2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 23rd, 24th and 25th November, 1983, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

Award

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 15th June, 1983, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 28th July, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute concerns nearly 7,859 bank employees in the country out of a total of 9,329, the balance being members of the management. The break down of the unionizable employees is as follows:

The collective agreement between the parties for the years 1981 to 1983 was effective from 1st March, 1981, for a period of two years with a wage reopener clause after one year. The court notes that there had been a similar practice in all previous collective agreements in the banking industry and in the 1981/83 collective agreement they clearly stated that salaries will be reviewed annually in future.

During the very vigorous and often heated submissions made by the parties during the hearing the court was told of massive swindles by some of the bank employees covering all levels—unionizable and management. The court notes with great dismay this most serious and unfortunate situation and hopes that the relevant authorities will no doubt bring to book the culprits. The court, however, cannot use any submissions in this regard to deny the bank employees their due and fair share of wage and housing allowance increases and other fringe benefits.

The claimants' demand on wages effective from 1st March, 1983 are:

Subordinate staff		 	28%
Clerical staff and check clerks	·	 	26%
Section heads			23 250%

They have based this demand on the increase in the cost of living index between 1st March, 1981 to 28th February, 1983, which works out to an average of 44.08 per cent. The claimants have further argued that the technical and subordinate staff should get the full compensation as they are lowest paid categories in the banking industry. They argued that out of the 44 per cent which was their entitlement they had received 16.50 per cent in 1982 leaving the balance of 27.80 per cent due to them rounded up to 28 per cent. The section heads would be entitled to 44 per cent less 13 per cent granted in 1982 leaving 31 per cent three-quarters of which is 23.25 per cent.

The respondents have argued that the cost of living changes which were relevant to this dispute were between 1st March, 1982 to 28th February, 1983, which would give the middle income workers who in this case are the subordinate staff 14.8 per cent increase which is three-quarters of 19.7 per cent. For other categories like section heads, check clerks and clerical staff the maximum compensation permissible under the wage guidelines is 12.5 per cent which is three-quarters of 16.7 per cent.

It appears that the respondents' offer of wage increments ranges from 15 per cent to 20 per cent which they maintained actually overcompensates the section heads, check clerks and clerical staff by 2.5 per cent and subordinate staff by 0.3 per cent.

After careful consideration of the parties' submissions on this issue, the court has decided not to interfere with the parties' clearly stated intention of revising the wages in the banking industry annually so that court award in this dispute on this item will be for one year only effective from 1st March, 1983. In working out its award the court has taken into consideration the report prepared by the Principal Economist, Division of Manpower Planning and Development. The court awards the following wage increases:

This award will no doubt be revised again in a matter of few months as it expires at the end of February 1984. The court would like to remind the parties that the latest revision of guidelines states under guideline (iv) (b) (iii) as follows:

"No negotiations on these new terms will be allowed until the current agreement expires. However, voluntary revisions after one-year of two-year agreements will be allowed if there is substantial proof to the effect that the wage increase stipulated in the agreements fail to compensate for price increases to the extent permitted in guideline (iv) above. As far as possible long-term agreements without opener clauses for revision should be avoided."

The court notes that previous to this revision guideline (x) stated that voluntary revisions after one year of the two-year

agreement will be allowed only if the wage increase stipulated in the agreement fails to compensate for price increase to the extent permitted under guideline (iv).

The claimants have argued that their demand is a reflection of a similar percentage difference in house allowance payable to junior officers and section heads. The junior officers at present were being paid a house allowance of KSh. 1,500 p.m. The claimants also referred the court to house allowance being paid to the civil servants in support of their demand. They added that the bank employees were required to observe a certain standard of living which they could not maintain on the current level of house allowance being paid to them.

The respondents drew the court's attention to the historical development of the house allowance in the banking industry and pointed out that at a conciliation meeting under the chairmanship of the Labour Commissioner assisted by the late Juma Boy and Mr. Kombo it was agreed not to deconsolidate the consolidated wages because any such deconsolidation would negatively affect the other employee benefits such as pension rights, provident fund contributions and overtime. It was therefore agreed that the wage increase due from 1st March, 1981, be converted to an additional housing element and be paid separately as house allowance thereafter. They maintained that the housing element in the consolidated wages would continue to remain in the consolidated wages. The respondents made the following offer which they maintained was more than was allowed under guideline (iv) (b) (i):

The court has given very anxious thought to this item and has come to the conclusion that in the absence of a clear agreement in writing that there is a housing element in the consolidated wage the court cannot accept the respondents' submission. The court finds that the parties decided to overlook the housing element in the consolidated wage when they agreed to a separate house allowance to be paid to the bank employees with effect from 1st March, 1981. The court has further taken into consideration guideline (v) which reads as follows in assessing the house allowance for the respondents' unionizable employees:

"Workers are entitled to a basic minimum standard of living. It will be for the court to decide what that minimum should be from time to time in each occupation. But in deciding that minimum it is suggested that the court should always have regard to the standard of living of people who are not in wage employment, particularly the standards of the average small farmer in the rural areas."

The court awards the following house allowance with effect from 1st March, 1983, and which will remain in force for a period of two years from that date:
