CAUSE NO. 36 OF 1988

Parties:

Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers
and
Saifee Silvering Company Limited

Issue in dispute:

Dismissal of Samson Kariuki and Paul Kamau.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Saifee Silvering Company Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 23rd May, 1989, and relied on their written and verbal submissions. S. F. Ahmedali was called by the respondents to testify on oath.

The claimants did not call any witness.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 9th October, 1987, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 24th May, 1988, together with the statutory certificates signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The grievants in this dispute Samson Kariuki and Paul Kamau were employed by the respondents on 1st April, 1980 and 1st May, 1972, respectively. Both were employed as general workers. They were dismissed on 10th July, 1986. Mr. Kariuki had served the respondents for nearly 6½ years, and Mr. Kamau had a service of nearly 15 years.

The incident that led to the grievants dismissal took place on 10th July, 1986, at around 4 p.m. The grievants were dismissed on the allegations that they had used abusive and discourteous language and threatened to beat up one of the respondents' directors.

The dispute was investigated by the Ministry of Labour and its findings were that Mr. Kariuki's dismissal was justified. Mr. Kamau was found to have been a victim of circumstances and should have been treated with leniency.

The Ministry of Labour recommended that the respondents' decision to dismiss Mr. Kariuki be upheld. However, Mr. Kamau's dismissal was recommended to be reduced to normal termination of service and that he be paid three (3) months salary as compensation for loss of employment.

The decision was turned down by the claimants and the matter is now before the court for consideration.

The court notes that Mr. Kariuki had been involved in an accident on 11th January, 1986. As a result of the injuries he could not work for 2½ months. During this period of sick leave he was paid his full salaries. However, when he resumed duty on 19th March, 1986, he filled compensation forms and there was a misunderstanding between the respondents and the first grievant.

The court further notes that Mr. Kariuki's problems and the origin of this dispute started on 7th July, 1986. On this date Mr. Kariuki whose disability had been assessed at 20 per cent by Kenyatta National Hospital was required by the insurance company to undergo reassessment for his disability. As a result of these procedures there developed the misunderstanding. The grievants who happened to be brothers suspected that the respondents were out to interfere with the compensation claim although there is absolutely no truth in this assumption as the respondents had dealt with the matter expeditiously.

The court has carefully considered the arguments put forward by the parties and the evidence tendered before it, and finds that the grievants had over-reacted on the issue of the compensation claim.

The court finds that the respondents should have been more tolerant especially towards Mr. Kamau who was the shop-steward under the aforesaid circumstances.

The court awards that both the grievants' dismissal should be reduced to normal termination. In addition Paul Kamau alone should be paid three (3) months salary as compensation for loss of his employment.

Parties:

Tailors and Textiles Workers Union
and
Bids Fabknits Limited

Issues in dispute:

Wrongful dismissal of John Karanja, Geoffrey Muthee, Maurice Milimo and less payment of house allowance in respect of John Karanja and Geoffrey Muthee.

THE Tailors and Textiles Workers Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Bids Fabknits Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

The dispute was fixed for hearing in Nairobi on 16th May, 1988; but before the hearing commenced the parties were able to reach a settlement in respect of John Karanja and Geoffrey Muthee and requested the court to record an award by consent in respect of the said grievants.

However, the parties were heard in respect of the wrongful dismissal of Maurice Milimo and in addition to relying on their written and verbal submissions, the parties called the following witnesses to give evidence on oath.

Claimants: Maurice Milimo—grievant.

Respondents: Madhusudan G. Shah—Managing Director.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A", dated 7th March, 1988, duly signed by the parties, was received by the court on 8th September, 1988, together with the statutory certificates from the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner, and by consent of the parties the court awards that the respondents should pay John Karanja and Geoffrey Muthee in accordance with the following terms:

- (a) Days worked.
- (b) Leave earned.
- (c) *Pro rata* housing allowance on the basis of the collective agreement.
- (d) Overtime worked, if any.

The dues payable by the respondents are subject to the usual deductions.

Maurice Milimo was employed as a machine operator by the respondents at their Nairobi factory on 1st March, 1979, at a salary of Sh. 435 per month. He rose through the ranks and at the time of his summary dismissal on 29th January, 1987, he was receiving a salary of Sh. 970 per month and house allowance of Sh. 315 per month. The grievant was also the claimants' shopsteward.

After most careful consideration of all the submissions and the evidence adduced in court, the court finds that the respondents have scrupulously followed the provisions of the collective agreement pertaining to the warning procedure. The court is further satisfied that the grievant was issued with the three warning letters as alleged by the respondents and that these warning letters were not fabricated. The court further finds

that Mr. Milimo did receive them. There is no evidence before the courts to show that Mr. Milimo made any appeal to the respondents against those warning letters if they were not valid or justified.

On the other hand, the court does not believe the respondents' allegation that Mr. Milimo kept quiet when the managing director confronted him in the personnel officer's office; and, in the circumstances, the court has come to the conclusion that it must give Mr. Milimo the benefit of the doubt.

For these reasons the court, while accepting the findings of the Ministry of Labour's investigations and also taking into account the respondents offer, feels that four months compensation is not justified in this case. Accordingly the court awards that Mr. Milimo should be paid three (3) months only by way of compensation for the wrongful dismissal.

CAUSE No. 97 OF 1988

Parties:

Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers Union
and
Lake Basin Development Authority

Issue in dispute:

Effective date of the collective agreement.

THE Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Lake Basin Development Authority shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 17th May, 1989 and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 17th May, 1988, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 16th December, 1988, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The claimants are a trade union, registered under the Trade Union Act, Cap. 233, laws of Kenya, and they represent employees in the plantation and agricultural sector, such as coffee plantations and coffee processing factories, tea plantations and tea processing factories, sisal plantations and sisal processing factories, parastatal agricultural undertakings and processing factories and farms and/or estates owned by missionaries and agricultural institutions.

The respondents are a statutory corporation incorporated under an Act of Parliament whose activities are mainly of rural and agricultural nature. They are a non-profit making Government corporation.

On 15th July, 1985, the parties signed a recognition agreement which regulate and govern the procedure to be followed when handling their grievances that may arise from time to time. In April 1986 the claimants forwarded a proposal of the intended collective agreement to the respondents and in May they sent yet another proposal containing some amendments and requested the respondents to ignore the former. While the respondents expressed their willingness to negotiate, the claimants had already reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour, alleging that the respondents had displayed hardened attitude and they were dodging them.

The apparent delay in the start of the negotiations was because the respondents had to seek specific guidance and approval from the Parastatal Advisory Committee in accordance with clause 27 of the Guidelines on Review of Salaries and Other Terms of Service for Parastatal Organizations prior to starting any negotiations with the claimants. The approval was not given until 17th March, 1987, and the negotiations did not commence until 16th June, 1987. The aforementioned provision states as follows:

Clause 27.—Unionizable staff of parastatals, on the other hand, continue to have their salaries and other terms

negotiated through collective agreement, but it is stressed that parastatals must seek specific guidance from the Parastatal Advisory Committee prior to starting any negotiations with unions on review of salaries and other terms.

The negotiations lasted quite sometime and the parties were able to conclude all the 26 items in the collective agreement at their own level with the exception of the "effective date" which is now before the court. Ordinarily this would be a simple matter, but in this dispute the labour costs per month in increased benefits on various items like basic pay, housing, medical benefits, overtime, leave, transport, allowances, provident fund, etc. is quite enormous.

The parties' respective positions in the final round of their exhaustive negotiations, consultations and conciliation are:

Claimants.—1st July, 1987.

Respondents.—The date of signature.

The court notes that the parties signed a recognition agreement in July 1985 and that in May 1986, the claimants submitted to the respondents their proposals on wages, terms and conditions of employment affecting the respondents' unionizable employees. The court further notes that the respondents are a non-profit making Government institution which relies on the Government for payment of their employees' salaries and wages and for funding other projects undertaken by them.

The court appreciates the sacrifice and patience which the employees have made and shown, but at the same time the court would not like to make an award which would increase the financial burden on the respondents to a point where the payment of the salaries and wages to their employees may be jeopardized. On the evidence produced by the respondents, the court is satisfied that there is a real danger that if big arrears are awarded to the workers there might not be any money to pay them for the subsequent months. In such a situation the security of employment is naturally of paramount importance, and the court cannot therefore make an award which may cause a loss of a lot of jobs.

For the foregoing reasons, the court awards that the effective date should be 1st July, 1989, and the collective agreement should remain in force for a period of two years from that date.

THE Kenya Union of Commercial Food and Allied Workers shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Undugu Society of Kenya Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi, on 24th May, 1989, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 22nd September, 1988, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 9th December, 1988, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Minister for Labour and the Labour Commissioner.

The grievants in this dispute, Mr. Karanja Gitu and Miss Rose Ekeya, were employed by the respondents on 7th January, 1983 and 1st July, 1984, respectively. Mr. Gitu was engaged as an export assistant and Miss Ekeya as a shop assistant in the respondents shops.

The grievants' services were terminated on 21st July, 1986. At the time of termination, Mr. Karanja Gitu was earning a consolidated salary of Sh. 1,584 per month and had served the respondents for nearly 3½ years. At termination of her

service, Miss Ekeya was earning Sh. 1,200 per month and house allowance of Sh. 385 per month, respectively. She had worked for the respondents for a period of two (2) years.

The events leading to the termination of Miss Ekeya's service started on 17th July, 1986. It is alleged that she failed to account for Sh. 202, on 18th July, 1986, being part of sales money in her possession on 17th July, 1986.

The circumstances that led to termination Mr. Gitu's service took place between April and 7th July, 1986, when he was on leave. It is alleged that a report was written implicating him for being the cause of the losses in the respondents' export unit.

This dispute was reported to the Ministry of Labour and the Ministry's findings were that the respondents' action of terminating the grievants' services by giving them three (3) months salary in lieu of notice was rather too harsh.

The Ministry recommended that the grievants' cases be treated as normal termination of service that would entitle them to full terminal benefits. In addition, Miss Ekeya was to be paid four (4) months salary by way of compensation for wrongful termination of service she had suffered.

The Ministry's decision was accepted by the claimants but rejected by the respondents. The matter is now before the court for consideration.

The court has carefully considered the submissions put forward by the parties and finds that no case has been made out to warrant court's interference in the respondents' decision to terminate the services of these two employees. In fact the respondents, have been quite fair to both the grievants in giving them normal terminations which included in addition to other benefits three (3) months salary each in lieu of notice. Considering that the respondents are really a charitable organization it is indeed a good gesture.

Under the circumstances the court cannot help the grievants any more and their claim for reinstatement and or compensation are rejected.

CAUSE No. 83 OF 1988

Parties:

Kenya Shoe and Leather Workers Union
and
Leather Masters Limited

Issue in dispute:

Recognition.

THE Kenya Shoe and Leather Workers Union shall herein-after be referred to as the claimants and the Leather Masters Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 25th May, 1989, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Minister for Labour referred this dispute to the Industrial Court on 29th July, 1988, in accordance with section 8 of the Trade Disputes Act, Cap. 234, laws of Kenya, which dispute was received by the court on 10th October, 1988.

The claimants were registered as a trade union in 1960. It goes without saying that their registration must have come about after the registrar of trade unions was satisfied in every respect with regard to the provisions of section 16 of the Trade Union Act, Cap. 233, laws of Kenya.

It is not disputed that the respondents is a limited liability company registered in the Republic of Kenya and wholly owned by Kenya citizens. They deal mainly with leather products such as hand-bags, belts, etc.

In January 1986, some 18 out of 30 employees of the respondents' company approached the claimants for representation, and were served with check-off forms to sign, acknowledging their membership to the claimants union. The number of the employees who accepted to join the claimants' union constituted a simple majority required by the law to enable the claimants to be accorded recognition by the respondents. The list was referred to and produced during the hearing.

On the basis of this simple majority, the claimants approached the respondents for recognition to enable them represent the interests of the workers in the respondents' employment. The respondents rejected the claimants' demand and as a result the claimants reported a dispute to the Minister for Labour.

The court has given a very careful thought and scrutiny to the various arguments and documents put forward by the parties in this dispute, and finds that then respondents' business activities are overwhelmingly covered by the claimants constitution.

The court concurs with the views of the investigator; and, in view of the fact that no rival union is also claiming recognition from the respondents, the court has no hesitation in coming to the conclusion that the claimants are the appropriate union to be recognized by the respondents. The claimants' demand for recognition by the respondents is properly before the court and the court so awards.

This is the best way to establish sound industrial practice and the court further directs that the parties should enter into and sign a recognition agreement within two months from the date of this award which agreement should be effective from the date it is signed.

IMPORTANT NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS TO THE KENYA GAZETTE

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the *Kenya Gazette, Supplement*, etc.:

- (1) The *Kenya Gazette* contains notices of a general nature which do not affect legislation. They are, therefore, submitted to the Government Printer directly.
- (2) *Legislative Supplement* contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the central Government. Because of this they must be submitted to the Government Printer through the office of the Attorney-General.
- (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction in the National Assembly.
- (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.

All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of an A4 sheet no matter how small the notice or Act, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible and contain a minimum of alterations.

Particular attention should be paid to the following points:

- (i) Signature must be clarified by means of rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signer in capital letters.
- (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
- (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—

Kenya Gazette

"D 41, (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 9 a.m., on Friday of the week before publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the *Gazette*.

(2) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward *Gazette* notices to the Government Printer when ready."

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect.
