Vacancies in the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting:

Lecturer Grade I (Information Training) (Four Posts) (K.I.M.C.) (No. 308/85)

Applicants should be holders of a university degree or a diploma in mass communication from a recognized institution with an approved certificate in training techniques. In addition they must have served satisfactorily at Job Group "J" level for not less than three (3) years.

The successful candidates will be expected to take up training duties especially in mass communication theory, rural examination, international communication, etc. They will also be utilized in the production training department in basic lessons in mass communication as well as setting and marking examination papers in the subjects under their tutorship.

Applicants should preferably be graduates of electrical/electronic engineering from a recognized university or holders of higher diploma with electronics option or their equivalent with a thorough knowledge of electronics and telecommunications. In addition, they must have served satisfactorily at Job Group "J" level for at least three (3) years and have practical experience in radio and television engineering.

Experience in teaching transmission subjects or studio subjects or advanced telecommunication techniques will be advantageous.

Salary scale.—K£2,154 to 2,928 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be graduates in mass communication or social sciences or holders of a recognized diploma in television programme production. They should have served satisfactorily for a period of at least three (3) years as television producers at the level of Job Group "J".

Duties.—The successful candidate will be assigned training duties in both theory and practical aspects of production of TV programmes in the following fields:

TV magazines, TV news and features, panel discussions and interviews, women and children's programmes. He may also be required to teach TV news writing to information trainees in the institute.

Knowledge of training requirements of other specialized fields will be advantageous.

Rigger Inspector Grade I (One Post) (No. 312/85)

Salary scale.—K£1,794 to 2,424 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be in possession of at least the East African School Certificate or its equivalent with credits in mathematics, physics and a pass in English or the pre-technicians certificate with credits in the appropriate subjects. They must have completed three (3) years departmental training scheme and finally have been awarded the National Ordinary Technicians Diploma in structural or mechanical engineering by the Kenya National Examinations Council or be in possession of any other recognized equivalent qualifications. They must have served at Job Group "H" level for a minimum period of three (3) years, confirmed in appointment and must have knowledge and experience in the erection and maintenance of high masts and towers and have good knowledge of safety regulations.

Work involves planning, inspection and designing of towers in various radio/TV transmission installation, supervision of staff in erection and maintenance of towers, masts feeders and aerial arrays.

Superintendent (Electronics) (Five Posts) (No. 313/85)
Salary scale.—K£1,794 to 2,424 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AIGREEMENT.

Applicants must have served in the grade of inspector II (Job Group "H") for at least three (3) years. They should have reasonable experience in installations, maintenance and operation of electronic equipment and a thorough knowledge of safety regulations. They will be expected to have shown merit and ability for efficient supervision of installations, maintenance and operation of electronic equipment.

Duties and responsibility will involve assisting the officer-incharge of an engineering unit in the day-to-day administrative and operational of staff working on installations' maintenance and operation of electronic equipment including their practical training on the job.

Information Officer I (Fourteen Posts) (Re-adverusement) (No. 314/85)

Salary scale.—K£1,794 to 2,424 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must have served satisfactorily at the information officer II level for a period of at least three (3) years. In addition, they must be confirmed in their appointment and administed into the permanent and pensionable establishment.

Salary scale.—K£1,494 to 2,010 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants should be in possession of the East African School Certificate with credits in mathematics, physical science and a pass in English or the equivalent pre-technician certificate with credit in appropriate subjects. They must have completed three (3) years training under a departmental training scheme and have been awarded the National Ordinary Technician Diploma by the Kenya National Examinations Council in electronics or possess other equivalent qualification. They must have served at Job Group "G" level for at least three (3) years and must have been confirmed in appointment. They must have shown merit and ability in work results and have good knowledge of the safety regulations.

Duties include supervision of junior officers working on installations, maintenance and operation of electronics, equipment used in television, radio broadcasting services or in the telecommunications system.

Senior Rigger (Two Posts) (No. 316/85)

Salary scale.—K£1,128 to 1,554 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be in possession of the occupational test for senior riggers and have served at Job Group "F" level for a period of not less than three (3) years. They must have shown merit and ability to supervise field maintenance work and have thorough knowledge of safety regulations.

Duties involve preparation of schedule of work for rigging assistants and riggers, supervision in the field installation and maintenance work.

Vacancies in the Ministry of Labour:

Inspector of Factories I (Two Posts) (No. 317/85)

Applicants must have been educated to at least East African Certificate of Education level, hold a City and Guilds full technological certificate or equivalent in any of the following engineering fields: mechanical, electrical, chemical and building and civil engineering. They must have a minimum of five (5) years' post-qualification experience in industry of which at least three (3) must have been in a technical teaching or instructing capacity. They must be fully conversant with the latest methods of instructing techniques in the technical fields and must be well acquainted with all types of visual aids equipment. Possession of a grade I trade test certificate in a relevant trade is desirable but not essential. Possession of technical teacher training certificate will be an advantage.

The successful candidates will be required to organize and administer their section at an industrial training centre including the discipline and guidance of both their staff and trainees; prepare course programmes and material, syllabi and proficiency tests. They will be responsible for the control and maintenance of all machine tools and equipment in their sections and carry out instruction in the techniques of instructing in all the engineering fields.

Chemist Grade II (One Post) (D.I.T.) (No. 319/85)

Salary scale.—K£1,794 to 2,424 p.a. PENSIONABLE or AGREEMENT.

Applicants must be holders of a degree from a recognized university in chemistry or have equivalent academic qualification. Post-graduate qualification in textile technology/science is essential. They must have at least three (3) years' professional experience and must have shown merit and professional competence. Teaching experience would be desirable but not essential.

The successful candidate will be responsible to the training manager of the Kenya Textile Training Institute in administering and co-ordinating all activities of the textile laboratories which involve, supervising instructors and assistant instructors, maintenance of instruments and equipment of the laboratories, checking sectional stores, conducting teaching, follow-up trainees' performance, advising textile industry on quality and quantity standards and training matters and any other duties as will be assigned by the training manager.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE No. 78 OF 1984

Parties:

Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union

and

Kenya Canners Limited

Issue in dispute:

Wrongful dismissal of Mati Mutia.

THE Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Kenya Canners Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 23rd April, 1985, 29th and 30th July, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

The claimants called Mati Mutia to give evidence and the respondents called the following witnesses:

Ali Godana.

J. M. Mathenge.

C. M. Magua.

Major F. M. Njeru.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" undated duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 20th August, 1984, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The claimants have a negotiated agreement with the respondents on industrial relations matters connected with wages and terms and conditions of employment.

The respondents estates are divided into groups and are under the sepervision of various managers and security officers. Some of these security officers were in the police force before they joined the respondents and are considered by the respondents to have had good experience in dealing with matters connected with discipline.

The dispute arose as a result of the respondents dismissing Mati Mutia for alleged insubordination and for uttering words which were considered by his supervisor namely Mr. Mathenge as being offensive at the time Mr. Mati was told to conform to the normal working hours as laid down in the company regulations.

The court heard that Mati Mutia was employed by the respondents on 8th January, 1975, as a security guard. His basic rate of pay was KSh. 310 per month. He served on probation for a period of six months and was later confirmed in this appointment at a salary of KSh. 400 per month with effect from 1st October, 1976. At the time of his dismissal from employment his salary was KSh. 1,026.65.

The claimants told the court that on 16th October, 1982, Mati Mutia reported on duty late by about 6 minutes. His reason for being late was that he had gone to the toilet as he had a tummy upset. When Mati Mutia reported at Chui main stables where Mr. Mathenge his supervisor was, he was rebuked by Mr. Mathenge who demanded to know whether the hours for reporting and departure from work had changed. Mr. Mathenge alleged that Mati Mutia was responsible for misleading other guards to think that the senior security officer, Major Njeru had changed the working hours of reporting at 5.45 a.m. to 6.15 a.m. Mati Mutia denied all these allegations and further stated that he did not abuse Mr. Mathenge by saying that Mr. Mathenge was a wild animal or words to that effect. The claimants felt that Mr. Mathenge was not being considerate by immediately charging Mati Mutia for such a petty offence.

The claimants further stated that on 21st October, 1982, Mati Mutia reported late on duty by about 20 minutes as he

continued to feel sick. During that period there was no supervisor at hand to endorse his hospital card for treatment at the company dispensary. He therefore proceeded to work but avoided speaking to Mr. Mathenge, his supervisor. However, he later agreed to make a written statement when this was demanded from him by his supervisor.

The claimants told the court that this matter was first reported to their area secretary who arranged a meeting on 24th November, 1982, with the officials of the respondents and Ministry of Labour, Thika, with the view to solving the dispute. The claimants were not satisfied with the outcome of the meeting and appealed to the respondents to reconsider Mati Mutia's case for reinstatement. They pointed out that the decision to dismiss Mati Mutia was harsh as he only deserved a letter of warning having had a clean record for a period of seven years. They further pointed out that Mati Mutia should have been given a chance to defend himself before the decision to terminate his services was reached. The clamants felt that the supervisors of Mati Mutia had preconceived decision to dismiss him as the charges made against him left no room to have a third party to represent him. Furthermore they made no effort to investigate this case properly as the supervisors in question took advantage of their juior staff by coercion and made them to bear false witnesses against him. The claimants further stated that the supervisor of Mati Mutia had a grudge against him as it is known in the firm that Mr. Mathenge had on certain occasions tried to report Mr. Mutia to his former senior security officer on trivial matters but without success.

The claimants therefore prayed to the court to rescind the decision of the respondents to dismiss Mati Mutia and have him reinstated without loss of benefits as he had served the company faithfully for a period of seven years.

The respondents in their submission to the court, stated that on 16th October, 1982, Mati Mutia reported on duty late by about 6 minutes. When he was asked about this by his supervisor, he became rude and shouted at his supervisor using offensive language. Mati Mutia compared his supervisor with a wild animal and accused him of trying to make his own rules at the respondents undertaking. The respondents further stated that Mati Mutia had claimed that Major Njeru, the senior security officer had briefed him to report on duty at 6 a.m. instead of reporting at 5.45 a.m. as Mr. Matnenge was maintaining.

The respondents went on to say that on 1st October, 1982, Mr. Mathenge charged Mati Mutia for being insurbodinate and for using a language that was contrary to section 7 (d) of the parties collective agreement. At this juncture, Mati Mutia interrupted Mr. Mathenge rudely and refused to listen. Mr. Mutia raved and stated that he would only listen to Major Njeru, the senior security officer and then walked away. Mr. Mathenge seeing how Mr. Mutia was behaving consulted Major Njeru about the matter. Major Njeru advised Mr. Mathenge to go with another supervisor, G. N. Kogi to take a statement from Mati Mutia. Surprisingly for a third time, Mati Mutia used insulting language towards the two supervisors. Mr. Mutia demanded to speak with the senior security officer, Major Njeru.

The respondents further told the court that on 21st October, 1982, Mati Mutia reported late on duty and again maintained his rude manners and unco-operative attitude towards his supervisor. In particular he was very rude to Christopher M. Magua who had been sent to obtain a statement from him. Mr. Magua had gone to field 47 where he found Mati Mutia on duty on a horse. He was called by Mr. Magua who read the two charges against him but he instead replied rudely and went away. However, when he realized that the matter was being taken seriously he admitted the offence of having reported on duty late. As regarding the charge of insubordination Mati Mutia agreed with the written statement that he had told his supervisor before that the supervisor should not treat human beings like animals. Mr. Magua then warned him not to behave the way he did otherwise he would suspend him and withdraw his horse. It was at this juncture that Mati Mutia agreed to sign the charge sheet after it had been read to him by driver Mr. Gachuru. However, Mr. Magua considered the matter serious and decided to suspend him pending a decision from their head office.

The respondents stated that on 27th October, 1982, following a thorough investigation into the conduct of Mati Mutia, he was served with a summary dismissal letter which complied with section 1 (e) of the parties current collective agreement and the respondents agreed to pay him for all the days he had worked and any pro rata leave due.

The respondents asked the court to note the statements from witness confirming Mati Mutia's rudeness and blatant insubordination which are self evident. Such rudeness and insurbodination on the part of an employee goes to the root of the employment contract leaving no other option to an employer other than severance of the employment relationship.

The respondents further stated that in light of the above overwhelming evidence, they could not understand the basis of the findings and recommendations of the Thika Labour Officer in this matter although acceptable to the claimants. The respondents further wished the court to note the written statements taken in October, 1982, from Messrs. J. Mathenge, G. N. Gogi, C. M. Magua and Ali Godana. The claimants had at the same time taken and produced at the request of the court statements taken by the chief shop steward from other six employees. The respondents felt that it is clear that Mati Mutia had lied to the court regarding the incidents that happened on 16th and 21st October, 1982. The statements from the shop steward and others all confirm that there had been confrontation between Mati Mutia and his supervisor Mr. Mathenge arising from Mati Mutia's lateness by 6 minutes.

In their final submission to the court, the claimants pointed out that the evidence of several witnesses before the court could not be relied upon as they were conflicting statements made regarding the alleged abusive language used by Mati Mutia.

The claimants stated that the supervisor in question did not abide by the procedures laid down in the parties collective bargaining agreement as they did not give Mati Mutia a fair hearing when they first raised the issue and confronted him with a charge sheet. Mati Mutia did not commit an offence that warranted instant dismissal with loss of benefits. If the supervisor thought that the words uttered by Mr. Mutia "you treat us like wild animals" were very offensive he should have considered issuing a letter of warning which would have been the best form of disciplining him but not dispensing with his services. His lateness of 21st October, 1982, was explained as sickness yet these two incidents were recorded on the disciplinary form and signed on the same day to pressuring Mr. Mutia's dismissal. Any other complaint deserved a warning only.

The court has evaluated the evidence of the several witnesses who gave evidence in court.

The court after careful consideration of this dispute finds that the approach and handling of Mati Mutia's case by his supervisors aggravated the situation and made it difficult for Mati Mutia to obey the instructions without questioning. Mati Mutia should have been given a chance to discuss the matter with his supervisors before a decision was reached to dismiss him. The court agrees with the claimants submission that Mati Mutia should have been given a letter of warning as his offence of being late by 6 minutes and for uttering words "You treat us human beings like animals" did not warrant instant dismissal. The court doubts if Mr. Mutia told Mr. Mathenge that he was like a wild animal. The court believes that he uttered the words "you treat us human beings like animals."

The court notes that the respondents personnel officer entirely relied on the recommendations contained in the charge sheet and did not invite the parties concerned to try and solve their differences before taking action. Insead he took the easy way out to fire Mati Mutia.

After careful consideration of all the submissions the court finds that Mati Mutia has suffered a wrongful dismissal and he should be reinstated to his job. The court awards that Mati Mutia should be reinstated on the first of the month following the court award and he should be paid six months' salary by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal he suffered. The court further directs that the respondents should issue a final letter of warning to Mati Mutia and it should be accorded the treatment as laid down in the parties collective agreement.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Grain Milling Group of F.K.E. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

The parties were heard in Nairobi on 13th June, 1985, and 26th July, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 19th November, 1984, was received by the court on 27th December, along with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The respondents have within their membership the following firms:

Unga Maize Millers Ltd.

Unga Feeds Ltd.

Unga Ltd.

Proctor and Allied Ltd.

The group has recently been reconstituted following major changes in what used to be Mercat Group of Companies and has a recognition agreement with the claimants signed on 15th April, 1985. The group has 1,140 unionizable employees in their employment who are based in Nairobi and in the company branches in Eldoret, Nakuru and Mombasa.

The parties in revising the latest collective agreement which expired on 31st July, 1984, have at various levels reached agreement on all other items except the five items now before the court.

Retirement benefits:

The claimants are demanding payment of one month's salary as gratuity for every year of service to a retiring employee. They argued that the National Social Security Fund benefits are inadequate. Furthermore, they state that other organizations realizing the hardship retired employees face have established additional retirement schemes to the National Social Security Fund.

The respondents replied that the court is no doubt aware that the provision of a retirement benefit in a few agreements cannot be considered a norm. In any case, the respondents did operate a provident fund which was frozen at the introduction of the National Social Security Fund. The respondents are a public company and over 1,000 of their employees are shareholders and as such must be aware that no provision has been made for any gratuity in addition to IN.S.S.F. It is reason that an offer has been made to open up the current pension and life assurance scheme to all employees with effect from the date of the award. It is also significant for the court to note that the employees who purchase shares at subsidized prices or acquired prices or acquired them under the long service share allotment scheme are not required to surrender them and therefore continue to remain company shareholders. The court is asked to note that the offer by the respondents for unionizable employees to join the current pension scheme which will also provide for life assurance is to take effect from 1st July 1985. Although the scheme restricts membership to persons earning a minimum of KSh. 1,600 per month it should be noted that with effect from 1st August, 1985, the minimum basic wage in the respondents' undertakings will be KSh. 1,657.34 per month which is above the minimum allowed. Furthermore the respondents' contributions to the pension scheme in respect of all employees joining the scheme will be in addition to contributions to the - X44

N.S.S.F. It would therefore be too much to expect the respondents to contribute to yet another gratuity fund.

After careful consideration of all the submissions and considering the expenditure that would be involved in setting up an additional retirement benefit scheme the court concurs with the proposal of the respondents to allow all their unionizable employees to join the pension and life assurance scheme forwith. The court, however, awards that employees who are above 50 years of age and who do not opt to join the pension scheme should be paid a gratuity at the time of retirement of two weeks pay for every completed year of service with effect from the date of the introduction of the N.S.S.F. This will be in addition to the benefits which were frozen at that time.

Long service increase:

The claimants demand that long service increments be introduced to compensate the employees for their skill and for the length and loyal service rendered to the company. They propose the following rates to apply:

KSh.

Over 10 to 15 years' service

Over 15 to 20 years' service

Over 20 years' service

120 per annum.

175 per annum.

175 per annum.

220 per annum.

In reply to the claimants' demand for the introduction of long service increase, the respondents pointed out that there are basically two forms of wage structures in practice in Kenya namely:

- (i) The rate for the job.
- (ii) Incremental scale.

The incremental scale wage structure operates in establishments where length of service in each grade provides the workers with additional relevant skills which enable the worker concerned to do more complex jobs within the grade better and faster than the newcomers to that same job grade.

The respondents pointed out that in cause No. 31 of 1980, the parties failed to clarify the operation of the incremental scale wage structure as it operates in the insurance industry and the court made an award which the claimants interpreted out of context and had to be brought back to court for interpretion. In the court's interpretation application ruling, the court restored the credibility of the incremental scale wage/ salary structures for industries to which they may be suited. In this particular case, the 16 grade levels shown in appendix 3 and their differential shown in appendix 4 clearly show the incompatability of a long service increase with the rate for the job structure which has been followed since 1963 when the parties entered into a recognition agreement. The operational difficulties which can arise with the operation of a long service increase should also be taken into account. The respondents wish to point out that they adopted the rate for the job wage structure after taking into account the nature of the jobs performed and have for several years since 1963 negotiated with the claimants on the basis of the rate for the job. The adoption of the rate for the job policy was and is in conformity with the provisions of section Di (i) of the Industrial Relations Charter which states as follows:

"All parties shall aim at abolishing all discrimination among workers on grounds of race, colour, sex, belief, tribal association or trade union affiliation including discrimination in respect of—

(i) wage rates which shall be fixed according to the principle of equal pay for work of equal value in the same operation and understanding."

The respondents further stated that the rates offered by them are among the highest if not the highest in industries that are under strict government price control because of the essential nature of their products. The respondents therefore submit that a wage structure, long service increase, based on length of service in an industry where length of service has no direct bearing on productivity and/or efficiency can have serious negative effect on morale and productivity. Workers in an industry such as the grain milling expect that like work should be subject to like reward as provided for in the Industrial Relations Charter. The respondents recognizing and respecting the above policy, have established other indirect ways of compensation the workers for length of service for the purposes of controlling labour turnover. These include promotions, staff pension and

life assurance scheme, shares allotment scheme, provident fund which was later frozen and National Social Security Fund benefits.

The court must say that the respondents introduced very interesting and weighty arguments on this issue in their final submission which took the claimants by surprise. The claimants had no opportunity to consider and answer them. In these circumstances the court directs the parties to apply their minds to this issue once again during the negotiations for the next collective agreement. The court therefore makes no award on this issue for the time being.

Shift allowance:

The parties only differ on the amount to be paid as shift allowance. The claimants demand KSh. 2 per night (6 p.m. to 6 a.m.) hour worked in shift and the respondents have offered twenty cents (20) cents per hour. The claimants indicated that they are ready to accept comparable shift allowance rates currently paid by other firms in similar business. These rates vary from 25 cents to KSh. 1 per (night) hour worked. The claimants and respondents demand and offer are both on the outer limits.

After careful consideration of the points raised by the parties the court awards the workers 25 cents per (night) hour worked as shift allowance.

Leave:

The claimants demand that Saturdays should not be included for the purpose of working out leave days due to an employee. The total leave due to an employee should be 30 working days per completed year of service.

The claimants argue that at present they do not work on Saturdays and in view of this fact, they demand that Saturdays should not be considered as a working day under the terms of the parties agreement. The claimants demand that because of the effects of shift work and the heavy work involved on the production line operations, the workers be granted 30 working days leave to provide the workers with adequate rest.

The respondents posed the question to the court whether the current leave period which in practical terms is over 30 consecutive days is inadequate.

The court has decided to reject the claimants demand for the time being.

Leave travelling allowance:

Claimants demand	Respondents offer	Current "

From the above demand and offer the difference in the parties stands is KSh. 50 per employee.

The court has considered this item and awards KSh. 280 per year as unified leave travelling allowance to be paid to an employee when he/she proceeds on leave.

Medical benefis:

The claimants stated that under the current agreement, employees are entitled to fourty-five (45) days on full pay and fourty-five (45) days on half-pay per year as sick leave when an employee cannot perform his duties. The claimants would like such employees to be granted ninety (90) days leave with full pay and ninety (90) days' leave with half pay.

The respondents wish to point out that the provisions in their current agreement is already above average and request that it be maintained.

The court awards a sick leave of sixty (60) days on full pay and thirty (30) days on half pay subject to the production of a medical certificate from a registered medical practitioner.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT CAUSE INO. 21 OF 1985

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers

and

Markman and Company Ltd.

Issue in dispute:

Termination of Harrison Niue Nyaga.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as claimants and Markman and Company Ltd. shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 23rd July, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. The claimants called Harrison Njue Nyaga as a witness and the respondents called Ferdinand Ngui, Ahmed Matunga and Jane Owino to give evidence.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 8th November, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 15th February, 1985, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The grievant in this dispute, Harrison Nyaga is a disabled person and was employed by the respondents on 4th November, 1980, as a junior clerk and he was terminated on 24th October, 1983, while earning KSh. I,346 per month plus a house allowance of KSh. 200. The reason regarding his termination was that he caused disturbance at his place of work on 19th October, 1983, and that he made a complaint to David Kerr and caused a further disturbance at the premises of Dante Burba.

The claimants told the court that Mr. Nyaga is partially deaf and uses hearing aid. On 19th October, 1983, one, Warren Fernandes, a mechanic with the respondents found Mr. Nyaga in the corridor and followed him and then shouted at him from the back "Hello Bionic". Mr. Nyaga felt insulted as this name originated from the story of the "6 Million Dollar Man" and sarcastically had relevance to Mr. Nyaga's hearing aid. The claimants felt that what transpired at the respondents premises between Mr. Fernandes and Mr. Nyaga was not of Mr. Nyaga's making as Mr. Fernandes was more at fault more than their client. When giving evidence, Mr. Nyaga stated that he had no joking relations with Mr. Fernandes and that is what annoyed him after Mr. Fernandes called him "Bionic". Mr. Nyaga denied having fought with Mr. Fernandes.

The respondents told the court that Mr. Nyaga was nicknamed by his workmates as "Bionic" and he never objected to it. On the day in question, Mr. Fernandes who used to joke with all workers including Mr. Nyaga called him "Bionic" as he used to but Mr. Nyaga started kicking Mr. Fernandes and although Mr. Fernandes was stronger than Mr. Nyaga, Mr. Fernandes did not fight back. The matter was reported to the managing director, who gave both the employees verbal warning and asked them to write letters of apology. The respondents feel that the letter by Mr. Nyaga was not an apology as such as it complained about the incident. The respondents told the court that after the managing director had warned the two employees, Mr. Nyaga was not satisfied and went to complain to another director. This action by Mr. Nyaga nullified the managing director's warning and they had no alternative but to terminate his services.

The three respondents witnesses told the court that Mr. Fernandes was a playful workmate. On the day in question they witnessed Mr. Fernandes following Mr. Nyaga in the corridor and shouting in his ear "Hello Bionic" and then jumped backwards. Mr. Nyaga turned round and kicked Mr. Fernandes on the legs and as Mr. Nyaga tried to fight they, the witnesses separated them. All the witnesses told the court that Mr. Nyaga was a hot tempered person and used to change his mood every now and then. The respondents told the court that Mr. Nyaga had also reported this matter to several higher authorities and politicians. This action had worsened the situation as far as they were concerned.

In considering this dispute the court finds that the cause of the disturbance that led to the termination of Mr. Nyaga's service was the result of Mr. Nyaga being teased by Mr. Fernandes who has been described as a playful person. The court is of the view that a joke like this one of shouting in a deaf ear with a hearing aid can result in an unpleasant shock as it

did. The court is not surprised at the fracas that followed. The court also found that the respondents managing director verbally warned the two employees and asked them to write letters of apology. They both complied. Mr. Nyaga then went and reported the incident to another director who in turn spoke to the managing director about it. This action annoyed the managing director who, without considering Mr. Nyaga's clean service, terminated him without even giving him an opportunity to defend himself. In these circumstances the court finds that Mr. Fernandes took his joking a bit too far and because the respondents violated the principles of natural justice. Mr. Nyaga has suffered a wrongful dismissal. The court notes that Mr. Nyaga had claimed three months pay in lieu of notice in addition to his other terminal benefits through the legal advice centre keeping this in view the court awards that Mr. Nyaga should be paid six months salary by way of compensation in addition to his other lawful terminal dues except pay in lieu of notice.







IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the Kenya Gazette, Supplements, etc.:

- (1) The Kenya Gazette contains notices of a general nature which do not affect legislation. They are therefore submitted to the Government Printer directly.
- (2) Legislative Supplement contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the Central Government. Because of this they must be submitted to the Government Printer through the office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) Bill Supplement contains Bills which are for introduction in the National Assembly.
- (4) Act Supplement contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of an A4 sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signatures must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D-Kenya Gazette

"D.14.(1) Communications for the Kenya Gazette should reach the Government Printer not later than 12 noon, on Tuesday of the week that publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer when ready."

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
