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THE ANTIQUITIES AND MONUMENTS ACT

(No. 2 of 1983)

NOTICE OF DECLARATION OF MONUMENTS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 (1) of the Antiquities and Monuments Act, the Minister for Constitutional Affairs declares that the areas of land specified in the schedule shall be monuments within the meaning of the Act.

Any objection to the declaration of any of the areas as monuments shall be lodged with the minister within one month from the date of publication of this notice.

SCHEDULE

Shaka

All that area of land known as Shaka situated three kilometres south-east of Kipini in Tana River District, Coast Province, the boundary of which is defined on three sides by cut lines and on the fourth side by the highwater mark, the corners of which boundary are marked by concrete beacons, on the north side by a line 821.92 metres long at a bearing of 98.15°, thence on the east side by a line 302.62 metres long at a bearing of 183.50° thence along the shore westwards to a point on the west boundary line which is 261.71 metres long at a bearing of 004° to the starting point.

Kwa Wanawali Saba

All that area of land known as Kwa Wanawali Saba situated seven kilometres south-east of Kipini in Tana River District, Coast Province, the boundary of which is defined on three sides by cutlines and on the fourth side by the highwater mark, the corners of which boundary are marked by concrete beacons, on the west side by a line 541.10 metres long at a bearing of 356° thence on the north side by a line 1,225.35 metres long at a bearing of 068° thence on the east side by a line 1,225.35 metres long at a bearing of 068° thence on the east side by a line 348.35 metres long at a bearing of 171° thence on the south side by way of the highwater mark westwards to the starting point.

Kwa Wa Ungwana Wa Mashaa

All that area of land known as Kwa Wa Ungwana Wa Mashaa situated two kilometres south-east of Kipini in Tana River District, Coast Province, the boundary of which is defined by four cut lines marked at the corners by concrete beacons, on the north-side by a cutline 666.10 metres long at a bearing of 118° thence on the east side by a line 437.30 metres long at a bearing of 194°, thence on the south side by a line 1,251.95 metres long at a bearing of 280°, thence on the west side by a line 939.00 metres long at a bearing of 57° to the starting point.

Cause No. 75 of 1982

Parties:

Drumcon (1973) Limited

and

Kenya Engineering Workers' Union

Issue in dispute:

Redundancy for eight manual workers in both drum and tinfilling sections.

DRUMCON (1973) LTD, shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 10th December, 1982, and 7th February, 1983, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 14th January, 1982, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 22nd July together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The parties are in dispute because the claimants are desirous of declaring eight manual workers in both drum and tinfilling sections redundant which move is strongly opposed by the respondents.

It is established that in March, 1977, the claimants had declared eleven employees redundant because they were facing sales reduction and due to the introduction of plastic containers instead of tin ones. The Division of Manpower Planning and Development analysis shows that the respondents have progressively reduced the number in employment from 36 in September 1977 to 17 in 1973.

There is, a rather unsatisfactory feature of this dispute in that the claimants have not been very consistent in the number of workers they had wanted to declare redundant as on 19th January, 1981, they wanted to declare eleven (11) employees redundant, which figure they increased to 14 on 17th March which they again increased to 16 on 2nd September, 1981, and 21 days later they reduced it to 8.

During the hearing the respondents made a very valid point and that is that if the claimants are to continue in business they certainly need some labour force and if they were allowed to declare eight manual workers redundant out of nine then they will have to close down as they cannot operate with one.

The claimants have admitted that they employ casual workers from time to time with the claimants, maintaining that the casual workers were a regular feature of their operations. This is confirmed by the amount of money that is paid to these casual employees between September 1981 to August 1982. The court is satisfied that the claimants employ casual workers fairly regularly. Even the D.M.P.D. investigator established this fact. The court has taken into consideration the claimants' submission that they employ casual employees occasionally when there was work to be done.

The respondents have stated that since 1980 to the date of the hearing the claimants had lost seven workers either through retirement or resignations. This fact was not denied by the claimants.

The court has carefully considered this application by the claimants to declare eight of their employees redundant but is not satisfied as to its validity. The claimants should use workers from the drum section in tinfilling section when there is work there instead of employing casual workers. The court is of the view that the claimants should utilize their permanent staff fully rather than depend on casual workers. The court accordingly rejects the claimants' demand for declaring eight manual workers redundant. The court further directs that the claimants will be at liberty to raise the issue of redundancy after one year from the date of the court award if there is still need for it.

Kenya Railways Corporation

Issue in dispute:

Wrongful and/or unfair dismissal of Boniface Mulonzi Nzuki, teleprinter operator, contrary to staff regulation G. (13) (e).

THE Railways and Harbours Union (K) shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Kenya Railways Corporation shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 3rd and 8th February, 1983, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 12th May, 1982, duly signed by both parties was received by the court on 8th October, 1982, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute essentially revolves around staff regulation G. 13 (e) in that whether or not it was properly applied in the case of Mr. Nzuki. This dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and the ministry's findings and recommendation were released to the parties on 15th January, 1982, in the following terms:

"Investigation established that Mr. Nzuki had a habit of absenting himself from duty. He actually absented himself from 11th to 25th May, 1977 and although he collected the sick sheet on 14th May, 1977, he failed to present it to his superior within 48 hours as required by the staff regulation code. One would therefore be justified to believe that he did not attend the hospital at the material time. It is interesting to note that the sick sheet had not been duly signed by the doctor who treated him until 25th May, 1977, the day he reported back on duty and was told part II of the form had not been completed by the doctor. He later took it back to the doctor who signed for the off-duty backdating it to 14th May, 1977. The management were therefore justified in dismissing him from employment for absenteeism and deceit.

In view of the fact contained herein it is recommended that the management decision be upheld and the union's demand be rejected."

The claimants rejected the finding and the dispute is now before the court.

The facts of this dispute to a large extent are more or less agreed which in brief are that Mr. Nzuki had proceeded on four days' leave from 3rd May to 6th May, 1977, but he stayed away and did not resume duty until 10th May. He reported on duty on 11th May, 1977, and worked the night shift commencing at 00.00 hrs. the night of 11th May to 8 a.m. in the morning of the same day, i.e. eight hours' duty. He then remained absent on 12th, 13th and 14th May, 1977, when he then came for a sick sheet which was duly issued. On 26th May, 1977, he presented the sick sheet when he reported for duty. The respondents had, however, in the meantime treated him as having forfeited his appointment.

The sick sheet that he presented appears to be anything but genuine. To begin with when it was presented section 2 of the sick sheet had not been completed. Then there is an attempt to have it completed by backdating it to 11th May, 1977, but the interesting point is that the official Voi Hospital date stamp bears the date of 26th May, 1971! On page two of the sick sheet in section 3 the date is 26th May, 1977, and the official date stamp of the Voi Hospital again shows the date to be 25th May, 1971! The court has no hesitation in coming to the conclusion that it is a sickly attempt to cover this man's absence-from duty.

The claimants have stressed that the respondents' officers superior to Mr. Nzuki at the Voi station knew that he was sick therefore there is no question of him being penalized under G. 13 (e) as having forfeited his appointment. This staff regulation reads as follows:

"G. 13 (e) an employee must not be absent from duty without permission or reasonable excuse and if he so absents himself for a continuous period of more than seven days he may be regarded as having forfeited his appointment with

effect from the date of such absence. If such employee subsequently presents himself for duty he may, if the circumstances warrant such a course, be reinstated in the service and be permitted to resume duty, subject to such disciplinary measures as may be taken against him. An employee who is regarded as having forfeited his appointment under the provision of this paragraph will be deemed to have been dismissed in accordance with these regulations."

In the aforesaid circumstances the court has to determine if the respondents have applied this section correctly. The claimants referred to a letter written by the chief personnel manager to the chief traffic manager stating that since Mr. Nzuki had been issued a sick sheet by the Voi Hospital his whereabouts were known he should therefore be allowed to resume duty in accordance with the above staff regulation after the medical officer had completed his sick sheet. He further stated that for failing to present his sick sheet to his supervisor within 48 hours Mr. Nzuki should have been charged with violation of sick sheet regulations as laid down in the director-general's circular dated 15th June, 1971, and punished instead of forfeiture of appointment.

The court agrees with the respondents' submission that it would be dangerous to act on one isolated letter without examining all the correspondence on this matter. To begin with the court is satisfied that Mr. Nzuki's sick sheet was not completed by the medical officer. Or if it was that medical officer was extremely negligent and incompetent in his duties. The court, however, is inclined to believe that the sick sheet was never brought to the notice of the medical officer on duty at that time and Mr. Nzuki tried to manipulate the sick sheet through dubious means and got caught in the act.

The question arises that when an employee reports sick and then completely disappears without complying with the strict sick sheet regulations and is absent for more than seven days what are the respondents supposed to do under these circumstances? Should they wait for a person who claims to have been sick but who doesn't bother to inform his superiors within 48 hours as required, for him to report for work some two weeks afterwards and produce a fraudulent document which he claims to be genuine sick sheet? If the respondents were to operate in this manner they being one of the biggest employers in the country they would indeed be exposed to cases of severe indiscipline. The court finds that the person who claims to be sick should strictly comply with the sick sheet regulations and if he doesn't do so then he does so at his own risk and the respondents are at liberty to take a decision under staff regulation G. 13 (e) and consider such an employee as having forfeited his appointment.

The court has carefully considered all aspects of this dispute and concurs with the Ministry of Labour's finding that the management decision should be upheld. Mr. Nzuki clearly forfeited his appointment.

Issues in dispute:

Basic minimum wages. House allowance. General wage increases. Casual workers. Effective date and duration.

THE Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Doshi and Co. Pipe Division Enterprises Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on the 2nd February, 1983, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 29th June, 1982, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 26th October together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The respondents started their operations in 1980 as part of the trading company Doshi and Co. Hardware Ltd. They are involved in the manufacture of steel pipes and sections. There are several other Doshi enterprises along with the respondents with common directors.

The respondents have about 19 workers in their employment and this is the first collective agreement which is being negotiated between the parties and although originally there were quite a few items in dispute the parties were able to reduce to those which are now before the court.

The claimants have submitted that there was no reason why the respondents should not pay the same rates as their competitors like Brollo (K) Ltd., Kenya United Steel Co., Mabati Ltd. and Metal Box Co., as they were all involved in the same type of business and were members of the Association of Engineering Employers Group. They maintained that disparity in wages between competitors can cause serious problems as some firms can be driven out of business.

The respondents, however, maintain that since they were a new enterprise it would not be fair to equate them with older and well established firms. They were in desperate need of breathing space. They, however, pointed out that the engineering industry had two groups—major and minor.

The court notes that the claimants' demand on basic wages range from the lowest at K.Sh. 750 per month for technician, foreman, production and quality controller. As against this the respondents have offered a minimum of K.Sh. 500 and a maximum of K.Sh. 1,090.

In addition to this the claimants are asking for a 30 per cent wage increase from 1st January, 1981, and another similar increase from 1st January, 1982. The respondents have offered a general wage increase equivalent to 10 per cent of the monthly basic minimum wages for each employee's job classification for each year of the agreement.

The court notes that the parties signed a recognition agreement on 26th August, 1981, and it appears that the respondents are at present paying the statutory basic minimums. Since this is the first agreement between the parties it is somewhat difficult to work out the compensation to which the workers would be entitled due to the increase in the cost of living but since prior to this demand made by the claimants the workers were covered by an agreement signed by the Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers it would not be unfair to work out the cost of living increases and the workers' entitlement under the guidelines for the period between December 1979 to November 1981, or for the matter from January 1979 to December 1980. In the first case the workers' entitlement under the guidelines would amount to an average of about 19.3 per cent for the two-year agreement and in the second case to 17.3 per cent. The fact however remains that this is the first collective agreement.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the court awards that the basic minimum wages as at present should continue till the end of September 1983, after which the parties will be at liberty to revise them.

General wage increase

The court awards the following general wage increase:

- (i) With effect from 1st October, 1981, all the workers should get a wage increase of 15 per cent on their individual wages.
- (ii) With effect from 1st October, 1982, all the workers should get a wage increase of 12 per cent on their individual wages as at 30th September, 1982.

House allowance

The claimants' demand is that every employee should be paid a house allowance of K.Sh. 300 per month with the respondents offering an average house allowance of K.Sh. 115.

The court awards that the workers should get a 10 per cent increase on top of what the respondents have offered on the deconsolidated figure of house allowance as it appears on page 4 of their written submission with effect from 1st October, 1981.

Casual workers

The claimants made a very vigorous submission on this issue because they felt that the employers were really exploiting the workers by keeping them in casual employment for a number of years with the result that they were denied the fringe benefits. The court notes that the I.M.P.D. economist found that there were 12 casual workers who had worked for the respondents for period ranging from one year to six years. This was ascertained from their employment cards. Some underpayments were also observed which, however, the respondents have offered to rectify immediately. In any case the senior labour officer in charge of that area should ensure that the workers are reimbursed all the underpayments that they have suffered. The court has decided to order the respondents to immediately convert the 12 employees who are named below with the years of service that they have rendered as casual to monthly employment and for future the court makes the following award in respect of casual workers:

Any casual employees working for the respondents for three consecutive months shall automatically qualify for permanent employment.
