C.F.T.C.'s existing evaluation practices vary widely and even within divisions there are different kinds of projects requiring different approaches. What is now required is a more systematic approach based on agreed principles and as far as possible on standard procedures, having regard to the different requirements of C.F.T.C.'s constituent programmes. Evaluations will be utilized—

- (a) to improve management's performance by building up an institutional memory; and
- (b) to facilitate management's accountability to the BOR.

C.F.T.C. evaluation is seen as primarily an in-house responsibility, to be carried out in a way which takes full account of resource constraints and the need to preserve flexibility and sensitivity in operations, together with administrative simplicity and the special quality of intimacy and confidence which characterizes the fund's relations with its user governments.

C.F.T.C.'s planning mechanism provides for the review by the BOR every second year of the fund's three-year planning profile. The fund's activities are guided by these three-year plans which are rolled over every two years and which set targets: for the total revenue and expenditure of the fund as well as for more detailed programme and sectoral objectives. There is a requirement for these biennial reviews to be supported by evaluative assessments of the different programme areas. C.F.T.C. evaluation is also seen as closely related to project appraisal and monitoring.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

Cause No. 111 of 1983

Parties:

Kenya Union of Printing, Publishing, Paper Manufacturers and Allied Workers

and

Nation Newspaper Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Refusal and failure to provide transport for their employees leaving duty at 9.30 p.m. involved in the newly-introduced shift by the management.

THE Kenya Union of Printing, Publishing, Paper Manufacturers and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Nation Newspaper Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 30th April, 1984, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 11th October, 1983, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 6th December, 1983, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

In the parties' collective agreement under clause 6, shift work is defined in details and in clause 25 under the heading of transportation it is provided:

"The member companies shall adopt a reasonable attitude in providing transport to those employees reporting for shift duty after 6.30 p.m. and leaving before 6 a.m. taking into account the physical safety of such employees and availability of transport facilities."

A shift worker is defined to be an employee who is regularly called to work wholely or partly hours outside the normal hours laid down by his employer subject to a minimum of 30 hours and to a maximum of 40 hours per week and the number of hours each day as specified being normal hours. The claimants have raised this dispute for the provision of transport for those employees who are required to report on duty during the second shift from 1.30 p.m. up to 9.30 p.m. Their contention is that such employees are shift employees within the provisions of clause 6 of the collective agreement.

The respondents have refused to accept this demand on the ground that this demand is outside the collective agreement and therefore could not be entertained. Their main submission for saying so is that they are required to provide transport to those employees only who report on shift duty after 6 p.m. and who leave before 6 a.m. The employees in respect of which he claimants are demanding transport at night do not fall within this category. The respondents further pleaded that there is ample public transport in Nairobi area up to midnight and therefore these employees had no problem getting home.

The court notes that the production employees at the respondents Nation House operations work in three shifts as follows:

Monday to Friday:

 1st shift 8.30 a.m. to 5.00 p.m.
 32 employees.

 2nd shift 1.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m.
 27 employees.

 3rd shift 5.00 p.m. to 2.30 a.m.
 32 employees.

Saturdays.

One shift 4.00 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. 40 employees.

Sundays:

One shift 4.00 p.m. to 2.30 a.m. ... 40 employees.

The court was told that out of 27 employees who are on the second shift between 1.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. ten to fifteen are provided with transport because there is no bus service in the area where they live.

The respondents are part of printing trades group of the F.K.E. and are bound by the collective agreement between that group and the claimants in which the aforesaid two clauses material to this dispute appear. In this employers' group there are 50 members. It is obvious that any award made on any item that appears in that collective agreement will have an automatic application to the rest of the employers also. This dispute therefore has much wider implications as it will create a precedent in the printing industry.

The court was told that the respondents had tried to persuade the workers who are affected by this dispute to accept reasonable financial compensation as decided by the respondents and to drop the demand for free transport to their homes. The claimants' rejection of this offer was based on the fear of thugs who they claim were on the increase in Nairobi area. They also referred to one of the respondents' employees in industrial area being attacked by thugs and killed while reporting for duty at 7 p.m.

Unfortunately for the claimants although the respondents appear to have introduced a new shift from 1.30 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. during the lifetime of the aforesaid collective agreement, the provisions of clause 25 are still applicable and binding on them. The court fully appreciates the plight of the claimants' members who leave work at 9.30 p.m. in that they are exposed to thugs and many of them reach their houses between 10.30 p.m. and midnight. The fact, however, remains that under the collective agreement the respondents are required to provide free transport to those employees who report for shift work after 6 p.m. and who leave before 6 a.m. and that also taking into account the physical safety of such employees and availability of transport facilities. The provisions of the collective agreement are clearly in favour of the respondents until such time as the collective agreement is amended. The court would not like to make an award which would go contrary to the provisions of the existing collective agreement and the best course for the claimants is to make a demand against the printing trades group of the F.K.E. at the opportune time for amending clause 25 of the collective agreement along with other amendments they may have.

The court while rejecting the claimants' demand notes that at a meeting held between the parties on 9th May, 1982, the respondents had made an offer of paying these employees Kenya Bus fares to their respective homes and they also indicated that they would examine the possibility of bringing forward the late K.B.S. to transport the 9.30 p.m. workers. This arrangement, however, was temporary and would have depended on the success of producing pre-printing pages in the mornings instead of the evenings. The court would advise the workers to accept the financial compensation offered by the respondents until such time as the claimants succeeded in altering the provisions of the collective agreement and the court would also ask the respondents to seriously examine and try to bring forward the late Kenya Bus Service to transport the 9.30 p.m. workers. Apart from this the court cannot help the claimants' members any more in this dispute until such time as the collective agreement is amended. In the meantime the court upholds that the respondents are within their right to refuse to provide transport to their employees leaving duty at 9.30 p.m. The court cannot find any grounds to uphold the claimants' allegation that the respondents have violated the relevant clause in the collective agreement.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE No. 113 of 1983

Parties:

Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers and

Musicraft Manufacturing (K) Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Wrongful dismissal of Grace Wangari Mwangi.

THE Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Musicraft Manufacturing (K) Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 26th April, 1984, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. They also called the following witnesses:

Claimants.—G. W. Mwangi. Respondents.—A. Juma.

Award

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 16th April, 1982, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 15th December, 1983, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

This is an interesting case as Grace Mwangi, the grievant, after joining the respondents on 2nd May, 1979, found herself by April, 1981, in the respondents' topmost grade, i.e. grade 6 in the post of alignment lady. This she achieved through the assistance of the claimants who insisted that the duties allocated to her were those specified in grade 6.

The respondents director admitted that he agreed to this promotion most reluctantly and had warned the claimants that he pitied poor Miss Wangari who will lose her job as a result of her promotion. He said that he would stop internal training and would be recruiting qualified manpower to fill those vacancies that will have occurred. He however, said there will be no witch-hunting to those promoted. These words were uttered by him at a meeting between the parties held on 23rd April, 1981. Mr. Juma, the director, followed the promotion by writing the following letter to Miss Mwangi:

"As a result of a meeting between the management and your union, the union felt that the current duties which you are now performing conformed to the grade 6. We mentioned that your ability and competence in this grade is below the required standard and that is why there is an alignment man responsible. But it was agreed that so long as you are in the alignment room then you should be promoted accordingly. We respect this decision and you are accordingly promoted. Congratulations.

Please note within this grade 6 there are other lines of duties namely: Line inspectors, final inspectors, quality inspectors, storekeepers and senior clerks. You may be called to work in any of these duties if required."

The next development in this dispute was that on 23rd July, 1981, the director gave her radio cassettes to repair as he felt that this type of repair was undertaken by employees in grade 6. Miss Mwangi had no clue about this work and when she was asked in writing why she had not repaired the cassettes she replied she is an alignment lady and had been trained in that work and had qualified for grade 6 in that line. She confessed she had no knowledge of repair work. There was a further exchange of letters on this subject and on 11th August, 1981, her services were terminated. She was offered the balance of terminal dues amounting to KSh. 1,334. The respondents had, however, offered to place her in grade 2 as learner assembler but the claimants rejected the offer.

The court heard the evidence of Miss Mwangi and the director and the court finds that obviously Miss Mwangi got a very big promotion (on representations made by the claimants) from grade I to grade 6 which grade includes job of line inspectors, alignment man, final inspector, quality control inspector, store-keeper and senior clerk. Miss Mwangi could not by any stretch of imagination do any of these jobs except that of aligning which is not such a complicated task. This being the position it is most unfortunate that the respondents succumbed to the claimants' pressure on a matter of promotion and the claimants are quite right when they say that the respondents' director could have told them there and then that he could not grant this promotion. They stated that not only did he agree to grant this promotion but he also undertook not to victimize any

of the employees who were upgraded as a result of their representations. It is clear that the director all along had felt that Miss Mwangi did not deserve to be promoted to grade 6 but reluctantly agreed to upgrade her and then despite his undertaking not to victimize her, at an opportune time he created circumstances like asking her to repair cassettes which he knew she could not and then dismissed her.

The court is of the view that the director should have been firm and rejected this promotion despite the claimants' representations. The unfortunate part of this dispute is that the respondents agreed to the promotion and undertook not to victimize any employees but Miss Mwangi clearly was victimized when she was given a job which every body knew she could not do. This was only to get rid of her.

In this dispute the court finds that both the parties are at fault but the blame lies more on the respondents who should have known better the management rights and prerogatives.

After careful consideration of all submissions the court finds that Miss Mwangi has suffered a wrongful dismissal. The court notes that the Ministry of Labour had also found that she had suffered a wrongful dismissal and had recommended three months' salary by way of compensation in addition to terminal benefits. The court finds that reinstatement is not warranted in this dispute as Miss Mwangi is certainly not entitled to be placed in grade 6. The court finds that an award of compensation would meet dictates of justice in this dispute and accordingly awards that the respondents should pay her five months' salary by way of compensation (salary per month for grade 6 is KSh. 1,120). This amount includes underpayment of KSh. 1,385 claimed by the claimants but does not include pay for days worked up to and including 11th August, 1981, KSh. 350, pay for accrued leave for 11 days, KSh. 467 which should be in addition to the compensation. The court directs the respondents to pay Miss Mwangi her dues as awarded by the court less any advances that she may have taken.

Issue in dispute:

Recognition.

THE Amalgamated Union of Kenya Metal Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Davis & Shirtliff Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 6th June, 1983 and 29th February, 1984, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 18th September, 1983, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 23rd December, 1982, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

In this dispute the claimants are seeking recognition from the respondents as they claim that they have recruited a majority of their employees into their membership since 1981. They had forwarded the relevant check-off form for collection of trade union dues section 45 of the Trade Disputes Act to the respondents which the latter denied having received. The claimants had also reported the matter to the Registrar of Trade Unions who in turn had written a couple of letters to the respondents but the latter told him also that they had never received the check-off notice from the claimants. It appears that the respondents then informed the claimants that although they had been in business for 35 years they had no connections with any trade union and had not even been approached by any trade union for recognition.

The respondents' predecessor was a small plumbing and water engineering firm called R. H. Paige & Co. which was bought by E. C. Davis and in 1946 F. R. Shritliff purchased 50 per cent of the company and the respondents came into being.

The respondents' business in earlier days was designing and installing of water supplies and maintenance of water related equipment and it has since then grown steadily on construction and installation work and now they specialize in the construction of swimming pools, water storage facilities, electrical submersible pumps and other large-scale projects.

The court is satisfied that the respondents are basically in the business of construction of storage and water treatment facilities. They have in their employment 145 persons and they are deployed as follows:

- 41 employees operating in various field sites as plumbers and borehole crews.
- 33 employees in the construction department and carry on the building business.
- 18 employees closely associated with the field and building department is a support transport department being drivers, turnboys and mechanics.
- 16 employees in mechanical workshop which conducts mechanical repairs principally to pumps and also includes lathe operators making spare parts.
- 18 employees responsible for light steel fabrication in support of construction activities. This fabrication workshop builds tanks and towers for water projects, filters for swimming pools, water treatment plans and various accessories required by the mainstream operation.
- 19 employees: clerical and office staff, messengers, watchmen, and telephonists, etc.

The court has no reason to doubt the respondents' submission that 92 workers are engaged in civil engineering work in the field and they are supported by workshop and office employees by the remaining workers. They maintain that they are in construction and civil engineering industry. The claimants, however, do not accept this and have argued that they are an industry engaged in metal working and to some extent involving electrical work, and since there was no rival trade union there should be no difficulty in awarding them recognition. They referred the court to a letter from the Registrar of Trade Unions in which he had informed the respondents that the claimants by virtue of their registered constitution were competent to represent the interests of their unionizable employees. They also referred the court to the finding of the Ministry of Labour investigator which was in their favour.

The respondents have very vigorously opposed this submission by the claimants on the ground that they were the founder members of the Kenya Association of Building and Civil Engineering Contractors and had always abided by and implemented the terms and conditions of employment for all their employees which were negotiated between that employer's group and the Kenya Building, Construction, Civil Engineering and Allied Trades' Workers' Union. They stressed that if the em-ployees had not joined the building union then it was not their fauit as it was up to the workers to do so. They maintained that the nature of their industry fell within the Building Employers' Group and that the metal operations in their undertaking were only of supportive nature to their main work of building swimming pools and other water works. They bitterly criticized the Ministry of Labour investigator on the ground that he had failed to understand the nature of the dispute and that as such proceeded to give a recommendation completely devoid of logic and fair judgment. They accused him of not giving them an opportunity of presenting their case and also failing to establish what was their line of business. He also allowed the claimants to mislead him by accepting their allegation that the respondents were registered as hydraulic, mechanical and agricultural engineers!

The court finds this dispute to be rather important because of the issues involved in it. The points that are clearly established highlighting the complicated nature of this dispute are that the respondents are pioneers of the Building Employers Group and appear in several places in the list of members of this group under various headings. They are mentioned as members under civil engineering and road contractors category, then they appear under plumbing contractors and mechanical services group and they are also mentioned under filtration group. All these groups are part of the building industry. There are several electrical contractors also mentioned as members of this group, who, it is not disputed, have a separate recognition and collective agreement with the claimants.

There is no dispute that the respondents' employees did not belong to any trade union until they were recruited by the claimants.

The court finds it proved that most of the respondents' current contracts, details of which were submitted during the hearing, involve construction of swimming pools and changing rooms, supply and installation of swimming pool filters and associated piping, borehole pumps with generators and water treatment plants with storage tanks.

In disputes of this nature which are unlike a trade union fighting against an employer for better terms and conditions of employment as such (although that would be the next step if recognition is granted to the claimants) but they are strictly disputes between two trade unions and although the Building Union is not a party to this dispute they did write to the Minister of Labour that they had an interest in this dispute as the employers were members of the Building Employers' Group through which they recognized the Building Union. The court must emphasize that while it has every sympathy with a trade union which goes and organize workers in an undertaking this fact in itself is not sufficient for that trade union to be granted recognition if the nature of the employer's industry clearly falls outside the scope of that particular trade union's membership. In this dispute the court has to determine what is the predominating nature of the respondents' business and after careful consideration of all the submissions the court finds that they fall within the building industry and that about 70 per cent of their workers are involved in that activity. The remaining small percentage is engaged in supportive activities which also handle metal.

The court has to be extremely careful in these matters and would seriously urge the trade unions also to be extremely cautious in these disputes otherwise a "free for all" situation will develop and the workers will haphazardly join any trade union that they can get hold of. This will lead to chaos and a big mix-up. The court feels that it is a duty of each and every trade union that where they find that workers are not organized and members of any trade union they should alert their sister trade union which is the proper trade union for that industry so that the proper trade union can go and recruit members into their membership. It would not be out of place for trade unions through COTU to set up a co-ordinating body in this regard because after all the important thing is that the workers should enjoy trade union representation and protection but it is important that they should do so under the umbrella of the proper trade union for that industry.

The court finds that the Ministry of Labour investigator overlooked extremely important points during the investigation and that the Division of Manpower Planning and Development report was also mixed up with another company which had a somewhat similar name as the respondents'.

The court after having given a serious consideration to this dispute finds that the claimants' demand must fail because the respondents are in the building industry and they recognize the Building Union through the Building Employers' Group and it is up to this Building Union to go and recruit the respondents' employees or the respondents' employees to go and join that union if they so desire. The court accordingly rejects claimants' demand.


