AWARD

Claimants have brought this dispute against the respondents for recognition, but the latter stoutly resisted the demand on the ground that the interested party was the appropriate union for their employees and had since 1978 operated a check-off system in favour of the interested party. The claimants approached the respondents for recognition as the sole representative of their employees because that the interested party had shown no interest in representing the employees and that they had recruited ten (10) out of the fourteen (14) or 71.4 per cent into their union of the respondents' unionisable employees. The respondents did not accede to the demand, and consequently the claimants reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour, who recommended that the management should accord the union formal recognition without undue delay, *vide* claimants' Appendix N. The respondents rejected the recommendation as erroneous, and the matter is now before the court for adjudication and determination.

Consequently, the parties raised a duly signed Notification of Dispute, Form "A", on 29th August, 1989 under section 14 (7) of the Act, and forwarded the same to the court for adjudication and determination as aforesaid. The notification, together with statutory certificate dated 7th December, 1990, from the Labour Commissioner pursuant to section 14 (9) (e) of the Act, were received by the court on 10th December, 1990. The dispute was then listed for mention on 14th January, 1991, and on the direction of the court the parties filed their written statements on 31st January, 7th March, and 22nd April, 1991, respectively. The case was heard on 10th July, 18th September, 12th November, 1991 and 5th March, 1992, during the course of which the parties relied on their written submissions and verbal arguments.

According to the claimants, the respondents are a charitable school owned and operated jointly by the Mennonite Board of East Africa and the Baptist Mission of Kenya. The school was started for the children of Mennonite Missionaries in Musoma, Tanzania, in 1948, but later it admitted children of different denominations. Around 1952, the school moved to Mara under the name and style of Mara Hill School; and in 1967 it moved to its present location in Nairobi, and has continued to be jointly sponsored by the two missions, each appointing three members to the Board of Governors. The six members appoint one additional member to the board. The faculty members are recruited by the two sponsoring agencies. Missionary children pay less fees while non-missionary children pay much more fees. They submitted further that the Mennonite Board of East Africa and the Baptist Mission of Kenya are christian cultural societies (religious), whose memberships are made of free will. Thus, being allied institutions of the two voluntary religious associations, their activities fall under rule 3 (a) of the claimants' constitution which states as under:

"Membership of the union shall be open to all employees of all trade unions, welfare associations, political parties, voluntary associations; and Allied Organizations provided such employee is above the apparent age of sixteen (16) years."

Under paras. 8 to 13 to their submission, the claimants referred to some publications and correspondence, *vide* Appendices H to M in support of their case, and argued in a nutshell that the respondents' activities fell within the umbrella of their constitution and as such the respondents should accord them recognition in terms of section 5 (2) of the Trade Disputes Act. They stated that although the interested party served the respondents with a check-off list in May, 1978, under section 46 of the Act, the latter failed to comply with the provisions of section 47 thereof, but the interested party neither took steps in accordance with the terms of section 49, nor reported a trade dispute to the Minister for Labour pursuant to section 4 to the Trade Disputes Act. The claimants contended further that the interested party had failed or neglected to attend to the employees' problems between 1978 to 1990, and as such their interest now is unreal, untrue, unauthentic, vague, etc., and leaves a lot to be desired. In the circumstances, the interested party has no say member among, or mandate to represent, the employees of the respondents.

Under paras. 15 to 19 of their submission, the claimants reiterated the Government's commitment to establish trade unions in line with industrial activities of the national economy, and alluded in detail to the groupings under Appendix "H" thereof. They stated that they operate a check-off with the respondents of more than 51 per cent to the employees; and for this reason—

- (a) the interest of the interested party is null and void because it lost its interest in 1978; and, therefore, there is no rivalry in the representation of the respondents' employees;
- (b) the respondents are properly covered constitutionally, and are within the grouping of the activities of the national economy which are also adequately covered by their constitution;
- (c) the interested party is a general union contrary to the Government policy of establishing industrial trade unionism in Kenya, and is not the appropriate trade union for the respondents' employees;
- (d) the employees of the respondents voluntarily joined their union in January, 1987, after the interested party had unsuccessfully reap-proached them in October, 1986, with the arrangement of the respondents, and they have continued to remain their members from 1987 to date; and
- (e) as a matter of law, recognition of a trade union by an employer must have at all times membership back-up and any recognition without membership back-up is not legal and valid, and is, therefore, null and void. The interested party has no members in the employment of the respondents. It has also no recognition agreement because it lost interest in representing the employees of the respondents.

The claimants, therefore, urged the court to find that the interested party has no genuine interest in this cause and direct it to stop being a general union and interfering with their members in the respondents' undertaking. Accordingly, they prayed the court to rule in their favour and order the respondents to accord them recognition forthwith.

In their submission, the respondents stated that they began as Mara Hills School in northern Tanzania in 1948 for the children of Mennonite missionaries, and in 1967 the Eastern Mennonite Board of Missions Charities purchased the present educational institution and incorporated the existing buildings into the school, *viz*: Rosslyn Academy. In 1976, the Baptist Mission of Kenya assumed joint operation of the school, which currently has three hundred students, 80 per cent of whom are from missionary families. The missionaries of the Baptist Mission of Kenya are employees of the Foreign Mission Board of Southern Baptist Convention, with its headquarters in United States; and, therefore, the membership cannot be considered to be made of free will as alleged by the claimants. Their main purpose is to provide a christian educational programme in line with the American curriculum to families in Eastern Africa, particularly to families employs by christian agencies. In essence, the academy, which employs fourteen (14) unionizable employees, is non-denominational in practice and self-supporting institution whose funds accrue from the school fees which cover the entire operating budget of the school, including staff salaries, housing and all other benefits.

The respondents averred that in 1978, the interested party unionized a number of their employees and operated a check-off system with which they complied. But they could not immediately recognize the interested party due to the latter's failure to recruit more than 50 per cent of the employees in accordance with the provisions of the Trade Disputes Act, Cap. 234. The respondents pointed out that in 1986, the claimants came on to the scene, purported to recruit a simple majority of the employees and confused them by false promises. As a result of this confusion, the employees resigned their membership from the union of the interested party and joined the claimants who falsely promised them immediate improvement in their terms of service. However, the employees have to-date continued to enjoy the terms and conditions of service which were offered to them prior to this dispute.

The respondents stated that the claimants approached them with a check-off for purposes of recognition, but they declined to accord it to them on the ground that the interested party was also contending for the representation of their employees. They called a meeting with a view to finding out from the employees themselves which union they favoured, but majority of the employees were dissatisfied and confused about the two unions. In 1987, the claimants submitted a check-off list, which was duly honoured but the respondents refused to recognize them because they were not the appropriate union. Hence this dispute.

The respondents referred to rule 3 (a) of the claimants' constitution, and contended that a voluntary association should be taken to mean an organization which has no paid staff and offers services without payment. On the contrary, their employees are not volunteers, working without salaries; and they, the respondents, do not offer any services without pay.

The respondents argued that it is a declared policy of this country that an employer can recognize and deal with only one trade union most suitable or appropriate to its activities, and it was in pursuance of this policy that they decided not to recognize the claimants. It is also a generally accepted principle in industrial relations practice that schools, churches and related institutions normally fall within the sphere of the interested party's domain.

Indeed, it was due to this that the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Labour, requested the claimants on 14th December, 1989, to specify the areas in which their union was involved, and were also advised therein to take into consideration the other trade union's coverage and to avoid any areas of overlap of those which might cause friction. The claimants failed to heed the advice, and have continued to encroach into areas already covered by other unions.

The respondents contended that recruitment of a simple majority by a trade union per se should not be a basis for recognition for that particular union; and in order to promote in trial peace, an employer should only accord recognition to a trade union most suitable or appropriate to its industrial trade activities. The respondents, therefore, prayed the court that the claimants' demand for recognition should be rejected.

The interested party submitted that they have been in existence since 1940, representing employees in the educational sector, i.e. Government and private schools, including universities, colleges and other training institutions under the education at which provide education, whether for a fee or free of charge. The claimants' union was originally formed to represent the associations as shown by their 1985 returns, but they amended their constitution later to its present form in order to poach members from other unions and expand their area of jurisdiction. They said that the Government policy on trade unions deals with industrial sectoral activities of an enterprise, irrespective of ownership. On the unit unions classification submitted by the claimants, the interested party submitted that the former did not appreciate that the Government policy on industrial classification is not different from it, and that there is no law on such sectoral distribution which would necessitate reorganization of the trade union movement. The industrial union classification is based on the policy that there should be large, strong and viable trade unions as opposed to small, weak, fragmented and financially unstable "graft unions" which were in existence in this country in the early 1960s. This classification, they said, is based on the historical development of the country's trade union movement; and any further fragmentation of the unions would take them back to pre-COTU stage and turn them into small craft unions.

The interested party denied that they are a "general union" as alleged by the claimants, but, on the contrary, are a large industrial union, representing members in several sectors of the industry. They averred that the wages orders, which were referred to by the claimants in their submission, form the basis for contracts of employment, i.e. in respect of minimum wages and terms and conditions of employment for all employees in the country. Other wages orders are made for particular sectors, and are applicable to undertakings or concerns or part of such undertakings or concerns only. Under the circumstances, it is, therefore, clear that the law looks at the principal activity of an undertaking or concern and not at the nature of its ownership or organization. They said that they strongly supported the advice given by the Federation of Kenya Employers (F.K.E.) on the matter, and submitted that a trade union can only lawfully attract members to itself from a particular undertaking or concern if it is the suitable and appropriate union to represent them. They argued that the claimants should be debarred from interfering with the smooth industrial relations that exists between them and the respondents. The interested party pointed out that rule 3 (a) of their constitution caters for the activities of the respondents. It states as follows:

"Membership of the union shall be open to all employees engaged in private houses or homes, flats, apartments, clubs, guest houses, bakeries, sweets and biscuit making factories, hotels, restaurants, cations, catering and similar establishments providing lodging, food, beverages or both and further categories of related establishments providing tourism services, educational institutions including schools, polytechnics, training centres, universities and university colleges, mass media institutions, radios, televisions and recording studios, social services including children and old-age homes, all service non-Governmental organizations and projects associated with them, private hospitals including nursing training centres, nursing homes, clinics including dispensaries, religious institutions including christian churches, muslim mosques, hindu temples and all other institutions and projects associated with them provided that such employees are of the apparent age of sixteen years."

They, therefore, urged the court to find that they are the appropriate union to represent the employees of the respondents, that the claimants are longer a valid trade union lawfully entitled to operate in Kenya and that the Registrar of Trade Unions be notified to deregister the claimants' union. Finally the interested party prayed the court to reject the claimants' demand for recognition.

In this dispute, the claimants have addressed unnecessary and lengthy theoretical and academic arguments to the court, but the function of this court is not to decide or be guided by such considerations divorced from the facts of the case before it. The court is guided by the principles of law laid down in the Trade Disputes Act, Cap. 234, Laws of Kenya. Thus, in dealing with industrial adjudication, it would be undesirable to reach conclusions the adoption of such a theoretical or doctrinaire approach has, in the context of to-day, lost most of its validity.

A thorough scrutiny and perusal of the documentary evidence on record, the court finds that Rosslyn Academy is operated or run jointly by the Mennonite Board of East Africa and the Baptist Mission of Kenya, and the

decision-making body is the Board of Governors. In its newsletter for the 1986/7 calendar year, under the heading "Organization and Philosophy", it is stated: *inter alia*, that:

"Rosslyn Academy provides an American based educational curriculum.The school has a christian but non-denominational philosophy. Children from non-church related families and organizations are welcome if they are in sympathy with the general philosophy of the school.students are expected to participate in all subject areas including religious instruction.

Within a christian context Rosslyn Academy seeks to emphasize the development of the social, the physical, and the academic capacities of each student."

In his message therein, the principal stated in extenso as follows:

"Rosslyn Academy is an educational opportunity for youth. The school's North American curriculum emphasizes basic language and computational skills. Learning and study occur in a multi-national, multiracial and multi-cultural community. Students learn about other peoples not only by reading but also from interacting with them for the world in microcosm is present in the classrooms. Rosslyn's most unique characteristic is its provision of christian education. Christian staff members reinforce the parents' christian training by modelling and teaching christian values. It is the desire of the school to help each child develop his or her God-given potential."

Under the heading "curriculum", the subjects which are taught at Rosslyn's comprise of:

"Elementary:

The usual offerings in the first six grade including language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, art, music, physical education, and religious education.

Junior high (grades 7-9):

Basic courses offered are:

Maths	Foreign language
English	Computer
Science	Physical education
History/Geography	Religious Education
Electives: Art, Industrial arts, music, choir and drama are available on an elective basis.	

Grade 8 algebra and grade 9 geometry available with teacher and principal recommendation."

It is evident from the foregoing that Rosslyn Academy is primarily an educational institution, operated or run jointly by the Mennonite Board of East Africa and the Baptist Mission of Kenya and the decision-making body is the Board of Governors. The activities of the academy are limited to imparting education or academic training to students and making them intellectually equipped. But there exists a good deal of incomprehension as to what education consists of. The aim of education is not merely to load the memory of students with thoughts of other men. The great aim of education is to discipline rather than to furnish the mind; to train the mind to the use of its own powers rather than to fill it with the accumulations by others. This can be fully accomplished by assisting the developments both of the body and the mind and by enriching the mind with intellectual, moral and emotional culture. Education seeks to build up the personality of the student by assisting his or her physical, intellectual, moral and emotional development. Education is thus more a mission and a vocation than a profession or trade or business.

The work of imparting education is carried on with the assistance and co-operation of teachers and lecturers. In the process of developing the personality of the students a fixed curriculum of study is necessary but that does not serve the entire purpose. Over and above classroom teachings on fixed curriculum, it is necessary that a student should be afforded facilities to improve his or her physique in gymnasiums, to develop his or her team spirit in fields or sport, to cultivate himself or herself in debating societies and to fulfill himself or herself by acquisition of knowledge in fine art and aesthetics. An educational institution is an educational institution unless it provides also for all or most of these other branches of education over and above what it teaches in classrooms.

Then, there is another and very important aspect to be considered, which is relevant to this case. The services rendered by non-teaching staff, like accountants, library clerks, bearers, gate-men and others are in the nature of personal services, and their association with an educational institution must not be taken to degenerate educational institutions into religious, voluntary or charitable organizations and convert these clerical and menial staff into religious, voluntary and charitable employees. It is true that, like all educational institutions, Rosslyn Academy employs subordinate staff who does work assigned to it; but in the main scheme of imparting education, this subordinate staff plays such a minor and insignificant part that it would be unreasonable, futile and idle to contend that the claimants are competent, under rule 3 (a) of their

constitution, to represent them, and the academy could not reconcile itself to being called religious or voluntary or charitable association.

At page 6 in cause No. 70 of 1989 between the claimants and Baptist Publications House and the Kenya Union of Printing, Publishing, Paper Manufacturers and Allied Workers, this court observed, *inter alia*, that:

"a majority of membership alone by itself is not indeed the criteria on which recognition disputes can be decided. The court has also.....consistently upheld the system of industrial trade unionism that has developed over the years in Kenya..... and boasts of a negotiating machinery which conforms very closely with the industrial trade unionism.

It should also be remembered that, although the workers in Kenya are guaranteed freedom of association, such freedom has got to be exercised in accordance with the established industrial relations system prevailing in this country."

That being the position in law, and on consideration of the entire arguments of the parties and the circumstances of this matter, it is our considered opinion that the prayer of the claimants to be recognized by the respondents cannot be granted as it will weaken the peaceful industrial atmosphere and create unnecessary conflicts, chaos and confusion. The interested party are the rightful and appropriate union to be recognized by the respondents. If the employees have any complaints regarding the terms and conditions of their employment, then they should channel them through the interested party, who will no doubt make the necessary representation to the respondents.

THE INDUSTRIAL COURT

CAUSE NO. 33 OF 1994

Parties:

Nalin Nail Works Limited

and

Kenya Engineering Workers Union

Issue in Dispute:

That the normal week for employees (other than security staff) shall consist of 45 hours spread-over 6 days of the week.

Nalin Nail Works Limited shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and the Kenya Engineering Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 19th July, 1994, and 16th February, 1995, respectively. The parties relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute, Form "A" undated duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 24th March, 1994, together with statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The claimants are a limited liability company based at Nairobi industrial area with a subsidiary at Ruiru Urban Council of Kiambu District. Their main business is manufacturing of wire products such as nails, chain links, etc.

The claimants submitted that their company had been operating on the basis of 45 hours spread-over 6 days of the week until January, 1987, when the Government directed that employees should work a 5 day week. However, after a few months the directive on 5 day week was revoked.

The claimants submitted that they continued to work on 5 day week until in 1992, when the system created same working problems. As a result, the respondents were approached with a view to amend the working hours clause to spread it over 6 days working week. However, the demand was rejected by the respondents.

The claimants submitted that their demand is based on three grounds. Firstly, the issue affects the productivity and overall operation of the

company. Secondly it is aimed at streamlining the working days in the company. At present the management and other non-unionisable staff work for 6 days. Whereas the unionisable staff work for 5 days and yet they are the ones who play a major role in production. Lastly the claimants stated that all their competitors whom they cited such as Special Steel Mills Limited, Ganjivan Wire Galvanising Mills Limited, and Ganjivan Screws and Fasteners Limited, work on 6 day week.

They stressed that to be competitive enough there is need to increase efficiency and productivity. As a result, more profits would be generated which could in turn be used for creating job opportunities. They felt that, their demand is both in the interest of the employees and the company respectively.

They finally pleaded with the court to find their demand as most reasonable and award in their favour

The respondents submitted that since 1986, their members have been working on 5 day week without any obstacle. They added that during the same period the production had remained high than ever before. The claimants stressed that revoking of Legal Notice No. 17 of 1987 did not stop parties from negotiating freely on terms and conditions of employment.

They concluded their case by submitting that since 1st May, 1986, to-date is over 8 years. At the same time the parties have negotiated and concluded four (4) collective agreements and neither party has ever complained of anything. The respondents went on to say that the current working arrangements has more advantages to the parties and the court should not disturb it. They prayed the court to retain the 5 day working week.

This is one of those rare cases where the employer has brought the dispute against a union in that the employer wants his employees to work the 45 hours per week stipulated in the collective agreement, spread-over 6 days of the week instead of the present arrangement whereby the workers do 45 hours in five days from Monday to Friday.

The respondents bitter complaint is that their employees are not giving them full 45 hours work for which they are being paid because at present the workers just leave the factory for 15 minutes or so to have a snack during which time production is lost. Moreover the workers performance in the afternoon leaves a lot to be desired as they become slack and lethargic.

The workers of course deny this and allege that production has not dropped if anything it has increased over the years.

As per the parties collective agreement the workers are required to work 45 hours per week and they have over the years refused to agree to the claimants demand that they work 45 hours spread-over six days. They have refused to work on Saturdays and have also refused to agree to an official lunch break of half an hour by starting work earlier or by working late during the week days to compensate for the half an hour lunch break.

The court finds that the present arrangement whereby workers supposedly work non-stop for 9 hours Monday to Friday is most unsatisfactory and contravenes "workers health" labour practices. The fact that they sneak out for 15 minutes for a quick snack is most undesirable because they do not get an opportunity to have atleast half an hour rest and be away from the terrible noise in the factory.

The court cannot allow this state of affairs to continue, even though the workers say they are happy with it, because atleast half an hour's rest every day is beneficial to the workers health and well-being in the long run.

The court, however, does not see the need to revert to a 6 day working week after all these years. The answer lies in either workers reporting half an hour earlier every day or leaving work half an hour late with a lunch break of half an hour every day.

The court must point out to the workers that their employer is entitled to get full 45 hours work per week from them because he is paying them for that.

Considering all the circumstances of this dispute the court awards that the workers should either report for work half an hour earlier or leave half an hour late with half an hour lunch break. They can make their choice in consultations with the claimants and the respondents and the court gives them until the end of June, 1995 for this.

The court rules that the new arrangement along the above lines should be implemented with effect from 1st July, 1995.
