THE TRADE DISPUTES ACT

(Cap. 234)

COLLECTION OF TRADE UNION DUES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 45 of the Trade Disputes Act, the Minister for Labour and Human Resource Development—

(a) orders every employer who employs not less than five (5) members of the Kenya National Union of Private Schools Teachers and Allied Workers to—

(i) deduct, every month the sum specified in the schedule in respect of trade union dues from the wages of his/her employees who are members of that trade union;

(ii) pay, within ten (10) days of the date of deduction, the total sums deducted under item one (1) of the schedule by crossed cheque made payable into the account of the Kenya National Union of Private Schools Teachers and Allied Workers account No. 0112041247900 at the Co-operative Bank of Kenya Limited, Ukulima Co-operative House branch;

(iii) pay, within ten (10) days of the date of deduction, the total sums deducted under item two (2) of the schedule by crossed cheque made payable to the Central Organization of Trade Unions (K) into that organization's account No. 229-741-204 at the Kenya Commercial Bank Limited, Moi Avenue Branch, Nairobi;

(iv) notify that trade union and the organization in writing within one (1) month of the payment;

(v) make written returns to the Registrar of Trade Unions within one (1) month of making all the payments to that trade union and to the organization.

SCHEDULE

Deductions:

(a) The sum of one hundred and fifty shillings (KSh. 150) per month.

(b) The sum of fifty shillings (KSh. 50) per month.

THE following notes are for the guidance of persons submitting "copy" for inclusion in the *Kenya Gazette, Supplement*, etc.:

- (1) The *Kenya Gazette* contains notices of a general nature which do not affect legislation. They are, therefore, submitted to the Government Printer directly.
 - (2) *Legislative Supplement* contains Rules and Regulations which are issued by the central Government. Because of this they must be submitted to the Government Printer through the office of the Attorney-General.
 - (3) *Bill Supplement* contains Bills which are for introduction in the National Assembly.
 - (4) *Act Supplement* contains Acts passed by the National Assembly.
- All "copy" submitted for publication should be prepared on one side of an A4 sheet no matter how small the notice is, each page being numbered, and should be typewritten with double spacing. Copy should be clear, legible and contain no alterations.
- Particular attention should be paid to the following points:
- (i) Signature must be supported by rubber-stamping or typing the name of the signatory in capital letters.
 - (ii) Dates must be correct and filled in where necessary.
 - (iii) Care should be taken to ensure that all headings to notices and references to legislation are up to date and conform with the Revised Edition of the Laws of Kenya.

EXTRACT FROM THE CODE OF REGULATIONS, SECTION D—***Kenya Gazette***

"D 40. (1) Communications for the *Kenya Gazette* should reach the Government Printer not later than 9 a.m. on Friday of the week before publication is desired. The Government Printer will not publish communications received after that hour until the next subsequent issue of the Gazette.

(2) Ministries will be required to pay for the *Kenya Gazette* and to meet the cost of advertising in it.

(3) It will facilitate work at the Press if Permanent Secretaries will forward Gazette notices to the Government Printer in time.

It is emphasized that these notes are for guidance only, but it is requested that persons submitting copy for publication first satisfy themselves that such copy is complete in every respect."
