1. *Title*.—ASSISTANT CO-ORDINATOR OF PROGRAMMES RELATING TO THE STATUS OF WOMEN.

Post No.—BEP-243.

Category and level.—Professional category (P-4).

Organizational location.—Bureau of studies and programming.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the supervision of the co-ordinator of programmes relating to the status of women, the incumbent will be required to assist the co-ordinator in the following duties—

(1) participate from the very beginning in the preparation of the programme activities for improving the status of women and follow up their execution;

(2) assume responsibility for organizing and running the intersectoral committee for co-ordination established under the auspices of the Committee on Intersectoral Co-operation (CIC), in particular by promoting, within the secretariat, all measures conducive to the advancement of the programme activities;

(3) co-ordinate the preparation of all documents, reports, etc., intended for the governing bodies of the organization;

(4) set up and organize a network of correspondents (staff of regional offices or regional advisers) to be responsible, in each region, for maintaining liaison with the regional bodies of the United Nations and, if necessary, with other organizations in the region, in order to ensure the effective implementation of the programme activities;

(5) co-ordinate the preparation of all contributions made by Unesco to the work of the United Nations and its organs.

Qualifications and experience required:

(a) University degree in one of the organization's fields of competence, preferably in the social sciences or education.

(b) Knowledge of problems relating to the status of women, acquired in the performance of professional duties, or special interest in such matters attested, in particular, by organizational activity or research work.

(c) Professional experience gained, at least partly, in an international organization or in a position connected with an international organization.

(d) Perfect command of French or English, with a good working knowledge of the other language; knowledge of other working languages of the organization would be an advantage.

Salary and allowances.—Initial appointment will be at P-4 grade with a net annual salary equivalent to US\$32,605 (US\$30,275 if without dependants), plus the prescribed allowances: post adjustment, variable according to grade and step depending upon the cost of living at the duty station and the dollar exchange rate, at present US\$3,728 for staff members with dependants (US\$3,462 if without dependants); family allowance of US\$700 for each dependent child (if there is no dependent spouse, this indemnity is not payable in respect of the first dependent child). Participation in the United Nations Joint Staff Pension Fund and Unesco Medial Benefit Fund is compulsory and contributions to these funds will be deducted monthly from salary. At least 30 per cent of the total net annual salary plus the prescribed allowances is to be paid in the currency of the duty station, the balance being paid in one other currency. These emoluments are normally exempt from all direct taxation. Income tax on such remuneration, if levied, is reimbursed in accordance with staff regulations and rules. Travel is provided for the staff member and his family (spouse and children recognized as dependants). In addition, Unesco contributes towards the cost of installation at the duty station and the education of dependent children. On separation from Unesco, a repatriation grant is paid.

2. *Title*.—SPECIALIST IN PRE-SERVICE TEACHER EDUCATION.

Category and level.—Professional category (P-4).

Duty station.—UNRWA/UNESCO Department of Education, Amman, Jordan.

Duties and responsibilities.—Under the supervision of the chief, teacher and higher education division, and in close co-operation with his local counterparts and other members of the Unesco-seconded team of specialists, and with the administrative and teaching staff working in the UNRWA/Unesco education system, the incumbent will—

(1) help to supervise and guide the teaching of the professional studies (education, psychology and practice teaching) in the UNRWA/Unesco pre-service teacher training centres;

(2) help integrate the theoretical and the practical aspects of the teacher training programmes;

(3) help co-ordinate the work of the instructors attached to these centres;

(4) help gear the training programme, as a whole, to the needs of the UNRWA/Unesco schools;

(5) help introduce teaching methods used in the experimental classes of practice schools to the other UNRWA/Unesco schools;

(6) assist the division in the development of its programme, especially in the fields of education and psychology;

(7) assist in the co-ordination of in-service and pre-service training programmes;

(8) assist in the organization of summer courses, seminars and workshops for teachers;

(9) undertake such other duties as may be assigned to him by the chief of division, the supervisor and the director of the department.

(a) University degree, preferably in education and psychology.

(b) Experience in planning and implementing teacher training programmes.

(c) Considerable teaching experience in schools and in teacher training institutions.

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Embu District Co-operative Union Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Redundancy of 40 employees.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Embu District Co-operative Union Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 6th April and 2nd May, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 11th July, 1983, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 25th October, 1983, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner. The respondents are a registered co-operative union established under the Co-operative Societies Act. They have a recognition and collective agreement with the claimants regulating terms and condition of employment of the respondents' unionizable employees. The last agreement became effective from 1st September, 1979, and ran for two years. Also in operation was a supplementary agreement covering seasonal workers. The parties signed the latter agreement on 17th July, 1981, covering the said seasonal employees.

The present dispute affects 40 alleged seasonal employees covered by the supplementary agreement. The introduction of this agreement was as a result of meetings between the parties which found it necessary to introduce a supplementary agreement. The claimants in fact initiated the idea of a separate agreement after it was found necessary to lay off some 68 nursery workers in 1978.

After two years the respondents discussed with the claimants their plan to lay off the so called seasonal workers, on grounds of old age and other economic factors. The claimants totally disagreed with the respondents and reported a trade dispute which is now before this court. The respondents are mainly engaged in the coffee farming and have established nurseries for coffee seedlings for their members. Later they diversified into other nursery activities such as horticulture and vegetable seedlings for sale to members and non-members. This move forced the respondents to retain the services of the "seasonal Workers" longer than the actual season lasted.

On 31st May, 1982, the respondents retired 40 employees some having attained the age of 55 years. Those below 55 years of age were served with letters terminating their services effective from 1st June, 1982. The respondents contended that they were right in exercising the provisions of the supplementary agreement which empowers them to terminate services of this class of workers.

The claimants have vigorously argued that parties collective agreement does not provide for retirement on attainment of 55 years of age. Even if they did attain the ages in question the respondents never produced evidence of proof of old age. Those alleged to have been temporarily employed had put in continuous services ranging from three to seven years and could not therefore be classified as seasonal workers.

In view of the foregoing reasons the claimants maintained that the respondents action to terminate the services of 40 employees was in violation of the provision of the Trade Dispute Act on redundancy, and clause 18 (e) of the parties collective agreement. The claimants demanded (a) payment for notices as provided for under clause 17 of the parties agreement, (b) severance pay at the rate of 15 days pay for each year of service under clause 18 (b) of the parties collective agreement and (c) maximum compensation for wrongful termination of their services.

The claimants further argued that the said supplementary agreement was only applicable to temporary workers such as those in Kenya Cannery and Cashewnuts Industries where they employ seasonal workers during peak periods and that this agreement never applied to those who had served for 17 years

and over. On the other hand casuals can only be so affected if they work on daily basis but if they remain in employment for three months then they should be absorbed on permanent employment.

The respondents have submitted that they have properly complied with the provisions of the supplementary agreement which clearly states that workers in coffee nurseries are "seasonal workers" no matter how long they work. They emphasized that they (the respondents) do not employ any other types of seasonal workers apart from these nursery employees. The reason for introducing the supplementary agreement was simply to provide for an orderly system of laying off coffee nursery workers. Further, under paragraph two of this agreement, a seasonal worker remains temporary even if he works continuously. He could, however, only qualify for an annual leave after working continuously for a period of twelve months.

The respondents maintain that the only requirement under this agreement was to give a nursery worker seven days' notice or pay in lieu of notice should he remain in service for a period of three months. They argued that the 40 employees were laid off because there was no more work for them and were in excess of the respondents' establishment. For example, in April, 1982, there were 111 employees and they had to be reduced to 68 in August that year. This measure was taken to reduce the respondents heavy losses after the Commissioner for Co-operatives inquiry into the financial affairs of the respondents which revealed that great losses the union incurred was attributed to seasonal workers' expenditure and they were ordered to lay off surplus employees. The main reason in earlier days for setting up coffee nurseries was for replacement of dry coffee trees but with the passing of time, the respondents found the demand for coffee seedlings in the district and elsewhere to have steadily declined hence they could not retain the services of those aged and unproductive workers. These workers had no training so the respondents could not deploy them elsewhere.

The respondents have challenged the claimants figure of 40 employees laid off and maintain that only 39 workers have been laid off under the supplementary agreement.

The respondents have pleaded their inability to pay any additional cost arising from this dispute due to their poor financial standing. To support their case they have produced their accounts showing losses for the past three years of 1980 to 1982.

The court in consideration of the parties submissions notes that the respondents allege that there was only one nursery worker who was empowered to recruit seasonal workers. It finds it very unusual for the respondents to allow their employees in charge of coffee nurseries to employ workers far in excess of the number needed, and allowing them to work continuously for periods ranging from one year to fourteen years. No season would last that long, and the court finds that although a "Seasonal Agreement" was signed between the parties the duration of the season was not clearly defined and understood by the parties. The claimants, for example, understood the agreement to mean those employed during peak periods of coffee picking and cashewnut and pineapple harvesting and were to be laid off immediately the season ended. The court finds that workers falling under this agreement were definitely exploited by the respondents by retaining their services continuously for up to fourteen years without absorbing them permanently.

Although the agreement provided for financial benefit to be paid to these workers on termination, the provisions of the clause was never enforced at the end of the season as expected. Instead seasonal workers were left to continue working indefinitely as any other permanent employee, and were paid monthly.

The court finds that where a worker was able to earn an annual leave and qualify for retirement benefits due to old age then he naturally fell within the category of permanent workers and must be treated as such. In view of the ambiguous nature of the supplementary agreement and subsequent failure to follow the provisions of clauses 17 and 18 of the main agreement, the court finds that the 39 employees suffered a wrongful termination. The court is satisfied that claimants had proved that these workers were not at all temporary considering their number of years of service. As such they were fully entitled to those benefits enjoyed by their counterparts covered by the main agreement. The court accordingly awards that the respondents should pay these workers their dues under clause 17 of the main collective agreement less what they have already been paid. The court makes no award of compensation for wrongful dismissal. In case the parties have any difficulty in working out their dues they should seek the assistance of D. N. Gakuya of D.M.P.D.

The court further directs that the dues of these workers, should be paid to them in six equal instalments commencing three months after the date of the court award.

Kirinyaga District Co-operative Union Ltd.

and

Kenya Union of Commercial, Food and Allied Workers

Issues in dispute:

Wages and wage increase.

Effective date and duration of the agreement.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial, Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Kirinyaga District Co-operative Union Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 28th May, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submission.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 6th June, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 28th December, 1984, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The respondents are a co-operative union registered under the Co-operative Societies Act (Cap. 490) and are made up of farmers co-operative societies in Kirinyaga District.

The claimants and the respondents had a collective agreement which expired on 30th September, 1982.

The claimants told the court that the respondents had been recalcitrant and had used delaying tactics and negative attitude not conducive to arriving at a compromise. The claimants further told the court as a result of this delay the expired agreement was registered by the court on 29th July, 1983, as RCA.

3. 178 of 1983, two years and ten months from the date it was supposed to be effective. The claimants stated that no negotiations had ever commenced without the claimants first having had to report the existence of the Trade Dispute to the Ministry of Labour. The claimants also informed the court that originally there were 32 issues in dispute and were eventually narrowed to the two issues with the assistance of the conciliator from the Ministry of Labour, and they went further to say that the last conciliation meeting took place on 31st May, 1984, and disagreement was recorded on these.

(1) *Wages and wage increase*

The claimants requested the court to award their members the following percentage increases:

- Low income group 37 per cent or 18.5 per cent for each of the two years.
- Middle income group 36.8 per cent or 18.4 per cent for each of the two years.
- Upper income group 29.3 per cent or 14.3 per cent for each of the two years.

(2) *Effective date and duration of the agreement*

The claimants requested the court to award the following:

- The effective date, 1st October, 1982.
- The agreement to run for a duration of 3 years.
- Each year should be catered for by a wage increase.

On the other hand the respondents did not counter most of the allegations labelled against them by the claimants regarding the delays but went straight ahead and gave their offer. The only argument advanced by the respondents was that delay was caused because the respondents being a co-operative union,

they had to call a special meeting to give them the mandate on negotiations. They told the court that counter proposals were therefore sent to the claimants on 13th October, 1983, and the parties held their first meeting on 19th October, 1983.

(1) *Salary and wages*

The respondents have offered the following minimum wages and annual increments:

(2) *General wage increases*

The respondents proposed wage increase of 5 per cent every year, they argued that the annual increment which they have paid their employees with effect from 1st October, 1982, 1st October, 1983, and 1st October, 1984, have partly compensated the employees for the rise in cost of living and because of financial constraint the respondent cannot afford any further increases.

(3) *Effective date and duration of the agreement*

The respondents are requesting the court to award the effective date to be 1st October, 1983, instead of 1st October, 1982, and that the agreement to last for three years instead of two years. They argued that the parties' previous agreement expired on 30th September, 1982, but was signed on 27th June, 1983.

After careful consideration of all the submissions by both parties the court awards the following:

The court endorses the basic rates and the annual increments offered by the respondents as set out hereinabove:

(a) Effective date will be 1st October, 1982.

(b) Wage increases—

(i) 1st October, 1982, 5 per cent on wages as at 30th September, 1982.

(ii) 1st October, 1983, 5 per cent on wages as at 30th September, 1983.

(ii) 1st October, 1983, 5 per cent on wages as at 30th September, 1984.

(c) Duration of the agreement be three years.

Parties:

Railways and Harbours Union (K)
and
Kenya Railways Corporation

Issue in dispute:

Unjustified/failure and or refusal by the Kenya Railways to pay 18 months' salary to J. G. Ochieng.

THE Railways and Harbours Union (K) shall hereinafter be reference to as the claimants and the Kenya Railways Corporation shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 22nd May, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The dispute was referred to the court by the Minister for Labour under section 8 of the Trade Disputes Act, on 21st August, 1984, together with the statutory certificates signed by him and the Labour Commissioner.

The grievant J. C. Ochieng was employed by the respondents in May, 1956, as a junior clerk. He progressed through the ranks, attaining the position of Yard Foreman NB III B in November, 1967. On 12th November, 1972, he was stationed at Kisumu Railway Station as the yard foreman. A consignment of 700 bags of sugar was booked from Miwani to Nairobi and loaded into two wagons. The wagons were moved to Kisumu for subsequent attaching to a through goods train to Nairobi. However, on 16th November, 1972, the wagons were found empty at Kisumu marshalling yard, their contents having mysteriously disappeared. As a result of police investigations Mr. Ochieng and seven others were arrested and charged before the court at Kisumu. Upon his arrest, Mr. Ochieng was interdicted from duty on 16th November, 1972, and later dismissed with effect from the day he was convicted, i.e. 29th March, 1973. Mr. Ochieng was imprisoned for five (5) years with ten strokes of the cane. Mr. Ochieng appealed to the High Court of Kenya and on 24th March, 1974, having been in prison for almost a year, his conviction by the lower court was quashed and sentence set aside.

The claimants contention is that the respondents had no right to dismiss Mr. Ochieng after conviction and before the appeal was heard as per staff regulation G. 9 (e) which reads:

"If criminal proceedings are instituted against an employee in any court no proceedings for the dismissal of such employee upon any grounds involved in the criminal charge will be taken until the conclusion of the criminal proceedings and the determination of any appeal therefrom. This does not, however, prohibit or restrict the power to interdict such an employee."

The claimants further claimed that Mr. Ochieng remained the employee of the respondents for the period he was in jail and also the 4 months that he was made to wait before the decision to reinstate him was taken and demanded for full pay. To support their stand the claimants used staff Regulations G. 9 (b), (c) and (e) which regulations govern procedures in case of an employee being charged before a court of law. They also produced documents from the Attorney-General's Chambers which gave an opinion on a trade dispute in 1973 which opinion allowed reinstatement and pay for the period the employee was in prison. The claimants accused the respondents of having bad motives in Mr. Ochieng's case and alleged that the respondents are negligent in handling their employees' disciplinary matters.

The respondents claimed to be one of the big and responsible employee of the respondents for the period he was in jail and better than many. The respondents argued that when Mr. Ochieng was arrested he was suspended as per the regulations, and he remained so suspended until he was convicted. The suspension remained in force for another 7 weeks when a dismissal letter was issued. The respondents said that they were not notified by Mr. Ochieng or his lawyer about the appeal. They pointed out that if they were notified of the appeal they would not have issued the dismissal letter. They admitted that they had subsequently reinstated Mr. Ochieng once they were officially satisfied that his conviction had been quashed and sentence set aside. The respondents pointed out that the 4 months that Mr. Ochieng stayed between his release and reinstatement was the period they were waiting for the high court's reply about this case as they wanted to know whether the conviction was quashed or the sentence was reduced. On

refusal to pay for the period Mr. Ochieng was in jail and the 4 months after his release, the respondents referred the court to the Employment Act, section 49 (1) (a) which states that no wages shall accrue during any term of imprisonment, and urged the court to dismiss the claimants' demand.

The court notes that the issue in this dispute is whether Mr. Ochieng should be paid his salary between the time of arrest, and reinstatement. The court finds that there are two separate periods for consideration, i.e. the period between arrest and subsequent release by the high court and the 4 months period between the release and reinstatement. The court is satisfied that neither Mr. Ochieng nor his lawyer had informed the respondent the appeal. The court finds the law governing the period he was in prison clear so, the court rejects the claimants demand for the period Mr. Ochieng was in prison. However, after careful consideration, the court finds that the respondents took too long to come to a decision to reinstate Mr. Ochieng after his appeal was allowed. The court finds that one month would have been a reasonable period for obtaining court records and coming to a decision. The court accordingly awards that Mr. Ochieng be paid 3 months' salary only.

Fox Theatres East Africa Ltd.

Issues in dispute:

Basic wage and increments.
House allowance.
Hours of work.
Annual leave.
Cashiers' liability.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as claimants and the Fox Theatres East Africa shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 6th and 7th June, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of dispute Form "A" dated 8th August, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court in December, 1984, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties entered into a recognition agreement sometime back and have since concluded several collective agreements. This dispute arose during parties negotiations to amend their collective agreement which was effective from 1st September, 1981 to 31st August, 1983. The parties agreed on most of the issues except the ones now before the court.

The respondents employ a labour force of 115 unionizable employees who are deployed in their various undertakings in Nairobi.

Basic wage and increments

The court notes that during the negotiations, the claimants demanded that the basic wage and increments be raised to compensate the cost of living. Their demand is for a 4 per cent increase or 20.5 per cent per year

The respondents submitted that their nature of business had been interfered with by the introduction of videos and that if they are made to pay high rates of salaries they may be forced out of business.

However, they, the respondents have offered wage increases of 8 per cent for groups A and B per year and 10 per cent for groups C, E and F per year.

The court finds that workers entitlement under the guidelines is 15.25 per cent per year. The respondents' offer would give the workers somewhat less than their entitlement under the guidelines.

After careful consideration of all the submissions, the court awards that the respondents' offer should be raised to 20 per cent per year for all groups and the court so awards.

On basic minimum wages, the court notes that the minimums have been revised with effect from 1st May, 1985, by the government. Since the demand was based on the previous General Wages Order, 1982, the court rules that the parties should revise the basic minimums in accordance with the new wages order. Except for this the court does not propose to alter the existing basic minimum wages.

House allowance

On this issue, the claimants are demanding a house allowance from KSh. 500 for lower paid employees to KSh. 800 for higher paid workers, due to high rents in the city.

The respondents have offered to increase the housing allowance from KSh. 125 by KSh. 50 due to instability of their business. The court awards KSh. 200 as house allowance to all the employees of the respondents.

Hours of work

The claimants under this issue demand less working hours than it is stipulated in their collective agreement they also want shifts to be rearranged as workers at present work for 2 hours in the morning, 2 hours from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m. and 2 hours after 9 p.m. The claimants pointed out that this kind of reporting on and off duty several times a day is depriving workers time to visit their houses the whole day and also makes them spend a lot of money on meals in town as they find it difficult to go home and back to town three times a day. The respondents pointed out that the hours of work in their collective agreement are less than the allowed hours of work per week by law and requested the court not to disturb the arrangements as they have been like that for a long time and have proved to be workable.

The court finds no reason to interfere with these arrangements as they have been like that since the respondents recognized the claimants several years ago. However, the court directs the parties to look into the shifts rearrangement demand during their next negotiations in order to find a workable solution. The court rejects the claimants' demand on this issue for the time being.

Annual leave

The claimants are demanding 27 consecutive days leave for employees with less than 5 years and 31 consecutive days excluding public holidays for employees with over 5 years service. The respondents stood by the collective agreement entitlement of 25 consecutive days for workers with less than 5 years' service and 27 consecutive days excluding public holidays for workers with over 5 years' service.

The court notes that under Regulations of Wages (General) Order, 1982, employees should be granted not less than 21 working days leave per year. The court awards an increase of one additional day on the present leave entitlement.

Cashiers' liability

The claimants strongly criticized the respondents on this issue. The claimants told the court that the respondents carry out stock-taking at month-end during which time surpluses and deficits are calculated. The claimants claimed that the respondents pocket the surpluses and at the same time make the cashiers pay for the deficits. The claimants prayed the court to order the respondents to offset the deficits against the surpluses.

The respondents argued that they do offset the deficits against the surpluses. The respondents told the court that they are trying to eliminate surpluses as they think it is a way of not being honest to patrons.

In considering this issue, the court wonders why should there be surpluses and deficits. The cashiers should be honest to the patrons at all times and give them proper change. The court finds no reason to amend the existing clause but in view of the respondents written submission as to the practice which they have adopted the court would like the respondents to stick to it.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of an A4 sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the *Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.*:

- (1) The *Kenya Gazette* contains notices of a general nature which do not affect legislation. They are therefore submitted to the Government Printer directly.
- (2) *Legislative Supplement* contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government. Because of this they must be submitted to the Government Printer through the office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction in the National Assembly.
- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of an A4 sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

"D.14.(1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
