The local authority shall not give approval unless it is satisfied that the proposals are such as to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.
- 2. The lessee shall within six (6) calendar months of the actual registration of the lease, submit in triplicate to the local authority plans including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and system of drainage for the disposal of sewage surface and sullage water, drawing elevations and specifications as amended if such be the case by the local authority:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Trust Land Act if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition it shall be lawful for the county council or any person authorized by the county council to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the county council in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

THE Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and C. M. C. Engineering firm shall hereinafter be referred to as respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 7th January, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

Notification of dispute Form "A" dated 18th January, 1984, duly signed by both parties was received by the court on 22nd May, 1984, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

In this dispute the claimants are seeking the promotion and adjustment of wages and payment of arrears for the aforesaid seven employees from the date they passed the Government Trade Test Grade I. The claimants informed the court that their complaints go way back to 1974 when one of their members an employee of the company had passed the Government Trade Test and the claimants had asked the respondents to promote him on that basis, and since then they have been exchanging correspondence on the subject. They went ahead to tell the court that the present dispute was triggered on 13th September, 1982, when the claimants approached the management regarding the promotion and underpayment of the seven employees who had passed a higher Government Trade Test.

The claimants further told the court that they failed to agree with the respondents and decided to report a formal dispute to the Ministry of Labour in accordance with the provision of the Trade Disputes Act, and D. S. Mutisya of the Ministry of Labour was appointed the investigator who thereafter submitted the findings and the recommendation to both parties. The recommendation reads as follows:

"Under circumstances, I recommend the employees in question be advanced to the next grade and subsequent arrears paid to each. Finally, I appeal to both parties to accept the above recommendation as a basis of setting the reported dispute."

The claimants told the court that they accepted the findings and recommendation by the Miristry of Labour whereas the respondents rejected it. The claimants further argued that it was the practice of the respondents in the past to award promotion to any employee who had passed higher Government Trade Test and could not see any reason why the seven employees could not be accorded the same treatment, i.e. be promoted to the higher grade having passed the Government Trade Test. The claimants went further to say that although the parties collective agreement has a clause on promotion but as regard the attainment of higher Government Trade Test, the agreement is silent and therefore they agree with ministry's findings and recommendation that parties must go by their practice of awarding employees automatic promotion when they had passed higher Government Trade Test.

On the other hand the respondents informed the court that they rejected the claimants demand to award the seven employees automatic promotion and pay them arrears. The respondents further pointed to the court that they could not go by the findings and recommendation of the Ministry of Labour suggesting to them that there should be automatic promotion for employees who happened to have passed higher Government Trade Test. The respondents argued that it was not their practice in the past to promote employees automatically having passed higher Government Trade Test as suggested by the claimants.

The respondents went further to enlighten the court regarding the clause on promotion in the collective agreement which reads as follows:

"Where vacancies of promotional nature arise, the company agree to give first priority to existing employees taking into account such consideration as relative ability, experience, qualifications and the length of service."

The respondents pointed out that the above clause says nothing about automatic promotion and that it was their practice in the past and at present to promote employees when vacancies existed. They went further to say it was the company practice over the years to put on the notice board the existing vacancies to enable the employees to apply. They added the claimants were fully aware of it.

The court has weighed very carefully the submissions by both parties. What has come to light is that there is no clause in the collective agreement on promotion which suggests automatic promotion on attainment of the higher Government Trade Test. While the court appreciated the effort by the employees to improve their grades by passing Government Trade Test, the court is convinced that it should not be used as the only criteria to be considered when promoting employees, and the court agrees with the respondents that passing of the trade test is one of the factors to be taken into account when awarding employees promotion. The claimants could not convince the court or produce evidence to back their claims that in the past, the respondents had promoted employees automatically when they had attained higher Government Trade Test. The court also notes that the seven employees have since been promoted from their previous respective grades to a higher grade when vacancies arose.

The court cannot accept the findings and recommendation of the Ministry of Labour and the court finds that the claimants' demand for the payment of arrears for the aforesaid seven employees for 32, 24, 24, 5, 5, 25 and 12 months to be misconceived. The claim is accordingly rejected.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Pan Africa Insurance Company Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 29th January, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submission.

AWARD

3. The Notification of the Dispute Form "A" dated 13th January, 1984, was received by the court on 26th July, 1984, together with statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The background of the dispute is that the claimants have recognized agreement with the respondents and the last collective agreement expired on 31st December, 1982. The parties were due to renew their collective agreement with effect from 1st January, 1983. During the negotiations the parties could not reach an agreement on the above-mentioned issues. The Ministry of Labour appointed a conciliator and the parties reached an agreement on two issues only, namely: five-day working week and uniforms. The claimants withdrew another item in dispute on "gratuity" and recorded deadlock on five issues which are now before the court.

This dispute involves 192 unionizable employees. The claimants are seeking wage increase and other benefits. Since all the employees are in the middle bracket and the cost of living between 1st January, 1981, to 31st December, 1982, has gone up by 35.5 per cent the claimants are pressing for the increase. The claimants further argued that the total earnings per month of 63 non-unionizable employees are higher compared to the total earnings of 192 unionizable employees. And on top of that the salaries of the managers are not restricted whereas the wages paid to the unionizable employees are restricted by the government guidelines. They, further claim that the management look after themselves properly at the expense of the majority of workers who do a lot more work. They also produced document to indicate that the expenditure in respect of members of management was colossal and unjustified.

The respondents on the other hand very strongly submitted that their employees were enjoying better terms and conditions than the employees of the member companies of the Insurance Employeers Group of F.K.E. and asked the court to dismiss the excessive claim by the claimants and make an award as per the respondents' offer. They argued that their nature of business falls within insurance industry and this type of business has become very competitive as there are now in existence 34 insurance companies in Kenya. The respondents pleaded that for the last three years they have been sustained by funds generated from their previous investments otherwise they would have been forced to close down.

They further told the court that in considering the percentage of compensation regard must be given to an in-built increment of KSh. 50 per last agreement (now proposed to be KSh. 55) by the respondents. On the other hand the claimants maintained that the compensation for the rise of cost of living be considered separate from the in-built increment and for that reason they are demanding the maximum wage increase permissible under the wage guidelines, i.e. 35.5 per cent according to their own calculation.

The Division of Manpower Planning and Department of Ministry of Labour came up with the following figures regarding the rise in the cost of living permissible under wage guidelines:

Middle income Group, 41.3 per cent.

Upper income Group, 39.3 per cent.

Therefore, the simple average of the two groups is 32.5 per cent

Wage increase

The claimants are asking the court the maximum permissible increase of 35.5 per cent to offset the rise in the cost of living, whereas the respondents feel that the in-built annual increment takes care of the rise in the cost of living.

After careful consideration of all submissions and taking into account the present guidelines the court awards the following wage increase:

First year 15 per cent and 15 per cent for the second year on top of the usual annual increment. This will be effective from 1st January, 1983 to 31st December, 1984.

Lengthening of scales

On the lengthening of scales, the claimants are demanding that the scales for subordinate grade, special subordinate, clerical II and clerical I should be extended from 17-22 and that of senior clerical to be extended from the present 12 to 22 respectively. The reason advanced by the claimants is that there are many employees who have reached the top of their scales and they do not benefit from yearly increases.

The respondents countered this by saying that in 1979 there were 15 notches and during the revision of the agreement in 1981 the parties agreed to increase the number to 17. The respondents believe that increasing the notches further would not serve any useful purpose but would contribute to the killing of the employees' incentive as they feel that salary increments are guaranteed irrespective of the workers performances. They requested the court to reject the claimants' demands.

The court has given consideration to this issue of lengthening of scales and rules in favour of respondents and rejects the claimants' demand.

House allowance

The claimants are demanding house allowance as follows:

Leave allowance

The claimants are demanding an equivalent of one month's salary as leave allowance. They claim that one section of employees get equivalent of one month's salary and respondents refusal to pay that to other sections amounts to discrimination.

The respondents would like the leave allowance to remain as it is at present which the court notes is as follows:

Medical benefits

The claimants' demand is that the respondents should meet 100 per cent cost of workers' medical treatment. The respondents are of the opinion that they are already offering generous medical benefit by meeting 75 per cent of the cost of medical treatment of of the workers and their families.

The court has given considerable thought to this claim and rejects the claimants' demand.
