THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE No. 14 OF 1985

Parties:

Railways and Harbours Union (K)

and

Kenya Railways Corporation

Issue in dispute:

Termination of service in the public interest of Augustine Wangombe.

THE Railways and Harbours Union (K) shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Kenya Railways Corporation shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 9th and 25th July and 19th August, 1985, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 6th October, 1984, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 7th January, 1985, along with the statutory certificates signed by the Labour Commissioner and the Minister for Labour.

The grievant in this dispute, Augustine Wangombe was employed by the respondents in January, 1963, as a clerk trainee and progressed through the ranks earning his last promotion to clerk grade NB VA in 1969. In 1976 while stationed at Karatina, Mr. Wangombe forfeited his appointment on disciplinary grounds, but following an appeal by the claimants, the respondents reinstated him in 1981. The five years that Mr. Wangombe was out of work was treated as leave without pay. In June, 1982, Mr. Wangombe's services were eventually terminated in public interest and he lost 5 per cent of his pension benefits.

The claimants told the court that their member had served the respondents loyally for 13 years without a warning. In 1976 when stationed at Karatina, Mr. Wangombe's trouble started with his two immediate supervisors. The claimants stated that Mr. Wangombe fell sick and was given some days off-duty by a doctor. As he comes from Nyeri, only 13 miles away, Mr. Wangombe went home. Unfortunately Mr. Wangombe found there was a land dispute concerning his land and since Mr. Wangombe was due leave, he sent a telegram to his supervisor asking for a week's compassionate leave. The land dispute was not settled in time so he sent another telegram. In all, the claimants told the court, Mr. Wangombe was forced to stay at home for over three months but all the time his supervisor was informed of his whereabouts.

As a result of victimization by his officer in charge, Mr. Wangombe lost his job on the grounds that he had forfeited it himself. The claimants told the court that they the claimants took up the matter on behalf of their member and eventually Mr. Wangombe was reinstated to his job in 1982 after 5 years. The claimants submitted that on Mr. Wangombe's reinstatement the respondents posted him to Mombasa under the same officers who were in the Central Province intentionally with the result that trouble started immediately and Mr. Wangombe had to apply for a transfer to another department. The claimants stated that the respondents did not approve the transfer as they were out to sack Mr. Wangombe. Instead of transferring him, the respondents retired Mr. Wangombe in the public interest and withheld 5 per cent of his pension benefits. The claimants felt that the respondents acted outside the laid down procedures by failing to charge Mr. Wangombe with a disciplinary offence when he would have had a right to defend himself. The claimants prayed to the court to reinstate their member.

The respondents came up with a detailed report on events which led to Mr. Wangombe's forfeiture of employment in 1976 when he was stationed at Karatina. The respondents told the court that Mr. Wangombe left his station on sickness grounds and went to his home at Nyeri. From Nyeri, Mr. Wangombe sent several telegrams asking for extension of leave as if he had been given leave officially. Through these telegrams, Mr. Wangombe gave himself 103 days leave. The respondents produced these telegrams. Because Mr. Wangombe was away without official leave he forfeited his appointment in accordance with staff regulations. The respondents told the court that the claimants took up the matter with the Ministry of Labour on behalf of their member and while the dispute was being processed Mr. Wangombe wrote to the respondents seeking to be pardoned and reinstated. The respondents told the court that they wrote to Mr. Wangombe and asked him whether he would claim salary for the period that he was out of employment of the respondents if pardoned. Mr. Wangombe confirmed that he would not claim anything. The respondents told the court that they reinstated Mr. Wangombe after five years purely on humanitarian grounds and his assurance that he will not claim salary for the period he was out.

The respondents submitted that on reinstatement Mr. Wangombe was posted to Mombasa. After a while Mr. Wangombe claimed salary for the period he was out, i.e. five years. This surprised the respondents as he had made it clear that he will not claim anything when reinstated. The respondents communicated their view to Mr. Wangombe on this subject and consequently Mr. Wangombe withdrew the demand. The respondents went further to state that Mr. Wangombe applied for a transfer to another department at Nairobi but it was not approved. After this denial Mr. Wangombe was reported not to be concentrating on his work and stayed away from duty from time to time on reasons convenient to him. The respondents told the court that at this stage they found this employee to be a difficult one. They eventually decided to retire him in public interest and pay him terminal benefits except for a fraction of 5 per cent of his pension benefits owing to the fact that he contributed to the circumstances that led to termination of his services. The respondents denied the allegation that they were out to sack Mr. Wangombe and said that they employ 23,000 workers and cannot afford to indulge in such practices as victimization, etc.

After careful consideration of all the submissions by both parties in this dispute, the court finds that the respondents tolerated the grievant in this dispute, long enough as he was a slippery and malingering employee who only wanted to earn without working and cleverly avoided disciplinary actions. In these circumstances the respondents properly utilized their powers to retire him in public interest.

Although the court concurs with the respondents' decision to retire Mr. Wangombe in the public interest, the court finds the respondents action of depriving him of 5 per cent of his pension to be harsh. The court awards that Mr. Wangombe should be refunded the 5 per cent of his pension which has been deducted since the time he was retired and he should continue so to earn his full pension. The court rejects the claimants demand for his reinstatement.
