2. The grant will be issued in the name of the allottee as given in letter of application and will be subject to the special conditions set out below.

3. The term of the grant will be for ninety-nine (99) years from the first day of the month following the issue of the allotment.

Special Conditions

1. No building shall be erected on the land nor shall additions or external alterations be made to any buildings otherwise than in conformity with plans and specifications previously approved in writing by the local authority. The local authority shall not give approval unless it is satisfied that the proposals are as such to develop the land adequately and satisfactorily.

2. The grantee shall within six (6) calendar months of the actual registration of the grant submit in triplicate to the local authority plans (including block plans showing the positions of the buildings and systems of drainage for the disposal of sewage surface and sullage water, drawing elevations and specifications of the buildings the grantee proposes to erect on the land and shall within twenty-four (24) months of the actual registration of the grant complete the erection of such buildings

and the construction of the drainage system in conformity with such plans, drawing elevations and specifications as amended (if such be the case) by the local authority:

Provided that notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained or implied by the Trust Land Act, if default shall be made in the performance or observance of any of the requirements of this condition, it shall be lawful for the county council or any person authorized by the county council to re-enter into and upon the land or any part thereof in the name of the whole and thereupon the term created shall cease but without prejudice to any right of action or remedy of the county council in respect of any antecedent breach of any condition herein contained.

3. The grantee shall maintain in good substantial repair and condition all buildings at any time erected on the land.

4. Should the grantee give notice in writing to the council that she/he/they is/are unable to complete the buildings within the period aforesaid, the county council shall (at the grantee's expenses, accept a surrender of the land comprised herein:

Provided further that if such notice as aforesaid shall be given twelve (12) months of the commencement of the term the county council shall refund to the grantee 50 per cent of the stand premium paid in respect of the land or (2) at any subsequent time prior to the expiration of the said building period, the county council shall refund to the grantee 5 per cent of the said stand premium. In the event of notice being given after the expiration of the said building period, no refund shall be made.

5. The land and buildings shall only be used for the purposes shown in schedule "A", "B" and "C".

6. The buildings shall not cover more than the percentage of the area of the land or lesser area as may be laid down by the local authority in its by-laws.

7. The land shall not be used for the purpose of any trade business which the local authority considers to be dangerous or offensive.

8. The grantee shall not subdivide the land without prior consent in writing of the county council and the Commissioner of Lands.

9. The grantee shall not sell, transfer, sublet, charge or part with the possession of the land or any part thereof or any buildings thereon except with the prior consent in writing of the county council and the Commissioner of Lands. No application for such consent (except in respect of a loan required for building purposes) will be considered until special condition No. 2 has been performed.

10. The grantee shall pay to the local authority on demand such sums as the local authority may estimate to be the proportionate cost of constructing all roads and drains and sewers serving or adjoining the land and shall on completion of such construction and the ascertainment of the actual proportionate cost either pay (within seven (7) days of demand) or be refunded the amount by which the actual proportionate cost exceeds or falls short of the amount paid as aforesaid.

11. The grantee shall from time to time pay to the local authority on demand such proportion of the cost of maintaining all roads and drains serving or adjoining the land as the local authority may assess.

12. Should the local authority at any time require the said roads to be constructed to a higher standard, the grantee shall pay the local authority on demand such proportion of the cost of such construction as the local authority may assess.

13. The grantee shall pay such rates, taxes, charges, duties, assessment or outgoings of whatever description as may be imposed, charged or assessed by any government or local authority upon the land or the buildings erected thereon including any contribution or other sum paid by the local authority or the county council in lieu thereof.

14. The county council or such person or authority as may be appointed for the purpose shall have the right to enter upon the land and lay and have access to water mains of all descriptions whether overhead or undercover or interfere with any existing alignments of main or service pipes or telephone or telegraph wires and electric mains.

15. The local authority reserves the right to revise the annual rental payable hereunder at the expiration of the thirty third (33rd) and sixty-sixth (66th) years of the term granted. Such rent will be at the rate of 4 per cent of the unimproved freehold value of the land as assessed by the Commissioner of Lands on behalf of the local authority.

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Kenya Meat Commission

Issue in dispute:

Working hours for the office messengers.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Kenya Meat Commission shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 27th September, 1984, and 6th May, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 15th September, 1983, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 16th January, 1984, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The claimants drew the attention of the court to the question of working hours of office messengers working for the respondents at Athi River near Nairobi. The claimants alleged that they are made to work more hours per day than is stipulated in the collective bargaining agreement with the respondents. They demanded that the 1½ hours per day granted as lunch break should be treated as overtime and paid as such. They pointed out that they were being made to work ten hours per working day, i.e. from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. It was therefore wrong to deny them their rightful time worked outside the scope provided for under freely negotiated agreement. The agreement also did not provide for staggering hours of work.

The respondents quoted their current terms and conditions of service collective bargaining agreement which stipulates that:

"The normal hours of work will be 45 hours per week in all stations except Mombasa where the hours of work will be 42 hours per week.

The commission reserves the right to distribute the hours of work within the day to suit exigencies of the service."

The respondents went on to say that as far back as 12th May, 1979, the respondents distributed hours of work, Monday to Friday, as follows:

Administration	} from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
Accounts

Personnel	

Office messengers, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Lunch break for management staff, 12.45 p.m. to 2 p.m.

Lunch break for office messengers, 12.45 p.m. to 2 p.m.

The respondents further stated that on 26th April, 1979, the commission's factory canteen in charge was directed to ensure that all office messengers were to be served meals between 12.45 p.m. to 2 p.m. It is therefore baseless for the claimants to demand overtime payment during the period they are having meals and are away from work.

The respondents pointed out that the messengers in question work 43 hours and 45 minutes per week instead of the agreed 45 hours.

The court has given serious thought to this matter and has come to the conclusion that the lunch break of 1 hour and 15 minutes gives the employees in question a break rest from actual work and they are not therefore entitled to be paid overtime during that period.

The court further finds that the respondents are not contravening the relevant clause in the collective agreement. The claimants demand is rejected.

Issues in dispute:

Deduction of workers' wages without legal requirements.

Clocking allowance.

Sliding scales.

Closing master-roll as opposed to 10th.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Securicor Kenya Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 13th February and 15th March, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 18th May, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 16th August, 1984, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

This dispute affects some 3,947 unionizable employees scattered through the respondents' twelve branches in Kenya. The respondents are in fact the managing agent of four separate companies namely:

Securicor Cash in Transit Kenya Limited

Securicor Alarms Kenya Limited.

Securicor Courier Kenya Limited.

Securicor Guards Kenya Limited.

The parties to this dispute are governed by the Regulation of Wages (Protective Security Services) Council Order. The council normally submit their proposals on minimum wages and conditions of employment of the minister who fixes minimum terms and conditions of employment in the industry. The current terms and conditions of service are contained in the Legal Notice No. 246 dated 28th October, 1983. These regulations are to be read in conjunction with the other labour laws of Kenya. The move to set up the council was taken when there was a total breakdown in this industry of the free collective bargaining system.

The council having been established, it was expected that parties to this arrangement would benefit from following the laid-down machinery for settling disputes. The claimants however, in their opening submissions, have severely criticized the respondents for lack of co-operation and understanding when dealing with the workers problems. The court would like to urge the parties to make it their concern to foster industrial peace that would increase productivity in their industry and the economy of the country as a whole. Given goodwill from both sides, the industry should be able to operate without major interruptions.

DEDUCTIONS OF WORKERS' WAGES WITHOUT LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

During the very vigorous submissions made by the claimants, the court was told that the respondents have exploited the Employment Act (Cap. 226, section 6 (1) (b)) to the extent that deductions have been effected without proper and thorough investigations being done first. At times dismissals have been applied without exercising the warning procedure where appropriate. They have further claimed that the respondents have taken unwarranted punitive measures against claimants' members since there are adequate insurance covers taken by the respondents and their clients to meet these eventualities. A case of deductions amounting to KSh. 24,000 concerning a Mr. Mwelli was raised as a proof of unfair deduction from the workers' wages.

The respondents in their reply argued that all deductions made arising from losses from their clients premises while the guard was on duty were first investigated and were considered on their own merits. The claimants have normally been at liberty to challenge such deductions. The respondents have confirmed

that deductions made have been strictly in accordance with the legal provision of Cap. 226 section 6 (1) (b) which stipulates that:

"An employer may deduct from the wages of his employee a reasonable amount for any damage done to, or loss of, any property lawfully in the possession or custody of the employer occasioned by the wilful default of the employee."

The respondents have denied any arbitrary deductions without giving the workers a chance to defend themselves. In fact, of the cases claimants have referred to the ministry for decision, it was found that none of the deductions were applied unfairly. For example, cases of thefts in 1974 and 1975 were paid by the insurance companies and the guards escaped without being called upon to pay. In all cases the parties have been invited to conciliation meetings where agreements have been reached, and, only on proven cases of negligence the respondents have made deductions from employees' wages.

The court has examined the arguments put forward by both parties and is satisfied that the respondents are within the legal provisions to deduct wages from the workers arising from their negligence leading to loss of property placed under their care. The court has noted that there is already machinery on *ad hoc* basis allowing an aggrieved worker to defend himself but the court feels the system required strengthening. The court rules that an investigating committee composed of both parties must be set up immediately to deal with these cases whenever they arise and their decisions on matters of deduction should be referred to the respondents for action. The said investigating committee should be chaired alternately by a representative of the claimants, and the respondents and it should compose of not less than four members. The court rejects the proposal by the claimants to refer every case of such loss to a court of law for adjudication. This, the court feels would not be in the best interest of both parties as it would take a long time before such cases are dispensed with.

CLOCKING ALLOWANCE

The claimants strongly submitted that about six other security firms pay this allowance and the claimants saw no reason for them being denied such benefits by the respondents. They contended that it was in force in the previous agreements but disappeared with the introduction of the Legal Notice No. 246 published on 28th October, 1983, which brought in the Wages Regulations (Protective Security Services) Council Order into force. The claimants argued that a guard assigned to watch property and to punch the clock is doing two jobs as opposed to a worker who has no clock. They considered punching the clock to be a wearisome task.

The respondents on the other hand felt that clocking system enables them to check on the workers movement in and around the property he guards. It therefore forms part and parcel of his duty that he is paid for and they fail to see the merits for paying such an allowance.

The court has carefully analysed the arguments advanced by both parties especially the fact that the wages council rejected this allowance and instead supported the enhancement of the dog handling allowance. The court has carefully considered this issue and has decided to reject the claimants' demand.

SLIDING SCALE

The claimants stated that they had sliding scales before the establishment of the 1983 revised salaries for this industry through the Wages Council Order. The respondents discontinued this benefit on the commencement of the Wages Council Order. This was contrary to what was done by other security companies such as Factory Guards, for example, who had continued with the sliding scales. The amounts of long service award varied with workers' years of service.

The respondents, however, argued that sliding scales which were basically a long service compensation were replaced by a much more rewarding gratuity scheme which is calculated at 15 days wages for each completed year of service.

The respondents urged the court to consider that the radio alarm system is already replacing many Kenyan workers and that any additional expenditure may force the respondents' clients to cancel their contracts in favour of radio alarm service which, although capital intensive in content, is more efficient and reliable. They further submitted that paying gratuity plus long service would be a double compensation and would prove expensive and consequently price them out of the market. In addition to the above benefits, the claimants get N.S.S.F. contributions at the retirement age to which the respondents contribute.

The court notes that from 1977 the respondents employees enjoyed the following sliding scales:

KSh. Increase	
Over 5 years	10
Over 10 years	20
Over 15 years	30

After careful consideration of all the submissions, the court awards that the sliding scale in respect of workers with more than 15 years' service only should be reinstated with effect from the 1st of the month following the court award. They should, however, not be paid any arrears. The claim in respect of workers with more than 5 years and 10 years is rejected.

CLOSING OF MASTER ROLL

The claimants submitted that in the past master roll was closed on 26th of each month, and overtime and other allowances were paid at the end of the same month. The respondents instead decided to introduce a new system whereby master-roll was closed on 10th of every month, this meant that all the allowances and overtime worked during the month were paid at the end of the following month. The claimants argued that the new system inconvenienced them and altered their financial plans for the month. They argued that they could forget some allowances and overtime due to length of time and demanded that the old system be restored.

The respondents explained that they have 12 branches employing some 4,000 employees and unionizable personnel are all paid in cash twice monthly. Which meant that normal wages which do not vary are paid out regularly. But the various allowances in respect of such a large establishment must reach the personnel section on 11th of the following month. These have to be checked thoroughly and properly coded and finally submitted to the computer section for processing by 18th of the month. After this step, the figures are again checked and corrected, then the final result is computer printed ready for distribution to the respective branches for payment before the end of that month.

The respondents argued that due to this elaborate mechanized system, it is not possible to close the master-roll earlier than 10th of each month covering all allowances from 11th of the previous month. It is virtually impossible to close the master-roll later than 10th of each month and pay wages at the end of each month under the present centralized accounting system of the respondents.

The court having considered the submissions advanced by the parties finds that due to distance involved in collecting and checking the information from the branches, and feeding the same information to the centralized accounting system, and the great need for accuracy required in order to avoid disappointment to workers when figures are done in a hurry, the court agrees with the respondents method of paying various allowances. The court further observes that once wages have been paid monthly the allowances must be carefully scrutinized as they vary from time to time. The inconvenience, the court admits, was definitely experienced by the claimants when the system was first introduced, but once the cycle of the arrears payments has been established then there is no disadvantage suffered by any workers.

The court concludes that it is in the interest of both parties that an accurate accounting of benefits earned and deductions made is maintained.

After careful consideration of all the submissions, the court rejects the claimants demands.

THE Kenya Union of Journalists shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Publishers, i.e. Nation Newspapers Ltd. and the Standard Ltd., shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 5th and 6th March, 1985, and 10th and 17th April, 1985, and the court relied on both their written and verbal submissions. In addition, the claimants called one (1) witness Philip Wangalwa to give evidence on oath.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 6th July, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 7th September, 1984, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties previous two-year period collective agreement became effective on 1st April, 1980, and expired on 31st March, 1982. In order to revise the said agreement the claimants made and forwarded their proposals to respondents on 25th October, 1983, and counter-proposals were received from the respondents on 22nd June, 1984, at the conciliation level. It is evidently clear that about five-and-half (5½) months elapsed before the parties could sit down for negotiation due to disagreement on the level of representation at their joint meetings. This kind of development implies that the parties industrial relations machinery is not functioning well, and an attempt should be made to improve it at all costs. The court would like to point out that the parties should get down to the real business without arguing on legal technicalities like who should represent whom and at what stage.

In the process of hearing this dispute, the parties attempted to castigate each other for thwarting the laid down negotiating procedures which caused prolonged delay before the dispute could be forwarded to the Industrial Court for arbitration. On one hand, the claimants vehemently objected to the respondents action of including the Kenya Federation of Employers senior officer(s) whereas they had not exhausted discussion at Ltd. and Standard Ltd. On the other hand, the respondents strongly argued that, according, to the parties recognition agreement level of representation any party is free to bring in representative(s) at any level. The court has in a number of cases expressed profound concern over the state of affairs about journalists being denied salary increases at the right time through unnecessary delays in negotiating collective agreement(s). Even after this court award, the parties' next two-year agreement is due to expire on 31st March, 1986. The court therefore hopes that the parties will soon sign a two-year agreement covering the period between 1st April, 1984 and 31st March, 1986, to ameliorate the cost burden of back-dating and compensate journalists for inflation after this court award has been announced and implemented.

The major issues in this particular dispute are salaries, housing allowance and annual leave and the parties put up very strong arguments which primarily will affect the rest of the issues in terms of overall total labour cost for the two year period.

Salaries:

The claimants demanded salary increases of 50 per cent for those journalists within the salary scales and 38 per cent for those journalists beyond the salary scales for the two-year period. This demand was based on the fact that the cost of living indexes had astronomically risen thereby eroding the journalists' purchasing power. In this connection, the claimants

argued that according to Wage Guidelines above. In brief, the entitled to wage compensation as indicated above. In brief, the claimants are demanding full compensation for those journalists within the scales and three-quarter (¾) for those journalists beyond the scales.

The respondents accused the claimants of being stubborn and quite unco-operative during preliminary negotiations. This negative attitude against the respondents by the claimants eventually culminated in the long list of sixteen (16) issues in dispute. In this respect, the respondents called upon the claimants to re-examine their industrial relations with the respondents with a prime objective to improving their industrial relations machinery for the betterment of their members.

The respondents further argued that the claimants were over compensated in the previous collective agreement by 28 per cent which is a by-product of addition of 11 per cent first year and 12 per cent second year, subtracted from the last increases during 1st April, 1980, to 1st April, 1984, of 51 per cent or $(12+11)-51=28$. In this regard, the respondents contended that there was justification for a nil award on this issue among others but in the spirit of improving their strained industrial relations have offered an average wage increase of 10.2 per cent and 4.2 per cent for the first and second year, respectively.

The court requested the Division of Manpower Planning and Development (D.M.P.D.) to carry out investigations because some of the issues were affected by the wages guidelines. A detailed analysis was carried out by the D.M.P.D. and this analysis revealed that the average maximum compensation ceiling for the price increases under the current wages guideline of 1982, i.e. three-quarter (¾) of the rise in the consumer price index from April, 1980, to March, 1982, would be 27 per cent. However, if the claimants' demand of full compensation is considered, the figure would be an average of 36 per cent.

After careful consideration of all the submission made, the court awards the following salary increases based on the present salary structure as at 31st March, 1982:

The court further awards salary increases of 10 per cent for the first year and 7 per cent for the second year for those journalists beyond the above salary scales.

Housing:

The court notes that the parties salaries had been consolidated up to April, 1980, when the parties acknowledged the necessity of having a separate housing allowance. This acknowledgement is contained in clause 4 of the previous collective agreement which states that "the parties agreed that this issue be discussed in future negotiations".

The claimants have demanded a housing allowance ranging between KSh. 1,500 and KSh. 2,500 per month depending on salary positions. It was further argued that the issue of deconsolidation does not arise because the issue was sorted out in 1980-1982 during which period the claimants forewent it in anticipation to being granted a separate housing allowance in the next collective agreement. The claimants further pointed out that the court should consider the type of houses the journalists occupy in Nairobi which have a rental cost ranging between KSh. 2,000 and KSh. 5,000.

The respondents have strongly disagreed with the claimants contention that the parties deconsolidated the salaries in the 1980-1982 collective agreement. In fact, the parties agreed to discuss the housing allowance issue in future negotiations and due to an impasse during their negotiation process, no such discussion had taken place. In addition, the respondents contended that the claimants are some of the privileged group of professionals earning a monthly salary ranging between KSh. 3,000 and 10,000 and they should be encouraged to buy their own houses according to government policy guideline on this particular issue.

The court notes that the Wages Guideline IV b (ii) reads:

"Where deconsolidation of consolidated wage is deemed necessary, the housing element shall be deemed to be no more than 15 per cent of the prevailing minimum wage for a particular group covered."

Having given due consideration to all the submissions made on this issue, the court awards a separate housing allowance of KSh. 350 for those journalists earning less than KSh. 4,000 per month and KSh. 550 for those journalists earning above KSh. 4,000 per month, with effect from 1st April, 1982.

Annual Leave:

The claimants have asked that the current annual leave entitlement of 32 consecutive days should be hiked to 35 working days. In reality, the claimants are demanding an additional seven (7) working days. After careful consideration of this demand, the court has decided to award 30 working days, with effect from 1st April, 1982.

Leave Travel Allowance:

The claimants demanded that the present leave travel allowance of KSh. 1,000 be increased by KSh. 700 to add up to KSh. 1,700. This allowance should be paid to journalists proceeding on their annual leave.

The respondents did submit in court that there has been unprecedented leave travel allowance increases in the past ten years ranging from KSh. 100 in 1972 to KSh. 1,000 in 1980. This implies an annual average boost of about KSh. 100.

The court has given due consideration to all the submissions made in respect to this issue, and awards that the present leave travel allowance of KSh. 1,000 should be increased to KSh. 1,200 to be paid to the journalists once a year when proceeding on annual leave. This award will be deemed to have come into effect on 1st April, 1982.

Medical Treatment Scheme for Family:

The claimants submitted that the medical treatment scheme be extended to cover their families as well as it is applied to individual journalists. They have based their arguments on the fact that when a member of the family falls ill, maybe a wife or a child, the journalist is obliged to take the member to public hospitals and queue up for long hours instead of working. Consequently, this has an adverse impact on the journalist's productivity level which in turn is reflected in the respondents reduced profit margins.

The court notes that the parties at their own negotiating level agreed to establish the scheme according to clause 1 of the previous agreement. This clause stated as follows:

"The parties having discussed the issue at length agreed that there is need to establish the scheme but left the matter in abeyance for discussion in future negotiations."

The respondents submitted that increased membership under this scheme is likely to have serious financial implications for them unless carefully planned and given the fact that the scheme involves third parties like insurance organizations, tripartite

agreement becomes necessary and particularly a bilateral agreement must be worked between the respondents and the insurance firm(s) to establish financial liabilities.

Having taken into account all the submissions, the court directs the parties to discuss this issue at their own level which they have failed to do so far.

Mileage Allowance:

On this issue, the claimants have demanded the current mileage allowance of KSh. 2.55 per kilometre or KSh. 4.08 per mile be increased to KSh. 4.70 per kilometre or 7.52 per mile. This demand is based on the petrol price increases totaling up to about 53 per cent between 1980 and 1982 or for a two-year period.

The respondents have offered to hike the mileage allowance to KSh. 3.75 per kilometre or KSh. 6 per mile.

The court has carefully considered all arguments advanced by both parties and has decided to award KSh. 4 per kilometre or KSh. 6.40 per mile.

Overnight Subsistence Allowance:

The claimants demand under this item is based on categories as follows:

- (a) KSh. 250 first year and KSh. 270 for second year.
- (b) KSh. 175.
- (c) (i) Breakfast KSh. 30.
- (ii) Lunch KSh. 75.
- (iii) Tea KSh. 15.
- (iv) Dinner KSh. 75.

In response to this demand, the respondents have offered the following rates:

- (a) KSh. 160 first year and KSh. 170 for the second year.
- (b) KSh. 100.
- (c) (i) Breakfast KSh. 17.50.
- (ii) Lunch KSh. 45.
- (iii) Tea KSh. 12.
- (iv) Dinner KSh. 45.

After careful consideration of the demand and offer, the court has decided to award the above rates as proposed by the respondents.

Training:

Under this issue, the claimants would like any journalist proceeding on training up to degree level to be entitled to full salary. In addition, the respondents should contribute to his training in a manner called for in line with the provision of the pertinent scholarship.

However, the respondents have argued that training on micro-economic level is directly related to the respondents business. To this end, the respondents have the prerogative of establishing training programmes according to their manpower requirements and recognition agreement provisions related to this particular issue. In fact, the respondents have all along trained its journalists in local and overseas institutions of higher learning up to degree level.

Taking into account all the submissions made during the hearing, the court directs the parties to discuss the nature and scope of training programme for all its journalists. The court is not inclined to make any award in this issue.

Suspension:

As regards this issue, the claimants submitted that suspension for gross misconduct should not be less than three (3) months with full pay. If the journalist is later on terminated, he should be paid all accrued terminal benefits according to the provisions of the existing collective agreement.

The court has given careful consideration to this demand and finds that the current provision(s) of clause 20, i.e. warning procedure and suspension is adequate and hence should remain unaltered. The court rejects the claimants demand under this item.

Transfer/Disturbance Allowance:

The claimants would like the disturbance allowance to be hiked from 30 days to 90 days due to hardship entailed in locating houses in our urban areas. To support their case, the claimants called a witness who adduced evidence to the effect that availability of houses is a subtle problem. The witness, Philip Wangalwa, currently deputy news editor of Nairobi Newspaper Ltd. was a key witness and gave evidence under oath that he was transferred to Kisumu in 1979 and for two-and-half (2½) years he lived in various lodges due to inadequate disturbance allowance.

The witness was cross-examined by the respondents on all the issues raised by him with an objective of ascertaining the credibility of the allegations. In the respondents opinion, the witness absolutely failed to prove anything in court in spite of the fact that the journalist was never transferred to Kisumu as alleged. The point is that the witness had worked in Kisumu on commission and he was put on permanent employment in 1979 and remained in the same town.

In view of the above observations, there appear to be no extenuating factors to warrant an additional increase of transfer allowance of 60 days over and above the current 30 days. The court therefore rejects the claimants demand and the present 30 days continue in force unaltered. However, the parties are directed to discuss the issue during the next collective agreement negotiations.

Protection while at Work:

The claimants did submit that the respondents should insure journalists while at work. It was further stated that according to clause 25 of the previous collective agreement, the parties agreed that:

"The employees who do not fall under the Workmen's Compensation Act, shall be insured by the management, details will be worked out by the union and the management."

In reply, the respondents have contended that this issue should be linked to number 12, i.e. pension/contributory provident, which is in operation at present. In addition, the respondents are ready to discuss any details of the insurance scheme with the claimants at their own level.

All facts having been taken into accounts, the court directs the parties to discuss this issue as agreed in the previous agreement without further delay. It is up to the claimants to initiate discussions on this item.

Pension/Contributory:

As regard this issue, the claimants have submitted that in addition to the existing scheme, the parties agreed in principle to work out details of this scheme.

At present the respondents have the following schemes:

Nation Newspaper Ltd. operates a voluntary contribution provident fund since April, 1984.

The Standard Ltd. operates a non-contributory fund since 1980.

The court would like to advise the parties that any type of pension scheme must be astutely planned with far sightedness to avert financial catastrophe to all the parties involved and particularly to the beneficiaries. In light of this observation, the court therefore directs the parties to discuss all aspects of the type and operations of such scheme. Here again it is up to the claimants to initiate discussions on this item.

Hours of Work, Overtime, Shifts and Off-duty Compensation:

Since the respondents are operating shifts, the claimants are demanding the following:

Provide transport for those journalists on 6.30 p.m. shift plus tea and dinner.

Pay for extra tea, dinner and overnight allowance for those journalists leaving duty after 12 midnight.

Payment of extra responsibility allowance of KSh. 200 per late shift arising from under-staffing.

In addition to the above, the claimants demanded the payment of KSh. 400 or one day's salary equivalent whichever is greater to the journalists called upon to work on their off-duty.

The respondents submitted that overnight allowance is currently paid to journalists assigned to duties outside and within publishers newsroom according to clause 15 of the previous agreement. The fact, the respondents argued, that journalists who work at night do not carry any extra responsibilities because they are only on standby for any possible eventualities. In addition, the journalists do not have absolute responsibility in the newsroom because all their decisions are subject to ratification by the chief editor who is the overall boss over what transpires in the newsroom.

On the issue off-duty compensation, the respondents have strongly argued against the claimants demand of KSh. 400 to be paid to journalists called upon to work on off-duty days. This is in contradiction to clause 3, i.e. hours of work and overtime of previous collective agreement which partly stipulates that "No overtime is paid but days in lieu are granted".

After careful consideration of all the facts, the court directs the parties to discuss these issues properly during the next round of negotiations. As for now these demands stand rejected.

Taking Down Correspondents Stories:

Under this item, the claimants have demanded an extra KSh. 80 per story received. This demand is based on the fact that taking down correspondents stories is a secretarial job and is not part and parcel of the journalist's work.

However, the respondents have strongly argued that taking down correspondents stores is part and parcel of the journalists work because each journalist is obliged to type his own story, including editing it himself.

After careful consideration of the parties submission, the court has come to the conclusion that taking down correspondents' stories appears to be part and parcel of a journalist's training and work. In this regard the court rejects the claimants demand.

Bureaux Heads and Responsibility Allowance:

On this issue, the claimants have demanded that all heads of bureaux should be paid a responsibility allowance of KSh. 500 a week for all expenses incurred without accounting for expenditure. In addition, the bureaux head(s) should receive comparable salaries to the salaries of features/sports editors.

On the other hand, the respondents have contended that the decision as to who should hold what post(s) is their prerogative. In this connection, the item is even not negotiable under the parties industrial relations machinery according to parties recognition agreement. It was further submitted that the respondents have only one (1) bureau, i.e. Mombasa, but Kisumu, Nakuru and Nyeri, are termed duty stations and therefore the issue of bureau head does not arise. Having taken into account all the submissions, the court directs that the parties should apply their minds realistically to this matter as no serious dialogue appears to have taken place between them.

Bureaux and Equipment:

The claimants' demand on this issue was that the respondents should pay all subsistence allowances to journalists sent on assignments to places without bureaux. Furthermore, the respondents should pay the journalist(s) overnight allowance per day until working conditions are improved to comparable standards as those at the head office in Nairobi.

The respondents have advanced strong arguments against the claimants demands which are intended to usurp the respondents prerogative to manage their enterprises. To this end the respondents have maintained that the creation and equipping of bureaux is the sole right of the employer but not the employees.

The court notes that the journalists work is unique and interesting given the fact that journalism involves adventurism in collecting and collating stories outside the offices. Having done his field work, the journalist definitely requires a reasonably furnished and equipped office to write and edit his stories before submitting them to the head office. In view of the foregoing observations, the court has decided that this particular issue should be exhaustively discussed by the parties during negotiations of the next collective agreement with an objective of at least improving working conditions of journalists on assignments. The court feels it is not proper for it to make an award on this issue.

Last but not least, the court notes that the parties have always lagged behind in negotiating their collective agreements hitherto and the next collective agreement, i.e. April, 1984, March, 1986, is already one (1) year behind. As already pointed out in this award, that improved industrial relations between the parties will facilitate the signing of future agreements. In turn, this will ease the respondents cost burden resulting from back-dating of agreements and the journalists will also be timely compensated for erosion of their purchasing power due to the rising cost of living or inflation.

Having made this cautionary note, the court hopes that the parties will expedite their negotiations and sign the next collective agreement in due course.

Formal opposition should not be lodged until after reasonable notice has been given by letter to the applicant for registration so as to afford him an opportunity of withdrawing his application before the expense of preparing the notice of opposition is incurred. Failure to give such notice will be taken into account in considering any application by an opponent for an order for costs, if the opposition is uncontested by the applicant.

Where it is stated in the advertisement of the applicant that the mark upon its registration, is to be limited to certain colours, the colours are, as far as possible, indicated in the accompanying representations of the mark in the usual heraldic manner.

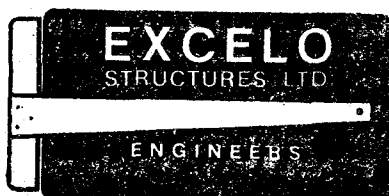

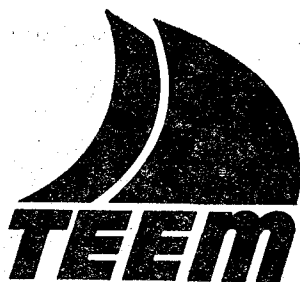

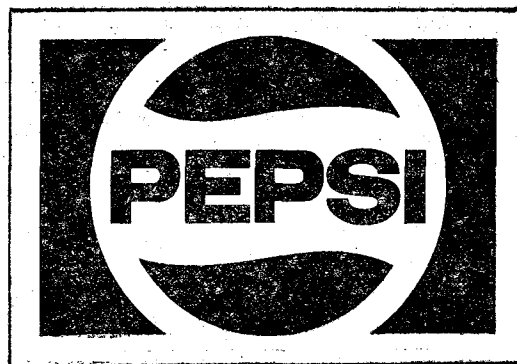

Registered water kiosk operators, the registered water kiosk operators will be buying water from the City Commission at one shilling and thirty-two cents (KSh. 1.32) per 1,000 litres or six shillings (KSh. 6) per 1,000 gallons and they in turn shall retail the water at ten cents (10 cents) per *debe* (a *debe* being on 18 litres or 4 gallons container).
