- (f) participation in all meetings of the Paris editorial staff of the Unesco Courier, as well as the annual meeting of all editors;
- (g) at the request of the Editor-in-Chief, the writing of articles under his own by-line;
- (h) fulfilling any other duties assigned to him by the Senior Editor of the French edition or the Editor-in-Chief.

Qualifications and experience required—

- (a) university degree or equivalent attainments;
- (b) excellent knowledge of English and Spanish and translation techniques;
- (c) professional writing experience, preferably with an illustrated periodical;
- (d) ability to type an asset.

in the Technical Section of the Field Equipment and Sub-contracting Division under the supervision of the Deputy Chief and Chief of the Division.

The incumbent will deal with the specifications, selection and procurement of printing equipment for field projects as well as related equipment and materials including offset presses, cutters, staplers, binders, etc., photocopiers, duplicators, collators, etc., paper, ink, developers, etc. He will also deal with certain equipment and supplies for art conservation laboratories and shops.  - (ii) government and non-governmental national and regional scientific and technological organizations, research institutions, universities, learned societies, individual scientists and teachers in view of achieving the efficient planning and execution of the Unesco programmes on natural sciences and their application to the development in the region;
- (b) organize scientific meetings, training and refresher courses on scientific subjects of interest to the region;
- (c) co-operate on national and regional scientific programmes with local authorities, governments and scientific institutions for the development of science and technology through the planning, development and execution of projects financed under the Unesco regular budget, the United Nations Development Programme and other extra-budgetary sources; provide advice to Member States in the incumbent's area of specialization;
- (d) assist in the collection and dissemination of information and literature on basic science in the region;
- (e) assist the Director of the Office in country programming exercises for Member States of the region; in the preparation, planning and execution of scientific programmes and activities under the funds-in-trust agreements with Unesco; in the preparation of administrative documents and reports;
- (f) be responsible for the execution of Unesco's programmes in the basic sciences and in the field of natural resources, research and environment, including the publication of relevant bulletins and newsletters for dissemination in the region;
- (g) attend meetings organized within the region and of interest to Unesco;

- (h) prepare and edit reports of meetings, training courses, seminars and symposia organized by the Regional Office;
- (i) carry out such other assignments as may be required from time to time.

Qualifications and experience required—

- (a) university degree in one of the basic sciences preferably of a Ph.D. level;
- (b) an established professional reputation in science, with experience in university teaching or research in one or more of the basic sciences or interdisciplinary areas of science. Familiarity with new methods of science teaching is highly desirable;

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the direct supervision of the Director of the Division, the incumbent of the post will be particularly responsible for assigned Member States, organizations and regional projects. To the above effect, he/she will—

- (a) maintain and reinforce co-operation with the Member States, through diplomatic relations and liaison, especially with the permanent delegations and national commissions;
- (b) ensure a coherent country and regional approach in Unesco's programme of co-operation with the Member States;
- (c) co-ordinate the country programming, including all measures and action related thereto, *vis-à-vis* the relevant programme sectors;
- (d) stimulate and co-ordinate Unesco's efforts for the effective implementation of the organization's programme and activities, and, in particular, process requests under the participation programme and ensure the necessary follow-up action for their implementation, once approved by the programme sectors concerned;
- (e) develop and strengthen co-operation with regional and subregional bodies such as the United Nations regional economic commission and other appropriate regional inter-governmental organizations, institutes and centres;
- (f) ensure supervision and support to the Unesco Representatives in the region;
- (g) collect, assemble and update pertinent documentation and information on the Member States concerned for the preparation of briefs for the Director-General on the status and perspectives of Unesco's co-operation with those countries;
- (h) prepare briefings and draft documents, speeches, statements and articles as and when requested by the ADG/CPX;

(i) carry out any related tasks assigned by the Director of Division.

Qualifications and experience required—

- (a) university degree, in political science, law or international relations, or equivalent experience;
- (b) extensive knowledge of Unesco's programme, structure and procedures;

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the supervision of the Director of the Division, the incumbent is responsible for all administrative and financial aspects of the Unesco/World Bank Co-operative Programme and supervision of the staff of the Administrative Unit; acts as Certifying Officer for the Unesco/World Bank Joint Account. In particular, the incumbent is responsible for—

- (a) the organizational requirement of field missions, including—
 - (i) control of procedures for selection, nomination and appointment of consultants and, in consultation with project officers, the preparation of consultant contracts;

- (ii) preparation of authorizations to Resident Representatives for provision of necessary local services to field missions (payment of subsistence allowance, recruitment of local secretarial assistance, internal travel, etc.);

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the general supervision and authority of the Director of the Regional Office for Science and Technology for Latin America and the Caribbean, and in consultation with the Division of Ecological Sciences at Unesco Headquarters, the incumbent will be responsible for carrying out the ecological programmes of Unesco applicable to the various ecosystems of Latin America and the Caribbean. He will be required to do the following—

- (a) plan and implement the follow-up action that Unesco decides to take in the region on the relevant recommendations made by member countries and specialized conferences;

- (b) carry out and co-ordinate the international projects forming part of the Man and the Biosphere Programme (MAB), in particular the priority projects such as Project No. 6, which is designed to provide the necessary scientific basis for the rational management of mountainous areas, and for the development and reclamation of degraded land (project No. 3), and project No. 1, on the effects of human activities on tropical and subtropical forests;
- (c) hold consultations with the Member States of the region in order to facilitate their participation in the MAB Programme, and give them advice and encouragement concerning the establishment of new MAB National Committees or the strengthening of existing Committees;
- (d) help the countries to plan and implement pilot projects in ecological research, training and experiment, as, for example, in the framework of projects Nos. 6, 3 and 1;
- (e) help the countries to set up networks of biosphere reserves and other protected natural areas;
- (f) encourage co-operation among countries at the sub-regional and regional levels; provide technical and logistic support for consultations of researches with key roles to play in the implementation of national projects of the MAB Programme; introduce new machinery designed to facilitate the exchange of personnel and information, and ensure that such machinery works smoothly;
- (g) plan and put into effect a long-term training programme in ecology and environmental management in tropical and subtropical areas; in particular, encourage on-site training and the organization of training courses and seminars;

- (i) promote and strengthen institutional links among the ecological research and training centres of the region;

- (k) perform, at the request of the Director of the Office, any other related tasks that may prove necessary for the furtherance of the organization's programmes in the region.

- (a) Doctor's degree or equivalent experience in one of the ecological or natural sciences; sound knowledge of modern ecology;

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 28 OF 1980

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers
and
Wellcome (Kenya) Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Termination of services of Mr. Simon Munyaka.

1. The Kenya Union of Commercial Food & Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the Claimants and Wellcome (K) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the Respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 25th July, 27th and 28th August and 26th September, 1980 and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:

Claimants:

S. Munyaka.

Respondents:

E. Martin.

J. W. Ogola.

A. B. Omondi.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 29th February, 1980 duly signed by the parties was received by the Court on 15th May, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Mr. S. Munyaka started working for the Respondents on 18th October, 1971 as a statistical clerk and his services were terminated on 25th April, 1979 when he was told that he would be paid one month's pay in lieu of notice as his services were no longer required by the Respondents from the date of that letter. The parties are not agreed on the salary that Mr. Munyaka was earning at the time of his termination with the Claimants producing documentary evidence dated 3rd December, 1979 showing that his revised salary was K.Sh. 3,465 p.m. and the Respondents producing his pay advice for the month of March, 1979 showing his basic pay to be K.Sh. 2,610.

Mr. Munyaka was the Claimants' chief shop steward in the Respondents' undertaking and the Court is satisfied that he played a very prominent role in certain matters on behalf of the workers which resulted in their gaining substantially on their wages.

The Claimants reported a trade dispute on his behalf to the Minister for Labour and the Ministry's findings and recommendation were conveyed to the parties on 14th February, 1980 as follows:

"It was found that Mr. Munyaka attended a conciliation meeting in the Ministry of Labour when he was on sick leave and so unfit for normal office work. It is hard to determine whose interest he had in mind by doing so—his employers or fellow employees—because he had no authority from the former.

When he was asked to furnish the employers documents from the medical doctor he took time to do so despite several reminders and demands.

Mr. Munyaka was also found to have a record of lateness while reporting on duty, absenteeism and non-co-operation

which dated as far back as 1973. In view of all these facts the management's gesture was lenient to Mr. Munyaka considering that they did not dismiss him.

After careful consideration of the facts contained in this report I recommend that he be paid a further two months salary as *ex-gratia* payment in consideration of his services on top of his terminal benefits."

The Claimants did not accept these and have brought the dispute before the Court.

The Claimants have very strongly submitted that it was the Respondents' policy to get rid of vigilant shopstewards and it was in pursuance of this policy that they had decided to victimize Mr. Munyaka for his trade union activities in pressing demands on behalf of the workers very vigorously. They maintained that there was no reason why Mr. Munyaka should have suffered a termination as during the material time he was indeed sick and had produced adequate documentary evidence to the Respondents supporting that.

The Respondents on the other hand argued that Mr. Munyaka's services were terminated because he had failed to observe rules of the work and to obey all lawful commands or instructions given to him by any person placed in authority over him and that he had committed a gross misconduct.

The facts leading to this dispute are that Mr. Munyaka asked on 23rd February, 1979 his immediate superior, Mr. Omondi, for permission, to attend a Joint Industrial Council meeting of 26th February, 1979 in the morning. It is not disputed that he attended the meeting of 26th February and also that he did not report back to work on that day. He resumed duty on 27th February and worked up to 3 p.m. and claims that again with Mr. Omondi's permission he went to see the doctor as he was not feeling well. He then resumed duty on 5th March, 1979 with him claiming that it was in the morning and the Respondents maintaining that he came in the afternoon.

It is also not disputed that on 2nd March, 1979 he delivered certain documents to the conciliator at the Ministry of Labour. This was the time when he was sick.

The Respondents have in their appendices referred to various letters which they say they wrote to Mr. Munyaka to explain his absences during the aforesaid period and maintained that he did not give any satisfactory reply until 24th April, 1979 which letter they received sometime after they had decided to terminate his services.

Mr. Munyaka while giving evidence stated that he had produced the doctor's certificate to Mr. Omondi which the latter had refused to accept and Mr. Munyaka had thereafter made a photostat copy of that certificate.

The parties have given conflicting evidence on this part of the dispute which is so very important to it. Naturally their evidence is biased towards their respective versions.

The Court, however, has seen the original of two cash receipts dated 26th and 28th February, 1979 for Sh. 40 and Sh. 35 from Dr. S. P. Amin. The Court also saw as an exhibit a certificate signed by Dr. Amin dated 28th February, 1979 saying that Mr. Munyaka was suffering from giddiness and was under his treatment from 27th February with an endorsement dated 21st July, 1980 that he was not fit to attend duty from 28th February to 2nd March, 1979. Dr. Amin has further confirmed in writing on 21st July, 1980 as follows:

"This is to certify that S. Munyaka was under treatment from 27th February, 1979 and was not fit to go to work from 28th February to 2nd March, 1979. He was suffering with giddiness".

The Court was also given an internal communication memo showing that the Respondents reimbursed Mr. Munyaka the sum of K.Sh. 75 in respect of the aforesaid two receipts. From all these documents the Court must come to the conclusion that Mr. Munyaka was indeed not well during the relevant time and that if nothing more the Respondents had documentary evidence to show that he had incurred medical expenses which they reimbursed. The Respondents, however, insisted that he should produce a doctor's certificate showing that he had been given days off. It appears, after a careful scrutiny of evidence from both sides, that Mr. Munyaka did not produce the original certificate from the doctor for reasons best known to himself. Perhaps he suspected that the Respondents might destroy it in order to give him the sack. Instead of producing the original he made a photostat which he claims he tendered to Mr. Ogola who kept on insisting that they must have the original.

Before making a decision on this point the Court would like to dispose of two points regarding Mr. Munyaka's resumption of duty on 5th March and his attending a conciliation meeting on 2nd March. The Court notes that 2nd March was a Friday and Mr. Munyaka resumed duty on 5th March. This being so

the Court sees nothing sinister in his being up and about on a Friday when he subsequently resumed duty on the following Monday. The Court accepts his explanation that the documents that he was required to bring to the conciliator were rather important for that meeting. It is obvious that by Friday he had sufficiently recovered to be able to move out of his house.

On 5th March the Industrial Court was to announce an award in a dispute between the Claimants and the Respondents which award went in favour of the workers. As stated earlier in the award the Court finds that Mr. Munyaka was responsible for winning these extra wage increases for the Respondents' employees and indeed for spotting that the workers had not received their legitimate dues. The workers had claimed that they had been underpaid their 5 per cent increases. Both parties agreed that Mr. Munyaka attended the Court in the morning when the award was announced. In view of the fact that the Respondents' undertaking is at Kabete even if Mr. Munyaka did not report for duty in the morning at Kabete but came straight to the Industrial Court at 10 a.m. in order to hear the award it is not unreasonable. It is not disputed that after the Court award he went to Kabete with Mr. Ogola.

The Court has now to decide if Mr. Munyaka had refused to obey any lawful orders which the Respondents had given him regarding the medical certificate. The Court is satisfied as stated earlier that he was sick during the material time and a letter from Mr. Ogola dated 10th April, 1979 confirms that the Respondents had received a photocopy of Dr. Amin's certificate issued on 28th February, 1979. The Respondents, however, insisted that he should produce the original and he was warned that unless he produced the original drastic action would be taken against him. On 18th April he was given another last reminder and his services were terminated on 25th. The Court notes that after Mr. Munyaka was asked to explain the various absences during the material time on 12th March, 1979 no reminder was sent to him in this regard until 2nd April, 1979.

The Court cannot overlook the letter of 24th April, 1979 which Mr. Munyaka wrote to the Respondents' personnel manager in which he referred to the certificate of Dr. Amin and stated that it appeared that the Respondents did not want to honour the doctor's certificate. Mr. Munyaka also pointed out that on 26th February he had attended a meeting between the Claimants and the Federation of Kenya Employers and that on 5th March he was in office and had gone out for the Industrial Court award.

The Court cannot attach any weight to the previous history of the alleged absenteeism and lateness and disobedience which the Respondents have alleged against Mr. Munyaka because on the Respondents' own admission they had not issued him with any warnings in respect of any of these incidents. In fact the Court was very surprised to hear from one of the Respondents' witnesses that a warning letter which they had issued to Mr. Munyaka had subsequently been cancelled and all the documents relating thereto had been torn up and destroyed.

After careful consideration of all the submissions and evidence of the various witnesses the Court finds that Mr. Munyaka's role as the Claimants' chief shopsteward in the Respondents' undertaking is the reason why the Respondents decided to terminate his services. At the most in view of the documentary evidence that was tendered to the Respondents in respect of his absences between 26th February and 5th March he deserved an official warning only. The Court must emphasize that Mr. Munyaka has been victimized for his trade union activities which he pursued vigorously as a chief shopsteward.

The Court has carefully considered the question of his reinstatement but finds that an award of compensation to Mr. Munyaka would be appropriate under the circumstances of this dispute and the Court awards that he should be paid nine months' salary by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal that he has suffered. The Court directs that the Chief Industrial Relations Officer should investigate and establish what was his salary at the time of the termination of his services as the Claimants are claiming it to be Sh. 3,465 and the Respondents saying that it was Sh. 2,610 p.m. This compensation includes the one month's notice and the Court further directs that the Respondents should also pay 25 per cent of their contribution to the staff pension scheme to Mr. Munyaka as he has been refunded only his contributions. This is in accordance with the rules of the staff pension scheme which were produced to the Court during the hearing.

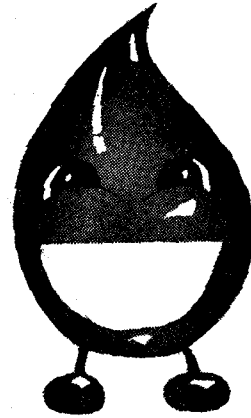

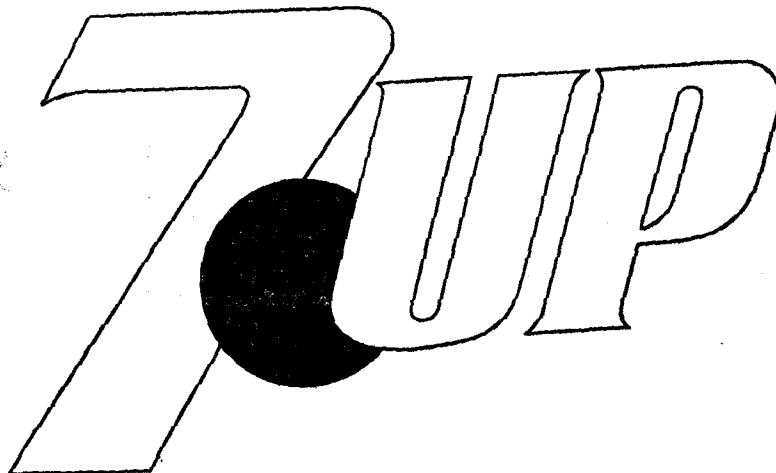
