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THE CENTRAL BANK OF KENYA ACT

(Cap. 491)

WITHDRAWAL OF BANK NOTES AND COINS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 22(3) of the Central Bank of Kenya Act, the Central Bank of Kenya gives notice as follows—

1. All the notes and coins of the denominations set out in the First Schedule, issued by the Central Bank of Kenya pursuant to Legal Notice No.252 of 1966 and Gazette Notice No.148 of 1966 are to be withdrawn.
2. All such notes and coins shall cease to be legal tender with effect from the 31st December, 2011.
3. All such notes and coins may, with effect from the 14th June, 2010 to the 30th June, 2011, be exchanged at their face value at any of the places specified in the Second Schedule, during normal working hours.
4. All such notes and coins may, with effect from the 1st July 2011 to the 31st December, 2011, be exchanged at their face value at the Central Bank of Kenya Head Office, Haile Sellassie Avenue, Nairobi during normal working hours.
5. All such notes and coins shall, with effect from the 31st December, 2011, no longer be exchanged.
