THE ANTIQUITIES AND MONUMENTS ACT (No. 2 of 1983)

Notice of Declaration of Monuments

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 (1) of the Antiquities and Monuments Act, the Minister for Constitutional Affairs declares that the areas of land specified in the schedule shall be monuments within the meaning of the Act.

Any objection to the declaration of any of the areas as monuments shall be lodged with the minister within one month from the date of publication of this notice.

SCHEDULE

Kiunga

All that area of land known as Kiunga, situated approximately 200 metres southwest of Kiunga district office in Lamu District, Coast Province, the boundaries of which starts at a concrete beacon placed on the south side of the Lamu-Kiunga road, thence at a bearing of 166° for a distance of 128 metres, thence generally westwards by way of the highwater mark for a distance of approximately 110 metres to a concrete beacon, thence at a bearing of 355° for a distance of 28 metres, thence along a fenced boundary at a bearing of 77° for a distance of 42 metres, thence along a fenced boundary at a bearing of 355° for a distance of 60 metres, thence along the south edge of the Lamu-Kiunga road at a bearing of 97° for a distance of 37.6 metres to the starting point.

Omwe

All that area of land known as Omwe, situated approximately 650 metres southwest of the Kiunga-Mambore-Mkokoni road junction in Lamu District, Coast Province, the boundary of which starts at a concrete beacon placed on the east side of the Mambore-Mkokoni road, thence at a bearing of 64° for a distance of 365 metres to the highwater mark, thence generally southwards by way of the highwater mark for a distance of approximately 700 metres to a concrete beacon, thence at a bearing of 332° for a distance of 330 metres, thence at a bearing of 570° for a distance of 590 metres, thence at a bearing of 570° for a distance of 330 metres, thence at a bearing of 162° for a distance of 470 metres to the starting point.

Mbaraki Pillar, Mombasa

All that area of land surrounding Mbaraki Pillar, on Mombasa Island, Mombasa District, Coast Province, the boundary of which starts at a master beacon placed at a point 39.6 metres at a bearing of 353° from the northwest corner of the Mbaraki Pillar, thence by way of a fence at a bearing of 197° for a distance of 29.2 metres, thence at a bearing of 285° for a distance of 1.6 metres, thence at a bearing of 195° for a distance of 9.8 metres, thence at a bearing of 110° for a distance of 1.6 metres, thence at a bearing of 157° for a distance of 23 metres, thence at a bearing of 112° for a distance of 20.7 metres, thence at a bearing of 001° for a distance of 34 metres, thence at a bearing of 333° for a distance of 34 metres, thence at a bearing of 333° for a distance of 41.3 metres to the starting point.

Shanga

All that area of land known as Shanga, on Pate Island, Lamu District, Coast Province, situated approximately at map reference 299645 of map sheet 180 E/1, the boundary of which starts at a concrete beacon situated at the highwater mark, thence by way of cut lines in a straight line at a bearing of 016° for a distance of 350 metres, thence at a bearing of 265° for a distance of 275 metres, thence at a bearing of 261° for a distance of 400 metres, thence at a bearing of 189° for a distance of 440 metres, thence generally eastwards by way of the highwater mark to the starting point.

Kisauni Bell Tower

All that area of land surrounding Kisauni Bell Tower, situated a few metres south of the junction of the Mombasa-Malindi-Kongowea roads, in Mombasa District, Coast Province, the boundary of which starts at a master beacon placed at a distance of 16.6 metres at a bearing of 178.50 from the southeast corner of the Kisauni Bell Tower, thence at a bearing of 43.5° for a distance of 20.6 metres, thence generally westwards by way

of the southern edge of the road reserve for a distance of approximately 42.2 metres to a corner beacon, thence at a bearing of 302.5° for a distance of 26.5 metres to the starting point.

Ishakani I

All that area of land known as Ishakani I, situated northeast of Ishakani Village in Lamu District, Coast Province, the boundaries of which starts at a beacon situated on the south side of the Ishakani-Kiomboni road at a distance of approximately 475 metres from Ishakani Mosque, thence in a straight line at a bearing of 162° for a distance of 200 metres to the highwater mark, thence southwestwards by way of the highwater mark for a distance of 200 metres to a concrete beacon, thence in a straight line at bearing of 0° for a distance of 130 metres thence in a straight line at a bearing of 310° for a distance of 175 metres, thence in a straight line at a bearing of 70° for a distance of 260 metres to the starting point.

Ishakani II

All that area of land known as Ishakani II situated northeast of Ishakani Village, in Lamu District, Coast Province, the boundaries of which starts at a concrete beacon situated on the north side of the Ishakani-Kiomboni road at a distance of approximately 650 metres from Ishakani Mosque, thence in a straight line along the edge of said road at a bearing of 60° for a distance of 140 metres, thence at a bearing of 330° for a distance of 125 metres, thence at a bearing of 235° for a distance of 135 metres, thence at a bearing of 152° for a distance of 115 metres to the starting point.

Ishakani III

All that area of land known as Ishakani III situated northeast of Ishakani Village in Lamu District, Coast Province the boundaries of which starts at a concrete beacon situated 650 metres due north of Ishakani Mosque, thence at a bearing of 72° for a distance of 320 metres, thence at a bearing of 356° for a distance of 200 metres, thence at a bearing of 254° for a distance of 350 metres, thence at a bearing of 168° for a distance of 310 metres to the starting point.

PUBLIC NOTICE OF AN APPLICATION TO INTRODUCE NEW METHODS OF CHARGE BY-LAWS THROUGHOUT ALL AREAS IN KENYA SUPPLIED BY THE LICENSEE

NOTICE is given to all whom it may concern that the East African Power and Lighting Company Limited, a limited liability company incorporated in the Republic of Kenya having its registered office at Electricity House, Harambee Avenue, Nairobi, intends to make application on 11th April, 1983, to the Minister for Energy under sections 72 and 149 of the Electric Power Act for the approval by him of proposed by-laws to be known as the "Methods of Charge (E.A.P.L.) By-laws, 1983", which if and when approved will revoke the existing Methods of Charge (E.A.P.L.) By-Taws, 1978.

The object of and reasons for the application are to achieve an overall increase in revenue which has become necessary to enable the power industry to meet part of the development costs for new electricity generation and transmission projects, namely Geothermal, Kiambere, Turkwel, Kilifi/Bura transmission line and second interconnector to the Coast.

The fuel oil surcharge currently in force will be absorbed in the new tariff. There will also be uniform energy charges throughout the day and night as the cost of supplying energy over a 24-hour period is now the same. Furthermore, the rates for interruptible supplies have been adjusted to reflect more closely the marginal cost of providing those supplies.

All present and future consumers will be affected by the approval of the application in that the application of the proposed new by-law will result in increase in the cost of electricity to different categories of consumers by amounts varying between per cent and 27 per cent; the overall tariff increase being 12.9 per cent.

Copies of the proposed "Methods of Charge (E.A.P.L.) Bylaws, 1983", have been deposited at the offices of the licensee and are open to public inspection during normal office hours without payment. Copies of the proposed by-laws may be purchased at the office of the licensee at a price of K.Sh. 5 per copy.

Any public or local authority, company, person or body of persons desirous of making any representation on or objection to this application must do so by letter addressed to the Minister for Energy and marked on the envelope "Electric Power Act", on or before the expiration of fourteen (14) days from the date of the application as stated in this notice and must forward a copy of such representation or objection to the applicant.

Wrongful termination/dismissal of 28 employees.

THE Kenya Chemical Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and E.A. Industries Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 19th and 20th May. 10th August, 1982, and 18th, 19th, 20th January and 15th and 23rd February, 1983, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence:

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 22nd December, 1981, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 19th March, 1982, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

This dipute started from a very minor incident involving an office messenger J. Kilonzo who was referred by one member of the management to the chief engineer who directed them that that particular matter should be handled by the resources engineer at the time, Alan Dow. Mr. Kilongo was accused of having made some poor photocopies and he pleaded that it was not his job. However, before he was taken before Mr. Dow he involved the claimants' shopsteward, E. Okoth, better known as "the bishop" who accompanied him to Mr. Dow's office.

It is alleged that at some stage Mr. Dow used words to the effect that he was not a stupid African who did not know his job or he was not a stupid African who did not know his duties and he was not going to be told what to do. The respondents have denied that Mr. Dow uttered any such words but the fact remains that there was a big strike at the respondents' factory on 4th February, 1981. The situation was pretty serious and the respondents' chairman, J. B. Wanjui, had to personally intervene in order to save Mr. Dow from being manhandled. The claimants also alleged that Mr. Dow had locked-in another shopsteward in addition to having uttered the above insulting words to Africans which he had directed to Mr. Okoth.

Mr. Wanjui asked the security officer to escort Mr. Dow out of the factory and the workers followed them. Mr. Dow was taken outside the factory gate and his car was taken to him and the workers resumed their duties.

A meeting was held between the four shopstewards and the management team on 5th February at 4.30 p.m. to discuss the stoppage of work at the factory on 4th February, 1981. According to the notes of this meeting which are signed by both the parties the shopsteward stated that they had no grievances and that there was temporary stoppage of work but employees were not called out by them between the shopsteward that they had no grievances and that there was temporary stoppage of work but employees were not called out by them but were induced by the incident. The shopstewards were prepared to give an account of the incident as it occurred otherwise at this stage the shopstewards and employees were very satisfied by the action taken by the

The court finds that both the management team and the shopstewards were trying to be rather too clever at this meeting by not coming out openly to state their respective stands, that is the shopstewards were under the impression Mr. Dow was sacked and will not be coming back to the factory with the respondents maintaining that there was no such thing as it was the management prerogative to decide on this issue and the workers had no say on it. The parties, however, for reasons best known to themselves were not bold enough to come up openly and call a spade a spade.

On 6th February, 1981, when Mr. Dow reported for duty there was another instant strike and it was again a total walk-out. This resulted in a very serious situation and all the efforts to get the workers back to work by the management and senior officials of the Ministry of Labour failed. Even the police was involved and had to disperse a procession of workers which was heading for state house.

The respondents gave notice to all employees that those employees who wish to resume work should do so immediately but not later than 9.30 p.m. on Friday, 6th February, 1981. They were required to report to their managers at their normal place of work and warned that those who did not resume work at that time will be considered by the management to have terminated their services with the respondents forthwith.

As a result of the aforesaid notice 271 workers lost their jobs. However, following meetings between the parties and the Ministry of Labour agreement was reached that:

- 1. On application 243 ex-employees would be re-engaged and would be required to serve a three month probationary period.
- 2. Negotiations on the other 28 employees would continue. This has resulted in a situation where out of the striking employees totalling 271, 243 are back on duty as new employees and the dispute regarding the 28 is before the court having been investigated by the Ministry of Labour.

The court notes with great satisfaction that the ministry carried out very thorough and comprehensive investigation into this very serious dispute. The ministry's findings were that Esau Okoth, James Koyoo, and Mr. Ileve had incited the workers to participate in the strike contrary to the law and the parties' laid down procedures. It also found Muchiri Gicheru, B. Ogembo, Mwangi Magani, W. Kiiru, H. Otieno and J. Nzau had poor previous employment records. In respect of these nine people the ministry found that the employers' action was justifiable. The investigator also stated that W. Ndege, although a shopsteward, reported back to work when the notice for the strikers to resume work was issued by the management. The ministry recommended that other than these nine people all the other ex-employees including Mr. Ndege, should be considered for reinstatement and the respondents should give each one of the same conditions as the 243 ex-employees who were re-engaged.

The parties met in order to resolve the issue in the light of the ministry's findings and recommendation but could not settle it because the respondents took the stand that they would accept the investigation report and recommendation on condition that the claimants should accept the said report as final and no further dispute would be undertaken or pursued by them. And that the respondents reserved the right to choose the actual individuals affected among the 28 who may be found to have the worst record with them provided that the number to be left out would not exceed nine as contained in the report. In view of the above the claimants rejected the findings and the report.

The court conducted a very lengthy hearing lasting eight days during which the parties called a number of witnesses and made very lengthy verbal and written submissions. The court finds that both the strikes on 4th and 6th February, 1981, were illegal and were incited mainly by the three shopstewards—the "bishop", Mr. Ileve and Mr. Koyoo. The court has carefully considered the alleged incident with the allegations against Mr. Dow of having abused Africans by using the aforesaid insulting words and even if that allegation was true, which is hotly denied by the management, the fact remains that workers had no business whatsoever to defy and refuse to resume work once the Ministry of Labour officials had intervened in the matter which they did on 6th February. After that the workers had absolutely no justification for having stayed out and taken part in all sorts of demonstrations. It is the function of the Ministry of Labour officials to contain such situations and the Chief Industrial Relations Officer (C.I.R.O.) himself addressed the workers in the evening of 6th February but his advice was not heeded. Even if the court was to give the workers the benefit of having been very gravely provoked on 4th February (if they were misled by the shopstewards as to the words which are alleged to have been uttered by Mr. Dow), the court cannot condone the workers' behaviour in refusing to resume work after the C.I.R.O. had intervened. The court notes that the C.I.R.O. and his team came to the factory after the respondents' chairman had reported the grave situation to the minister himself as the claimants' national officials had not responded positively to the respondents' appeals to them, to come and handle the crisis situation.

In view of the aforesaid finding the court cannot find that these 28 workers have suffered a wrongful dismissal but since the parties have to adopt a flexible attitude in matters of industrial relations and can't afford to be too legalistic the court

finds that through the efforts of the ministry the parties did reach at a decision which appears to be ideal solution to this whole very unfortunate episode.

The court feels that the case of the 28 employees should also have been viewed and considered in the same light as that of the 241 employees who were re-engaged by the respondents. The court has very carefully considered the parties' arguments and submissions and after a careful scrutiny and evaluation of all the evidence the court finds itself in agreement with the Ministry of Labour's findings and recommendation. The court agrees with the investigator when he says that the question of any or all the 28 employees having had poor employment record should be able to be determined by whether or not any of them had been issued with a warning or warning letters. The records indicated that six out of 28 had such warning letters. The question of some warnings having been expired does not really arise as these people were considered for re-engagement having terminated their own contracts by their acts.

The court finds that the shopstewards incited the workers to strike—three of them with the exception of Mr. Ndege—and they are to be blamed for this. They had also refused to accept the advice of the Ministry of Labour officials. In these circumstances the question of their victimization does not arise.

The court has decided to make an award in terms of the findings and recommendation of the Ministry of Labour in this dispute and the court awards that 19 out of the 28 workers should be reinstated by the respondents with effect from the first of the month following the court award as new employees on the same conditions on which the previous 243 ex-employees were re-engaged. The following nine ex-employees are not awarded re-engagement:

Esau Okoth, James Koyoo, Meve, Muchiri Gicheru, B. Ogembo, Mwangi Magani, W. N. Kiiru, H. Otiende, J. Nzau.
