4. Applicants must enclose with their application forms a banker's cheque, postal order, money order or cash for KSh. 1,000 made payable to the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, as deposit. Personal cheques will not be accepted.

The deposit will be dealt with as follows:

- (a) Credited to a successful applicant.
 - (b) Refunded to an unsuccessful applicant.
 - (c) Forfeited if a successful applicant fails to pay for the offer of a plot within thirty (30) days from the date of letter of allotment, and applicant shall have no further claim thereto.
5. Each application should be accompanied by a statement indicating:
- (a) The amount of capital available for the purchase of the plot.

CAUSE No. 64 OF 1981

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Agricultural Development Corporation

Issue in dispute:

Dismissal of Peter Lungatso.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Agricultural Development Corporation shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 11th February, 13th and 14th April, 13th May, 7th June, 16th and 17th September and 6th December, 1982, and 16th and 17th February and 7th and 25th March, 1983, and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath:

Claimants:

J. B. Omondia,
P. Lungatso.

Respondents:

J. M. Kori,
C. Okumu.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 18th September, 1981, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 14th December, 1981, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

Peter Lungatso was employed by the respondents as a marketing assistant with effect from 2nd January, 1980, at a basic salary of K£1,000 per annum. The respondents' acting general manager at the time, C. Okumu, employed him after the inspector of statutory boards, S. K. Mbugua, had spoken to him inquiring if Mr. Lungatso could be given an assignment with the respondents. Mr. Lungatso came with a letter from Mr. Mbugua.

Mr. Okumu was authorized by the respondents' board to employ persons up to K£1,200 per annum and although there was no such post at that time he accommodated the aforesaid request by employing Mr. Lungatso as a marketing assistant. The idea was that the respondents would develop a separate marketing department and this would be the first step towards that.

Mr. Lungatso was placed on a six months' probation and clause 3 of his letter of appointment read as follows:

"Your appointment is subject to a six months' probationary period which period may be extended and during which period your appointment may be terminated by either party giving 15 days notice or half a month's salary in lieu. On confirmation in appointment your appointment may be terminated by either party giving one month's notice or one month's salary in lieu."

On 16th October, 1980, he was served with a letter of termination in which the acting general manager stated that he had concrete evidence in his hands to show that Mr. Lungatso's performance during the vital period of probation had not only left a lot to be desired but had indeed been below average.

There is also a reference to the present circumstances which Mr. Lungatso knew only too well and he was told that the respondents found it extremely difficult to continue with him in their service. His services were terminated from 18th October, 1980, by giving him half month's salary in lieu of notice.

The claimants took up the matter on his behalf and the dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour whose findings and recommendation were in favour of Mr. Lungatso and the ministry found that this was an extreme case of intimidation by the respondents because of Mr. Lungatso's efficiency and devotion to duty and the ministry found that the termination was wrongful, immediate reinstatement was recommended with full salary from the date of the termination of service. The respondents rejected both the findings and the recommendation and the matter is now before the court.

In the claimants' memorandum Mr. Lungatso has made some very interesting prayers against the respondents which the court would like to set out in full:

"(1) Withdraw the letter of termination dated 16th October, 1980.

(2) Confirm Mr. Lungatso as the marketing manager from 2nd July, 1980, when the probation ended.

(3) Pay him from 2nd July, 1980, the salary scale of K£9,000 per annum.

(4) Adjustment to the salary scale of marketing assistant from 2nd January to 30th June, 1980, to K£5,100 per annum as the salary of the time was already in dispute.

(5) Confirm Mr. Lungatso as the marketing director from 1st March, 1981, when the corporation status was elevated to be headed by the managing director.

(6) Confirm and pay him a salary of K£12,500 per annum from 1st March, 1981, to date as the marketing of the corporation.

(7) Pay annual leave plus any other benefits and damages as this hon. court will deem fit and due.

(8) This hon. court to consider to recommend to the Office of the President to have Mr. Lungatso transferred to other parastatals relevant to his profession and position or above, e.g. National Irrigation Board, National Cereals Board.

(9) To restrain the respondent or any other party from any further victimization of Mr. Lungatso for a period of five years.

(10) This hon. court to declare that the corporation officials were engaged in swindling and defrauding the corporation to the tune of over KSh. 1,600,000 and that is what led to Mr. Lungatso's victimization plus all costs of this suit.

(11) This hon. court to award the maximum remedial compensation and damages in law to Mr. Lungatso plus interest at court rates."

A cursory appraisal of these demands clearly shows, apart from other aspects, that Mr. Lungatso is suffering from a serious delusion and is certainly very much misguided in his hopes and aspirations. The aforesaid prayers are certainly not of the type which an employee who has suffered a loss of employment normally makes.

It is obvious that after the six months' probationary period no communication was made to Mr. Lungatso advising him of either his probationary period having been extended or of his confirmation in his employment. He had finished the six months in July 1980 and on 1st October of that year he addressed a long letter to hon. Tipis, an assistant minister at

the time in the Office of the President in which he made very serious allegations against the respondents on the following seven items—

overpayment of over KSh. 90,000, exporting melons at a loss, excessive overprinting of cartons, false declaration of 5½ tons melons, A.D.C. development blue "front" (probably he meant blue-print), job monopoly by the horticultural manager and failure by the acting general manager to approve his job designation. He also listed several frustrations like his probation not confirmed, salary not in keeping with his appointment, no filing cabinet, no transport for marketing, and that his duties had changed.

At the end of this letter to Mr. Tipis he appealed to the relevant Ministry of Livestock Development and the inspector of statutory boards to come to his aid by considering him for a transfer to any other statutory board where his talent could easily be spotted, tapped and exploited to the maximum interest of the nation! The court notes with interest that all this comes from a person, i.e. Mr. Lungatso, who admitted having four previous convictions—

for theft, assault, creating disturbance and publishing defamatory matter.

These convictions were in June 1969, July 1961, July 1969 and February 1977.

It is obvious that at that stage when Mr. Lungatso wrote this letter to hon. Tipis, he could see that his days with the respondents were numbered otherwise there seems to be no reason why he should involve the Office of the President in this matter. The court certainly does not believe that he was sent to the respondents by the President's Office to spy and unearth any malpractices that he may come across. Mr. Lungatso certainly did create that impression—that he was sent there by the government for this mission. There is, however, absolutely no evidence whatsoever to support this mistaken notion on his part. The court finds that even if someone in the President's Office helped Mr. Lungatso get this job, after that it was up to him either to survive or sink but this fact obviously went to his head as he maintained that every senior officer in the respondents thought that he was a threat to his position. The court is satisfied that Mr. Lungatso was not qualified in any way to be a threat to any of the senior officers there and that he was only misusing and to a certain extent abusing the channel of his appointment which was through the inspector of statutory boards.

The respondents very strongly denied and refuted the various allegations and frustrations which Mr. Lungatso had listed against them in his letter to hon. Tipis, which he had copied to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Livestock Development for the attention of J. B. Omondi.

With the aforesaid background the court had to carry out a very exhaustive and detailed hearing in this dispute lasting twelve days during which massive documentary evidence had to be sifted.

The principal allegations made by Mr. Lungatso—that the respondents were engaged in massive swindles and frauds—have not been proved by any means. The respondents' books of accounts are audited regularly and it is inconceivable that such fraudulent transactions could have escaped the auditors' attention. At least no evidence was produced in court in this direction. The only matter on which arguments were put forward were the alleged overpayments to Schenker & Co. After having gone through the various invoices and the summary of accounts produced the court finds that there was no overpayment made to that company. What happened was that this company had a running account with the respondents and one cheque of KSh. 132,218 contained an overpayment of KSh. 12,754.20 which had been paid through a previous cheque but this amount was subsequently deducted from Schenker & Co. The court views this as a normal error which can occur in any organization. Once the accounts are finalized any overpayments are naturally deducted.

All the other allegations made by Mr. Lungatso also remain unproved. The only exception is a 10½ ton load of melons which came from Garissa to Updown where it was recorded that 5½ tons were damaged. The horticultural manager was present and he stated that as a result of a cursory glance that 5½ tons were damaged although when they were later checked on that day only about 1½ tons were found to be damaged. In the end, however, it transpired that only 5 tons were sold. This, on the face of it, appears to be a bit suspicious but considering all the circumstances pertaining to this particular item and the fact that because of the transportation problems of melons from Garissa to Updown the percentage of damaged melons was indeed very high and keeping in mind the perishable nature of the fruit the court does not attach any particular significance to the allegation.

The court accepts the horticultural manager's explanation on the printing of cartons and it appears that instead of over-spending money on them as alleged by Mr. Lungatso in the end again by this what appears to be an overprinting of cartons turned out to be a saving because the costs of production had considerably gone up in the following months and furthermore all these cartons were fully utilized. The court is also satisfied that the melons were not being exported at a loss to European markets as alleged by Mr. Lungatso.

The other allegations regarding potatoes are not all that serious and there again the commotion that Mr. Lungatso tried to create is totally unjustified. In fact there is some truth in the respondents' allegation that if there was anything fishy going on in these deals especially oranges, then Mr. Lungatso is the person answerable because he was involved in the sale of oranges as a marketing assistant!

In the end Mr. Lungatso found himself charged with a criminal offence of having stolen KSh. 103 from the respondents. On 28th January, 1981, the Attorney-General entered a *nolle prosequi* and he was discharged under section 82 (1) CPC.

Here is a case where a person who was going around looking for a job was given an opportunity which unfortunately he completely abused by assuming the role of investigator just because the inspector of statutory boards helped him get this job. Surely the government has other better and more efficient means of investigating malpractices than assigning such role to a person of Mr. Lungatso's calibre. Mr. Lungatso was indeed completely misguided and he should have realized that he was only a junior employee. As such he should have gone about his work with due diligence and proper co-operation with his superiors who were all far more qualified than him in their respective professions. In fact he was no threat to them as claimed by him.

Mr. Lungatso even went as far as to attack, in his written submission, the Permanent Secretary, Cabinet Affairs, Office of the President, by saying that Mr. Nyachae decided to adopt a negative and arrogant attitude towards his case by not bothering to acknowledge or even reply to his letters. Mr. Lungatso further went and said that even the Chief Secretary astonished him by adopting the same stance as Mr. Nyachae!

The court cannot really say that this is the kind of a case where it can exercise its powers of interfering in the decision of a management which has decided to terminate the services of an errant employee who at every opportunity smeared the names of most of the top officers. There appears to be no excuse at all for Mr. Lungatso to have written the letter to hon. Tipis on 1st October, 1980, except perhaps that he had realized that he was going to get the sack and tried to forestall it by creating all this furore about frauds going on at the respondents' organization. He had worked for them for only nine months and considering all the circumstances of this dispute and the evidence produced, the court finds that it cannot interfere with the respondents' decision to terminate his services. The court has in the past repeatedly pointed out the circumstances under which the court would interfere in a management's decision to terminate an employee's services and this case does not fall within those guidelines. The court accordingly rejects each and every demand made by the claimants on Mr. Lungatso's behalf.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE No. 80 OF 1982

Parties:

Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union
and
University of Nairobi

Issue in dispute:

House-to-office allowance.

THE Domestic and Hotel Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the University of Nairobi shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

The parties were heard in Nairobi on 15th October, and 23rd December, 1982, and 11th March, 1983, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 1st February, 1982, duly signed by both the parties was received by the court on 17th August, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties entered into an agreement on 9th June, 1980, on the subject matter of house-to-office allowance for employees using bicycles or buses in the following terms:

"Agreed that the employees staying eight or more kilometres away from their working places be paid an allowance of KSh. 125 per month and that circular KU/R AD/19/54 dated 2nd November, 1979, should apply to those who use their own cars."

This was at a meeting chaired by an official of the Ministry of Labour, Mrs. Randiak. The category of employees affected by this agreement were between grades 4 to 1 with the total number as shown below:

The Lugonzo committee in 1980 had recommended under the issue of house-to-office *mguu* allowance that staff who did not own cars be paid a house-to-office allowance of KSh. 100 each if they lived more than eight kilometres from their place of work.

The court is satisfied that the parties' agreement on the special meeting on 9th June, 1980, was influenced by the above recommendation in the Lugonzo committee report.

However, before the aforesaid agreement could be incorporated in the collective agreement and implemented, the Waruhiu committee had started its work in the meantime on the Civil Service review. The Waruhiu report came out in September 1980, and pages 164, 165 and 166 dealt with salaries and terms of services for the University of Nairobi. In paragraphs 374 and 375 the committee stated as follows:

"In regard to the allowances and other terms of service, we have recommended that the house-to-office mileage allowance should be abolished. We have adopted the reasoning expressed by the Ndegwa Commission Report in paragraph 785 of their report which reads as follows:

'An employee cannot accept employment unless he presents himself at the place of work. Officers must be allowed to live where they will, having been provided with housing allowance and present themselves at the place of work.'"

We have also found that in the Civil Service, the house-to-office allowance is discriminatory in that it is given to those who possess cars and it restricts the distance to eight kilometres. We recommend that the university council should not accept the Lugonzo Commission recommendation and that the house-to-office mileage allowance should be abolished.

As a result of the Waruhiu Commission, the house-to-office transport allowance was abolished by the respondents with effect from 1st January, 1981. On 22nd January, 1981, the respondents informed all the staff in grades 1 to 4 of the new terms and conditions of service and also informed them of the government directive regarding house-to-office allowance.

The claimants have strongly submitted that the respondents are bound by the agreement which they made with them on 9th June, 1980. They also stressed that house-to-office allowance which they called *mguu* allowance was paid to their members in the past but it was abolished on 22nd January. They further pointed out that their members at Kenyatta University are entitled to KSh. 100 by way of this allowance and as the respondents' employees also live and work in campuses that are far from town like Kabete, Kanyariri, Chiromo and Kikuyu Adult Studies, they should also get this allowance.

The respondents have vigorously denied that they ever paid house-to-office *mguu* allowance to their employees and the allegation that this allowance has been withdrawn does not arise.

The court had referred the parties' submissions to the Division of Manpower Planning and Development for investigations and the economist had a meeting with the claimants and the shop-

stewards. One Mr. T. Adunda in the catering unit, had said that they were refunded bus fares on production of receipts used on daily basis but they never signed anywhere when they were refunded this money. It is hard to believe that if such a system was in existence and the workers were being refunded money that there should be no record especially in an institution which is being financed by the government. It is highly unlikely that an official arrangement had been made in the catering unit to this effect.

The court notes that the D.M.P.D. report states that if this demand made by the claimants is accepted by the court then the labour cost to the respondents on this item alone will go up by KSh. 4,500,000 per year.

The parties have accepted that the Waruhiu Commission amended the house allowance which the parties had negotiated and also the salaries and wages recommended therein were implemented.

The court has taken into consideration the fact that every agreement between the claimants and the respondents has to go to the university council for approval before it is implemented and in cases where finances are involved the Minister for Higher Education has to give approval to the council. This is obviously so because the government has to provide all the funds that are necessary for running the university.

The court has carefully considered all aspects of this dispute and has come to the conclusion that the agreement of 9th June, 1980, has been overtaken by Waruhiu Commission and in view of the huge amount of KSh. 4,500,000 per year which would be required to be provided by the government if an award is made in favour of the claimants, the court has come to the conclusion especially in view of the financial constraints being faced by the government just now that it would not be practical for such an award to be made. The court accordingly rejects the claimants' demand for the time being and directs that the parties may re-examine this issue during the next round of negotiations when it can be examined in the light of circumstances prevailing then. In the meantime this demand stands rejected.

Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union
and
Baobab Farm Limited

Issues in dispute:

Hours of work,
Transport to hospital,
Housing and housing allowance,
Wages.

THE Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Baobab Farm Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 31st March, and 15th April, 1983, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 8th September, 1982, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 10th December, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The respondents are a subsidiary of the Bamburi Portland Cement Company Limited since 1977. The claimants and the respondents have a collective agreement effective from 1st September, 1979, which expired on 31st August, 1981.

In the collective agreement which is being revised, the parties had agreed on four groups, A to D, with the following classification:

Group	KSh.
D	589 and above
C	328 to 588
B	286 to 327
A	175 to 285

Based on the above grouping the workers were granted wage increases ranging from 8 to 15 per cent for the first year and 5 to 12 per cent for the second year.

The claimants have proposed that the previous application of the Agricultural Industry Order to the respondents' employees should now be disregarded because they are working and living within the Mombasa municipality as the respondents' farm is at Bamburi. They accordingly proposed the following wages during conciliation:

Group	KSh.	First year	Second year
A	668 and above	60 per cent	30 per cent
B	390 to 667	65 per cent	35 per cent
C	352 to 389	70 per cent	40 per cent
D	260 to 351	75 per cent	45 per cent

The respondents on the other hand offered a wage increase of 8 to 16 per cent for the first year and 7 to 14 per cent for the second year on the above classification.

The crucial point in this dispute is whether the agricultural workers within the Mombasa municipality are entitled to the rates specified under the general order. The court has carefully studied this point and must overrule the claimants' submission to this effect because this order clearly specifies that it does not apply to agricultural workers. Until the general order is amended, the court cannot help the claimants on this particular argument.

It is a fact that a number of the respondents' employees previously used to be Bamburi Portland Cement Company employees and they have brought their wages which they used to earn there to their present employment. The respondents, however, offered them employment with effect from 23rd December, 1977, by breaking up their existing wage which was much higher than the Agricultural Industry Order into a basic wage and a merit allowance giving them the same total as before. The previous collective agreement increases were, however, granted on the total wages.

The Division of Manpower Planning and Development report shows that the claimants are entitled to a maximum compensation ceiling of about 19 per cent although the claimants submitted that it was more than that as they maintained that the rise in the cost of living indices in Mombasa during the relevant period was 29 per cent.

After careful consideration of all the submissions, the court awards the following wage increases on the agreed job groupings:

Group	KSh.	First year	Second year
D	668 and above	10 per cent	10 per cent
C	390 to 667	13 per cent	13 per cent
B	352 to 389	15 per cent	15 per cent
A	260 to 351	19 per cent	19 per cent

Housing allowance.—At present the following clause appears in the collective agreement:

"The employer shall provide reasonable housing as provided in section 9 of the Employment Act (Cap. 226). If an employee resides on his own free will off the estate he shall not be entitled to housing allowance. If on the other hand an employee requires housing and there is none available, the employer shall pay KSh. 35 per month until he is offered a house."

The claimants are demanding a house allowance of KSh. 250. This implies an overhead cost of KSh. 15,000 per month assuming a labour force of 60 workers. The respondents have offered KSh. 75 and have argued that under the guidelines the workers' entitlement on the house allowance would be KSh. 35 plus 13 per cent of this figure which is KSh. 4.55 making a total of KSh. 39.55, but since they had offered KSh. 75 they were prepared to stand by their offer.

The court in exercise of its powers of determining the basic living standard of workers in any given industry, awards that the respondents should pay a house allowance of KSh. 100 per month to those of their employees who are not housed by them. The rest of the clause on this issue remains as at present.

Hours of work.—Under this item the claimants have demanded that working hours per week for stockmen, herdsmen and watchmen shall not exceed 46 hours spread over six days a week. At present their working hours are 60 hours per week.

The court has carefully considered the parties' submissions on this point and also the statement made by the D.M.P.D. on this issue and has come to the conclusion that it would not be proper to disturb the working hours of these employees and the court awards that they should continue as before.

Transport to hospital.—It appears that the claimants are asking for transportation costs and burial expenses in the event of the death of an employee or a member of his family residing within his place of work as the parties have already agreed on the following:

"It was agreed by both parties that where an employee or member of his family residing with him at the place of work falls sick and requires transport to hospital and is unable to, on account of his illness, travel to and from the hospital, the employer shall provide free transport at the expense of the company."

The court cannot be unmindful of the respondents' financial position in matters where they are required to increase their labour costs. The respondents at present receive a grant of KSh. 92,000 per month from Bamburi Portland Cement Company Limited who have also guaranteed the respondents bank overdraft to the tune of KSh. 500,000. The respondents are basically a service farm to the Bamburi Portland Cement Company Limited's employees who get food products on a subsidized cost of about 5 per cent from the company.

The court does not feel that this sort of expense can legitimately be passed on to the respondents and it is accordingly rejected.

The respondents have tried to introduce the issue of effective date in this dispute by saying that the claimants had delayed the negotiations with the result that there was already a delay of one-and-a-half years and asked that the effective date should be the date of the court award.

The court does not intend to waste much time on this issue because it is not an issue in dispute as stated on the Notification of Dispute Form "A" and the court accordingly rejects the respondents' demand in this regard.

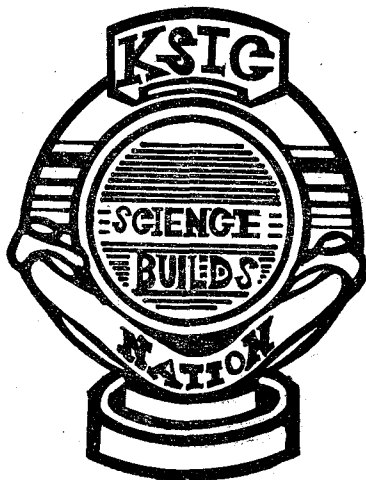

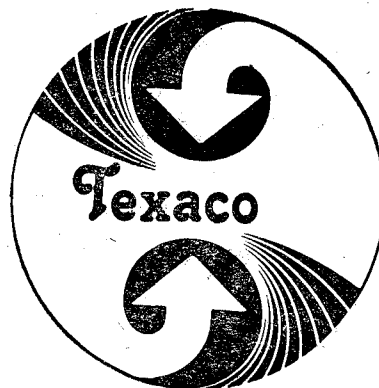

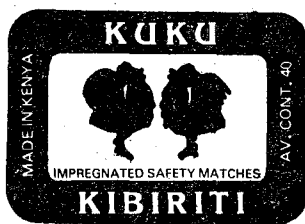

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

"D.14.(1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready."

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.

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
