- (b) By a vote of not less than seventy five percent of all members of the county Assembly.

Report to the county assembly

According to section 5 (1)(a-f) of the County Government Act 2012, The County Board Public Services Board shall deliver a report each December to the county assembly.

- Since inception of the board, there has been no substantive budget allocation for the board. This has derailed the implementation of activities as per the board's work plan , including publishing and publizing information.
- 2. Lack of office for the last 3 months; The Executive written to the Board relocate to Bondo, but there is no official communication from Lands office which the Board is expected to occupy. The Board did not resolve to relocate to Bondo but it was a unilateral decision of the Executive. Moving to Bondo will have serious logistic challenges since the Board has no official means of transport, no office equipment and is yet to recruit her staff.
- Shortage of office furniture, ICT equipment Lack official means of transport.
- 4. Work load and pressure of work.
- Lack of Staff for the secretariat. This has affected the functioning of the secretariat let alone the board, and hampered storage, production of essential documents, as well as facilitation for activities.

Way Forward

 The board has prepared a budget which has been submitted to the interim Finance officer and the budget and appropriation

- committee of the county assembly, but so far there is no communication from the executive in charge of finance. The county Assembly to determine the Budget of the Public Service Board.
- Money to be allocated for Construction of offices Board offices.
- 3. Official vehicle and equipment to be bought.
- 4. The board to recruit her own staff.
- There should be structured mutual consultations between the Board and the Executive.

PART I-PRELIMINARY

- 1. (1) This Schedule shall take effect on the date of publication.
- (2) The Schedule shall take effect -
 - (a) with respect to a post-paid consumers for bills raised based on meter readings taken on or after the effective date; and
 - (b) with respect to pre-paid consumers for Units purchased on or after the effective date.
- (3) Subject to sub-paragraph (2), the tariffs set out in Part II-
 - paragraph 3 shall take effect on the date of publication of this Schedule;
 - (b) paragraph 4 shall take effect on 1st July, 2014; and
 - (c) paragraph 5 shall take effect on 1st July, 2015.
- 2. In this Schedule unless the context otherwise requires -

"Company" means the Kenya Power and Lighting Company Limited;

"consumer" means any person who is supplied with electrical energy, but does not include a person who is supplied with electrical energy for delivery or supply to another person;

"contract" means an agreement made between a consumer and the Company for supply of electrical energy, which is in force as at the date of commencement of this Schedule of Tariffs and includes all contracts entered into with consumers after this date:

"demand" means the maximum electric power demand drawn by a consumer during each post-paid billing period;

"demand charge" means a charge for demand supplied per kVa in each post-paid billing period, when applicable, with respect to the consumer category set out in Part II of the Schedule;

"electric power producer" means a person who owns or operates facilities for generation of electrical energy pursuant to a generating licence issued by the Commission;

"energy charge" means a charge per Unit consumed in each postpaid billing period or per Unit purchased in each pre-paid units purchase period, as the case may be, with respect to each consumer category as set in Part II;

"fixed charge" means the amount charged per post-paid billing period or pre-paid units purchase period, with respect to each consumer category as shown in Part II;

"Interconnected System" means works inclusive of power stations, electric supply lines electrically interconnected forming the main supply grid in the Republic of Kenya;

"KenGen" means the Kenya Electricity Generating Company Limited:

"kVA" means kilovolt Ampere;

"meter" means any kind of machine, device or instrument used for the measurement of the quantity of electrical energy, and includes such auxiliary appliances such as resistors, shunts, reactance, current transformers, voltage transformers and time switches, external and necessary to the meter;

"Off-Grid System" means works inclusive of power stations and electrical supply lines which are electrically and physically separate from the Interconnected System;

"post-paid billing period" means the period of time elapsing between the issuing of two consecutive bills by the Company, but with the exception of their first and last period, such period of time shall be as near to thirty days as possible;

"post- paid consumer" means a consumer who consumes electricity on credit and pays for it after receiving a bill from the Company in accordance to the terms and condition of supply;

"power factor" means the decimal fraction obtained by dividing the demand in kilowatts by the demand in kiloVolt amperes and shall be ascertained by suitable apparatus installed by the Company;

"pre-paid consumer" means a consumer who pays for electricity up-front, either by purchasing a top-up card or tokens from the Company or its agent in accordance to the terms and condition of supply and uses it to load Units to his or her pre-paid meter;

"pre-paid unit purchase period" means a calendar month;

"tariff" means the prices, rates, costs and all other charges including adjustments, formulae and other terms, conditions and information contained in parts II, III and IV of this Schedule;

"Unit" means one kiloWatt hour (kWh);

"units purchased" means electricity measured in kWh generated by the Company's power plants or electric power producers power plants delivered to and purchased by the Company.

 - (b) for Consumers charged under Methods CI the payment for electrical energy consumed and chargeable KVA of Demand in each Post-paid Billing Period (exclusive of VAT, Fuel Cost Charge, Foreign Exchange Rate Fluctuation Adjustment, REP and ERC levies) shall be increased by 2 per cent for each complete 1 per cent by which the Power Factor is below 0.90.
- Any apparatus installed by the Company for the purpose of ascertaining the power factor of any Consumer's installation or of any part thereof shall be installed and maintained at the sole expense of the Company.
- 4. The Company shall determine the voltage at which a supply of electrical energy shall be provided to any Consumer's supply terminals and this voltage shall be maintained by the Company subject to the permissible variations as provided for in the Act.

The Proponent (Paul Mulangilo Ndilo) is proposing to construct a petrol filling station with the following amenities; 2 twin pumps service bay, 2 underground petroleum storage tanks (UPSTs), a car wash, Oil Interceptors, Air and water points, Office and store, Changing and washrooms, Septic tank(s), a soak pit and associated piping work.

Below is a summary of the anticipated impacts and the proposed mitigation measures:

Air and dust pollution

- Isolating areas to be worked on this facilitate, minimize the amount of dust that may affect workers and adjacent areas.
- Create well defined and elaborate alternative passages during construction
