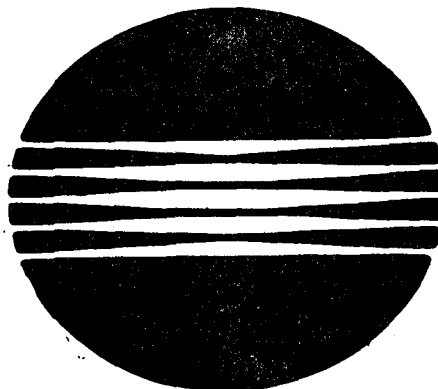
