IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 44 (3) of the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act, 2013, the Cabinet Secretary for Environment, Natural Resources and Regional Development Authorities gazettes the Plan in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

MARSABIT FOREST ECOSYSTEM MANAGEMENT PLAN, 2015–2025

The Marsabit Forest Ecosystem Management Plan (hereinafter referred to as "the Plan") defines the principles and strategies that Marsabit forest stakeholders have designed to address forest and wildlife conservation, tourism development, and community livelihood issues in the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem. The Ecosystem covers two protected areas; the Marsabit National Reserve and the Marsabit Forest Reserve and adjacent community land within ten kilometres from the Marsabit National Reserve boundary.

The Plan emphasises that all the developments within the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem shall be in accordance with the Plan. The Plan is a dynamic document that shall be subject to periodic reviews, depending on emerging issues and new knowledge.

The success of this Plan hinges on stakeholders' commitment to follow through with implementation of activities outlined in this Plan. Therefore, to facilitate Plan implementation, Marsabit Forest Ecosystem Management Plan Implementation Committee (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") shall be formed to co-ordinate and oversee the implementation of the Plan. The committee shall be an advisory body comprising representatives from Kenya Forest Service, Kenya Wildlife Service, County Government of Marsabit and other Government and non-governmental agencies co-opted by these three organizations. The committee shall meet regularly to review progress in Plan implementation and make adjustments needed to enhance achievement of Marsabit Forest Ecosystem's management objectives. The committee will be chaired jointly by the Kenya Wildlife Service senior warden, Marsabit and the Kenya Forest Service Marsabit Ecosystem conservator. Progress in Plan implementation will be communicated with other relevant stakeholders with enough frequency to ensure that the Plan remains a living document.

The committee shall perform the following functions—

- co-ordinate the implementation of the Plan;
- mobilize resources for Plan implementation;
- monitor and evaluate the progress of activities;
- identify constraints in Plan implementation;
- produce annual progress reports on Plan implementation; and
- recommend review of the management Plan.

The Plan addresses threats to Marsabit Forest Ecosystem's conservation values through the following major policy and management intervention measures—

- (a) a moratorium on consumptive use of natural resources in the Marsabit Forest Reserve and Marsabit National Reserve shall be maintained during the ten year Plan duration;
- (b) the zoning scheme outlined in the Plan shall be implemented; and
- (c) five management programmes shall be implemented to achieve the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem management objectives.

The Plan's zoning scheme and management programmes are outlined in the following sections—

1. ZONATION SCHEME

The Marsabit Forest Ecosystem's zonation scheme seeks to support both the decentralised management of the ecosystem as well as the regulation and promotion of allowable land uses across the area.

To achieve this, the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem has been divided into three land use zones and three management sectors. Each of the three management sectors will be managed from a sector headquarters, which will be delegated management authority over the sector concerned. Each land use zone will focus on providing a different type of tourism experience based on the unique tourism resources in each zone. Further, to enhance forest protection the Marsabit Forest Reserve is divided into five patrol sectors.

2. MANAGEMENT PROGRAMMES

The Plan has five management programmes (Ecological Management Programme, Forest Resource Management Programme, Tourism Development and Management Programme, Community Partnership and Conservation Education Programme, and Protected Area Operations and Security Management Programme). Each management programme contains management objectives that set out the future desired state that the Plan implementers aim to achieve, and a set of specific management actions to achieve these objectives. In addition, to facilitate Plan implementation, each management programme has a three year Activity Plan, which breaks down the individual management actions into day-to-day management activities.

2.1 ECOLOGICAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The Plan seeks to abate threats to the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem habitats and maintain all biological connections. It also aims at ensuring that water availability for wildlife, livestock and the community is improved, conservation of Marsabit Forest Ecosystem threatened large mammal species is enhanced, ecological monitoring and research information dissemination is strengthened, and climate change mitigation and adaptation measures are enhanced. This shall be achieved through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) carry out a study to establish impacts of livestock incursions on vegetation structure and composition;
- (b) maintain ecological connectivity in the greater Marsabit Forest Ecosystem;
- (c) develop and implement a site specific alien and invasive species management plan;
- (d) develop and implement a Marsabit Forest Ecosystem fire management plan;
- (e) collaborate with Water Resources Management Authority in assessing and modelling status of key water sources;
- (f) assess the impacts of water abstraction on the ecosystem's water sources;
- (g) evaluate potential water pan and dam sites to supplement existing water sources;
- (h) support establishment of Water Resources Users Associations;
- (i) promote rainwater harvesting as a supplementary source of water;
- (j) monitor population size, structure and seasonal distribution of Marsabit Forest Ecosystem Elephants;
- (k) establish the elephant carrying capacity of Marsabit Forest Ecosystem;
- (l) carry out research on approaches to reduce human-elephant conflict;

- (m) monitor impacts of elephants on the structure of critical habitat;
- (n) carry out wildlife disease surveillance on species conservation targets;
- (o) identify and monitor Grevy's zebra breeding hotspots;
- (p) map distribution and monitor Grevy's and common zebra populations;
- (q) monitor large carnivores; and
- (r) conduct research on carnivore-local community interactions.

In addition, the plan recognizes that ecological monitoring and research information dissemination should be strengthened. To gain support and participation from the community, climate change mitigation and adaptation measures should be enhanced. To achieve this, the following actions shall be implemented—

- (a) carry out bio-diversity assessments in the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem protected areas;
- (b) assess gap in bio-diversity knowledge;
- (c) establish partnerships for the implementation of research and monitoring activities;
- (d) develop a research and monitoring program;
- (e) develop and equip a fully-fledged research centre;
- (f) create awareness on climate change among the local community;
- (g) improve water supply for people, livestock and wildlife in line with Marsabit Water Catchment Management Strategy;
- (h) control habitat degradation;
- (i) provide alternative sources of energy; and
- (j) carry out a study on impacts of livestock and human settlement on the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem protected areas.

2.2 FOREST RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The Plan seeks to ensure that Marsabit natural forest provides environmental goods and services sustainably, promote farm forestry and forest extension services, enhance community livelihoods through enterprise development, and enhance forest research. This shall be achieved through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) secure Marsabit forest;
- (b) carry out forest surveillance;
- (c) establish Community Forest Associations;
- (d) regulate access to forest resources;
- (e) rehabilitate degraded forest areas;
- (f) replace exotic plantations with suitable indigenous species;
- (g) control invasive species;
- (h) establish on-farm woodlots and arboreta;
- (i) promote forest extension services;
- (j) promote commercial tree farming;
- (k) collaborate with other stakeholders in forest extension services;
- (l) promote efficient use of wood fuel and alternative sources of energy;
- (m) promote dry land forestry and natural resource management;
- (n) promote income generating activities;
- (o) promote forest eco-tourism;
- (p) promote commercial insect farming e.g. apiculture, butterfly farming, and sericulture;
- (q) develop and implement a forest research plan;
- (r) gather and document indigenous traditional knowledge; and
- (s) enhance adoption of research outputs.

2.3 TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The Plan seeks to diversify tourism activities and attractions in environmentally appropriate ways, and improve and expand tourism facilities to support an increased number of tourists, and strengthen tourism administration and management. This shall be realised through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) establish walking and camel safaris;
- (b) design and establish nature trails;

- (c) establish non-traditional visitor activities such as night game drives and bush diners;
- (d) establish visitor activities focusing on the local domestic market;
- (e) develop distinct tourism products for each of the three Marsabit Forest Ecosystem Management Sectors;
- (f) identify and award tourism concessions;
- (g) establish Kenya Wildlife Service self-catering Bandas;
- (h) designate and establish campsites;
- (i) develop tourist information materials;
- (j) develop visitor interpretation facilities;
- (k) market the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem through the internet and other media;
- (l) organise tourism promotional activities and events;
- (m) develop and maintain tourist information centres at the gates;
- (n) brand the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem to give it a distinct identity; and
- (o) introduce and maintain appropriate transport services for local visitors.

2.4 COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP AND CONSERVATION EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The Plan seeks to improve Protected Area—community communication and collaboration mechanisms, strengthen Conservation Education and awareness programme, promote conservation compatible land uses and practices on Protected Area adjacent areas, reduce human wildlife conflict, and improve opportunities for local communities to benefit from the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem. This shall be accomplished through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) establish location wildlife conservation associations;
- (b) strengthen the relationship between Kenya Wildlife Service / Kenya Forest Service and firewood collectors, farmers and pastoralist associations;
- (c) use different communication platforms to highlight conservation issues;
- (d) establish and equip a conservation education centre;
- (e) redesign the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem conservation education programme to target key community strata;
- (f) develop a community outreach strategy;
- (g) collaborate with the local community groups in enhancing conservation education and awareness creation;
- (h) develop alternative sources of livelihood for community members dependent on forest resources;
- (i) supply water for domestic and livestock use to the local community;
- (j) improve management of communal grazing areas;
- (k) develop a local level land use plan focusing on securing wildlife corridors;
- (l) support establishment of conservancies;
- (m) promote fuel-efficient stoves;
- (n) install and maintain electric fences in human-wildlife conflict prone areas;
- (o) improve problem animal control strategies;
- (p) improve the wildlife compensation claims processing system;
- (q) establish and maintain a human-wildlife conflict database;
- (r) employ local community members in the wildlife and forest sectors;
- (s) develop community nature-based initiatives and support enhancement of other livelihood activities;
- (t) support production of eco-friendly charcoal; and
- (u) develop a mechanism to enable regulated access to cultural sites.

2.5 PROTECTED AREA OPERATIONS AND SECURITY MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The Plan aims to formalize and strengthen institutional collaborations, improve performance and motivation of Marsabit Forest Ecosystem staff, safeguard Marsabit Forest Ecosystem natural resources and visitors, and improve infrastructure to support Protected

Area management and tourism development. This will be achieved through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) draw and implement a memorandum of agreement regarding the implementation of the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem Management Plan;
- (b) collaborate with the National Land Commission and Marsabit County Government to secure critical wildlife habitats such as corridors and dispersal areas located outside the Protected Area boundary;
- (c) establish and operationalise a resource users forum to encourage participatory natural resource management in the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem;
- (d) collaborate with National and County administration in management of natural resources in the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem;
- (e) collaborate with other stakeholders in maintaining the current moratorium on consumptive use of forest products in the Marsabit Forest Reserve or the Marsabit National Reserve;
- (f) collaborate with Marsabit County Government to control livestock incursion and human encroachment in the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem protected areas;
- (g) implement rules and regulations for livestock grazing in the National Reserve as per the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act, 2013;
- (h) implement the sector-based management organisational structure;
- (i) strengthen staff capacity at the Marsabit Forest Ecosystem;
- (j) train staff in relevant skills;
- (k) improve staff welfare and motivation;
- (l) intensify security patrols;
- (m) strengthen security capacity;
- (n) collect and analyse intelligence information;
- (o) train security staff in court procedures and relevant laws;
- (p) construct, rehabilitate and maintain Marsabit Forest Ecosystem roads;
- (q) construct, rehabilitate and maintain buildings;
- (r) procure and maintain vehicles, plants and equipment;
- (s) improve telecommunications;
- (t) construct and maintain other essential infrastructure e.g. gates, sign posts, fire towers, fire rating boards;
- (u) provide utilities e.g. water, electricity and sanitation to offices and residential houses;
- (v) construct and maintain fences; and
- (w) develop and implement an emergency and disaster preparedness plan.

The Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area Management Plan (hereinafter referred to as "the Plan") defines the principles and strategies that stakeholders of the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area have designed to address conservation, tourism development and management, community livelihood issues, and protected area administrative issues in the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area. The Marine Protected Area covers two protected areas, Kisite Marine National Park and Mpunguti Marine National Reserve, and adjacent public and community land.

The Plan emphasises that all activities within the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area shall be in accordance with the Plan and the Wildlife Conservation and Management Act, 2013.

The Plan is a dynamic document that shall be subject to periodic reviews, depending on emerging issues and new knowledge.

The success of this plan hinges on stakeholders' commitment to follow through with implementation of activities outlined in this plan. Therefore, to facilitate plan implementation, a Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area Management Committee (hereinafter "the committee") shall be formed to co-ordinate and oversee the implementation of the Plan. The committee shall be an advisory body comprising representatives from Kenya Wildlife Service, tourism stakeholders, community representatives, security agents, researchers, County Government of Kwale, and other relevant Government and non-governmental agencies. The committee shall meet regularly to review progress in plan implementation and make adjustments needed to enhance achievement of Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's management objectives. The committee shall be chaired by the Warden, Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area. Progress in plan implementation will be communicated with other relevant stakeholders with enough frequency to ensure that the plan remains a living document.

The committee shall perform the following functions—

- (a) co-ordinate the implementation of the Plan;
- (b) mobilize resources for Plan implementation;
- (c) monitor and evaluate the progress of activities;
- (d) identify constraints in plan implementation;
- (e) produce annual progress reports on plan implementation; and
- (f) recommend review of the management plan.

The Plan addresses threats to Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's conservation values through the following major policy and management intervention measures—

- (a) strengthening co-management of Mpunguti Marine National Reserve;
- (b) implementing the Zoning scheme outlined in the Plan; and
- (c) implementing management actions under the five management programmes.

The Plan's zoning scheme and management programmes are outlined in the following sections—

1. ZONING SCHEME

The Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's zoning scheme seeks to support the regulation and promotion of allowable uses across the area and to reconcile different types and intensity of use in different parts of the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area.

To achieve this, the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area has been divided into four resource use zones (Core Protection Zone, Partially Protected Zone, Multiple Use Zone and Livelihood Intervention Zone). In addition, for tourism purposes the area has been divided into two visitor use zones (High Use Zone and Low Use Zone).

2. MANAGEMENT PROGRAMMES

The Plan has five management programmes (Ecological Management Programme, Tourism Development and Management Programme, Fisheries Resource Management Programme, Community Partnership and Conservation Education Programme, and Marine Protected Area Operations and Security Management Programme). Each management programme contains management objectives that set out the future desired state that the Plan implementers aim to achieve, and a set of specific management actions to achieve these objectives. In addition, to facilitate plan implementation, each management programme has a three year Activity Plan, which breaks down the individual management actions into day-to-day management activities.

2.1 ECOLOGICAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The plan seeks to protect and restore rare, endemic or threatened species, maintain marine ecosystems in a healthy functioning state, and understand and appreciate the marine biodiversity. This shall be achieved through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) conduct surveys on turtle nesting sites and habitat utilization;
- (b) disseminate information and increase public awareness on sea turtles conservation and management;
- (c) conduct inventories of key species;
- (d) implement the national survey of dugong report detailed by the Convention on Migratory Species;
- (e) disseminate information and raise awareness about dugong in the area;
- (f) lobby for and contribute to the development of a National Marine Mammal Conservation Strategy;
- (g) develop a research and monitoring programme on species conservation targets;
- (h) assess the level of human and marine mammals (dolphin and whale) interactions and raise awareness about potential threats through training and education;
- (i) conduct economic valuation of Dolphin and Whale watching industry;
- (j) implement measures to reduce coral reef damage;
- (k) mainstream the implementation of the national coral reef and sea grass conservation strategy;
- (l) support the restoration and rehabilitation of Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's mangrove ecosystem;
- (m) enhance the conservation and rehabilitation of Shimoni and Wasini forests;
- (n) conduct research on the ecology of sea grass beds;
- (o) control access to critical habitats (coral reefs, sea grass and mangrove forest);
- (p) conduct research on restoration and rehabilitation of critical habitats;
- (q) control harvesting of aquarium fish;
- (r) conduct a review of existing information and research on climate change;
- (s) raise awareness on climate change impacts, mitigation and adaptation measures;
- (t) conduct long-term and short term surveys of all critical habitats and species;
- (u) conduct studies on fishing vessels, gear use, and catch levels;
- (v) conduct a visitor impact study;
- (w) promote research collaboration and dissemination of information;
- (x) develop a central data and information management system;
- (y) develop an ecological monitoring programme; and
- (z) review and revise protected area management effectiveness with managers.

2.2 TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AND MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

This plan seeks to provide adequate tourism support infrastructure and equipment, diversify tourist activities and attractions, and improve marketing of Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's tourism. To

achieve this, the following management actions shall be implemented—

- (a) liaise with other stakeholders in the development of tourist accommodation facilities;
- (b) upgrade and maintain Shimoni cottages;
- (c) develop and maintain public campsites and picnic sites;
- (d) offer tourist excursion services;
- (e) liaise with the Ministry of Tourism to establish a tourist circuit that connects south coast to the mainland;
- (f) facilitate establishment of board walks;
- (g) liaise with NMK to develop and maintain historical and cultural resources in the greater KMMPA;
- (h) liaise with the Ministry responsible for Tourism in promoting homestays;
- (i) develop and maintain nature trails;
- (j) promote ornithological safaris;
- (k) promote primate-viewing in Shimoni forest;
- (l) promote wreck diving;
- (m) promote canoe safaris;
- (n) introduce two or three-day tour packages;
- (o) conduct market research;
- (p) up-grade and regularly update the Kenya Wildlife Service website to improve marketing of Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (q) develop and update a tourist map, guide book and brochure;
- (r) install and maintain information materials at strategic locations;
- (s) promote domestic tourism;
- (t) encourage tour companies to include community projects in their tour packages;
- (u) liaise with Wildlife Clubs of Kenya to develop a marketing strategy targeting schools and citizens;
- (v) work with tourism stakeholders to disseminate tourism information; and
- (w) organise and promote local events.

In addition, visitor administration and management systems shall be improved through the following actions—

- (a) review and update the current visitor code;
- (b) develop local visitor handling standards for tour operators and enhance security enforcement;
- (c) develop and implement dolphin watching guidelines;
- (d) liaise with the Ministry responsible for tourism to organize regular workshops for boat or beach operators;
- (e) train local conservation groups in tourism management best practices;
- (f) minimise effects of waste generated by visitors;
- (g) establish a Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's tourism forum; and
- (h) conduct a study to assess the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's visitor carrying capacity.

2.3 FISHERIES RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The plan seeks to strengthen the regulatory frameworks, enforcement and surveillance capabilities on fishing activities, enhance linkages between research and fishery management, enhance stakeholder participation in fishery management, develop and implement alternative sources of livelihoods to fisher folk, and assess impacts of emerging issues on fisheries resources. This shall be achieved through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) lobby for the gazettelement of more effective Marine Protected Area Regulations;
- (b) develop and implement a Memorandum of Understanding between Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries and Kenya Wildlife Service to manage areas of overlap within the Marine Protected Area;
- (c) conduct conservation awareness to magistrates and prosecutors to enhance justice for fisheries resources;

- (d) empower Beach Management Units to execute their mandate;
- (e) establish a Kenya Wildlife Service research sub-station at Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (f) establish fisheries research data base at Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (g) carry out priority research focused on addressing pertinent fisheries issues;
- (h) establish an information sharing and exchange programme;
- (i) formalise relations between state and non-state players of environment and natural resource management;
- (j) establish a vibrant Marine Protected Area Management Committee;
- (k) participate in County administrative forums;
- (l) initiate and implement fish farming;
- (m) support establishment of community managed marine conservancies;
- (n) promote sea weed farming;
- (o) tap into devolved funds to assist alternative livelihood ventures for communities;
- (p) participate in development and review of Kwale County Fisheries Development Plan;
- (q) involve Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area representatives in Environmental Impact Assessments and Environmental Audits for major coastal projects; and
- (r) explore the impacts of emerging fishing methods on fish stocks.

2.4 COMMUNITY PARTNERSHIP AND CONSERVATION EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The plan seeks to strengthen community participation in natural resource management, minimise resource use conflicts and human-wildlife conflicts within Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area and adjacent areas, and improve awareness of the significance of conserving marine resources. This shall be accomplished through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) strengthen community conservation groups;
- (b) carry out an evaluation of previous and on-going community projects;
- (c) conduct capacity assessment of existing community groups;
- (d) train conservation community groups in project management;
- (e) support community empowerment activities in the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (f) support establishment of community based tourism enterprise projects;
- (g) support establishment and registration of a community based tourism operators association;
- (h) document resource use conflict areas within the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (i) control access of migrant fishermen to Kenyan fishery;
- (j) support establishment and operationalisation of a Community Wildlife Association;
- (k) explore alternative Problem Animal Control methods;
- (l) improve Human-Wildlife Conflict response time;
- (m) nominate and recommend gazettelement of a Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area Honorary Warden;
- (n) provide support to enhance the compensation claim process;
- (o) organise outreach and awareness creation activities in areas adjacent to Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (p) liaise with other conservation education stakeholders to improve use of Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area by local schools;
- (q) revive and strengthen conservation clubs;
- (r) construct a student hostel at Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's offices;
- (s) construct and equip a resource centre at Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's offices;
- (t) up-grade and up-date Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's education and outreach tools; and
- (u) strengthen the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's education staff and capacity.

2.5 MARINE PROTECTED AREA OPERATIONS AND SECURITY MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME

The plan aims to strengthen human resource capacity within Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area, establish strategic collaborative partnerships, and develop and maintain infrastructure to support Marine Protected Area management. This will be achieved through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) liaise with Human Capital Department for deployment of staff with skills in marine conservation and management;
- (b) improve staff skills;
- (c) improve staff welfare;
- (d) implement staff recognition, reward and appreciation schemes;
- (e) develop a partnership strategy for management of the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (f) develop formal collaborative agreements with key stakeholders;
- (g) strengthen the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's Management Committee;
- (h) work with County Wildlife Conservation and Compensation Committee to address conservation issues in the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (i) liaise with Kenya Maritime Authority and Fisheries Department to inspect sea worthiness of tour boats and fishing vessels;
- (j) establish and operationalise friends of Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area lobby group;
- (k) develop and implement initiatives that will enable effective management of Diani Chale Marine National Reserve;
- (l) provide appropriate transport equipment;
- (m) construct and maintain jetties;
- (n) construct and maintain the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area office buildings;
- (o) construct and maintain a modern Visitor Information Center;
- (p) provide and maintain adequate staff housing;
- (q) supply fresh water to the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area's Headquarters;
- (r) provide appropriate office furniture and equipment;
- (s) improve communication within the Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area;
- (t) mark and maintain boundaries and acquire title deeds for all KWS Plots in Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area and adjacent areas;
- (u) liaise with Kenya Forest Service in the Management of Shimoni Forest;
- (v) install and maintain mooring buoys; and
- (w) remove and prevent marine litter in Kisite-Mpunguti Marine Protected Area.

In addition, security operations will be strengthened through implementation of the following actions—

- (a) control poaching in collaboration with stakeholders;
- (b) up-grade outposts and provide appropriate equipment to security personnel;
- (c) collaborate with police and judiciary in enhancing prosecution of wildlife offences; and
- (d) conduct joint patrols.

(No. 19 of 2012)

LEADERSHIP AND INTEGRITY CODE FOR STATE OFFICERS IN THE COUNTY ASSEMBLY OF KILIFI

PURSUANT to section 37 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012, the County Assembly of Kilifi establishes Leadership and Integrity Code to be observed by and binding upon State Officers in the County Assembly.

PART I—STATEMENT OF INTENT

A Leadership and Integrity Code for State Officers in the County Assembly of Kilifi made pursuant to the provisions of section 37 of the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012 and to give effect to Chapter Six of the Constitution of Kenya. The Code is intended to establish standards of integrity and ethical conduct in the leadership and management of public affairs of the County Assembly by ensuring that the State Officers respect the values, principles and provisions of the Constitution and other applicable laws or policies on the standards of conduct and performance expected of holders of public office in the discharge of their duties.

PART II—PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

1. This code may be cited as the Leadership and Integrity Code for State Officers in the County Assembly of Kilifi.

2. This Code shall come into operation within seven days of its publication in the Kenya Gazette.

3. In this code, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Act” means the Leadership and Integrity Act, 2012; [No. 19 of 2012];

“Accounting Officer” means the Clerk of the County Assembly;

“Assembly” means the County Assembly of Kilifi or a Committee of the County Assembly;

“CASB” means the Kilifi County Assembly Service Board;

“Authorized Officer” means the Speaker of the County Assembly or his designate;

“Bank Account” has the meaning assigned to it under section 2 of the Act;

“Code” means the Leadership and Integrity Code for State Officers in the County Assembly of Kilifi;

“Commission” means the Ethics and Anti-Corruption Commission established under section 3 of the Ethics and Anti-corruption commission Act, No. 22 of 2011;

“Office” means the County Assembly or a Committee of the County Assembly;

“Personal Interest” means a matter in which a State Officer has a direct or indirect pecuniary or non-pecuniary interest and includes the interest of this or her spouse, child, business associate or agent;

“Public Officer” has the meaning assigned to it under Article 260 of the Constitution;

“Regulations” means the Regulations made by the Ethics and Anti-Corruption commission pursuant to section 54 of the Act;

“Serving State Officer” means a State Officer who is in office at the time of commencement of this Code;

“State Officer” means a Member of the County Assembly of Kilifi;

4. (1) The provisions of Chapter Six of the Constitution, the Leadership and Integrity Act, the Public Officer Ethics Act 2003 and shall form part of the code.

5. (1) A State Officer elected to the County Assembly shall sign and commit to this Code at the time of taking oath of office or within seven days of assuming office.

(2) A serving State Officer shall sign and commit to this Code within seven days of the publication of the Code in the Gazette.

(3) The declaration of commitment to the Code shall take the form and structure set out in the First Schedule to this Code.

PART II—REQUIREMENTS

6. (1) A State Officer shall respect and abide by the Constitution and all other laws.

(2) A State Officer shall carry out the duties of his or her office in accordance with the law.

(3) In carrying out the duties of his or her office, a State Officer shall not violate the rights and fundamental freedoms of any person.

7. A State Office is a position of public trust and the authority and responsibility vested in a State Officer shall be exercised by the State Officer in the best interest of the office and the people of Kenya.

8. Subject to the constitution and any other law, a State Officer shall take personal responsibility for the reasonably foreseeable consequences of any actions or omissions arising from the discharge of the duties of his or her office.

9. A State Officer shall, to the best of his or her ability—

- (a) carry out the duties of the office efficiently and honestly;
- (b) carry out the duties of the office in a transparent and accountable manner;
- (c) keep accurate records and documents relating to the functions of the office; and
- (d) report truthfully on all matters of the office.

10. A State Officer shall—

- (a) carry out the duties of his or her office in a manner that maintains Public confidence in the integrity of the office
- (b) treat members of the public, staff and other state and public officers with courtesy and respect;
- (c) to the extent appropriate to the office, maintain high standards of performance and level of professionalism within the office and;
- (d) if the State Officer is a member of a professional body, observe and subscribe to the ethical and professional requirements of that body in so far as the requirements do not contravene the Constitution, any other law or this Code.

11. (1) A State Officer shall not use his or her office to unlawfully or wrongfully enrich himself or herself or any other person.

(2) Subject to article 76(2) (b) of the Constitution a State Officer shall not accept a personal loan or benefit which may compromise the State Officer in carrying out his or her duties.

(3) A State Officer shall submit an initial declaration of income, assets and liabilities within thirty days of assuming office and thereafter make biennial declarations to the office, and a final declaration within (30) days of ceasing to be a State Officer.

(4) The Declaration under sub-paragraph (3) shall be submitted to the County Assembly Service Board.

(5) A declaration filed by a State Officer in accordance with the provisions of sub-paragraph (3) shall be accessible to the Commission and any other person, subject to the provisions of Section 30 of the Public Officer Ethics Act, 2003.

(6) A State Officer shall pay any taxes, loans or other debts due from him within the prescribed period.

(7) A State Officer shall not neglect their financial, family or other legal obligations.

12. (1) A State Officer shall observe and maintain the following ethical and moral requirements—

- (a) demonstrate honesty in the conduct of his or her public and private affairs;
- (b) not to engage in activities that amount to abuse of office;
- (c) accurately and honestly represent information to the public;
- (d) not engage in wrongful conduct in furtherance of personal benefit;
- (e) not misuse public resources;
- (f) not falsify any records;
- (g) not sexually harass or have inappropriate sexual relations with other State Officers, staff of the office or any other person;
- (h) not engage in actions which would lead to the State Officers removal from the membership of a professional body in accordance with the law;
- (i) not commit offences and in particular, any of the offences under parts XV and XVI of the Penal Code, Sexual offences act, 2006, the Counter- Trafficking in Persons Act, 2008, and the Children Act;
- (j) not engage in fighting or physical confrontation with any person;
- (k) maintain high standards of etiquette at all times.

(2) A person who wishes to be elected the Office shall for the purposes of this Code, submit to the Independent Electoral and Boundaries Commission a self-declaration in the form set out in the First Schedule to the Act

13. (1) A gift or donation given to a State Officer on a public or official occasion shall be treated as a gift of donation to the office.

(2) Notwithstanding subparagraph (1) a State Officer may receive a gift given to the State Officer in official capacity, provided that—

- (a) the gift is within the ordinary bounds of propriety, a usual expression of courtesy or protocol and within the ordinary standards of hospitality.
- (b) the gift is not monetary
- (c) the gift does not exceed the value of Kenya shillings twenty thousand or such other amount as may be prescribed by the Commission through Regulations

(3) A State Officer shall not—

- (a) accept or solicit gifts, hospitality or other benefits from a person who—
 - (i) has an interest in any matter under consideration by the Assembly;
 - (ii) has a contractual relationship with the office;
 - (iii) has any interest that is directly or indirectly connected with the State Officers duties;
- (b) receive a gift which has the potential of compromising his or her integrity, objectivity or impartiality; or
- (c) accept any type of gift expressly prohibited under the Act.

(4) A State Officer who receives a gift or donation shall declare the gift or donation to the Authorized Officer within seven days of receipt of the gift.

(5) The Office shall maintain a register of all gifts received by the state Officers serving in the Office and another register of all gifts given by the office to other State or Public Officers.

14. A State Officer shall not use the office to wrongfully or unlawfully acquire or influence the acquisition of public or other property.

15. (1) A State Officer shall use the best efforts to avoid being in a conflict of interest or a situation where his or her personal interests conflict or appear to conflict with the State Officers official duties.

(2) Without limiting the generality of subparagraph (1)—

- (a) a State Officer shall not hold shares or have any other interest in a corporation, partnership or other body, directly or through another person, if holding those shares or having that interest would result in a conflict of the State Officers and the officers official duties.

(3) A State Officer whose personal interest's conflict with their official duties shall declare the personal interest to the office.

(4) The Office may give directions on the appropriate action to the taken by the State Officer to avoid the conflict of interest and the State Officer shall comply with the directions, and refrain from participating in any deliberations with respect to the matter.

(5) Any direction issued by the office under sub paragraph (4) shall be in writing.

(6) Notwithstanding any directions to the contrary under subparagraph (4) a State Officer shall not influence the award of a contract to—

- (a) himself or herself;
- (b) the State Officers spouse or child;
- (c) a business associate or agent; or
- (d) a corporation, private company, partnership or other body in which the officer has a substantial or controlling interest.

(7) Where a State Officer is present at a meeting, and an issue which is likely to result in a conflict of interest is to be discussed, the State Officer shall declare the interest at the beginning of the meeting or before the issue is deliberated upon.

(8) A declaration of a conflict of interest under subparagraph (7) shall be recorded in the minutes of that meeting.

(9) The Office shall maintain a register of conflicts of interest in the prescribed form in which an affected State Officer shall register the particulars of the registerable interests, stating the nature and extent of the conflict.

(10) For purposes of subparagraph (9), the registerable interests shall include:

- (a) the interests set out in the second schedule of the Act;
- (b) any connection with a person, firm or a company, whether by relation, friendship, holding of shares or otherwise, which is subject of an investigation by the Constitution;
- (c) any application for employment or other form of engagement with the office by a family member or friend of the State Officer or by a law firm or corporation associated with the State Officer;

- (d) any application to the office, by a family member or friend of the State Officer, for clearance with respect to appointment or election to any public office;
- (e) any other matter which, in the opinion of the State Officer, taking into account the circumstances thereof, is necessary for registration as a conflict of interest.

(11) The Office shall keep the register of conflicts of interest for five years after the last entry in each volume of the register.

(12) The Office shall prepare a report of the registered interests within thirty days after the close of a financial year.

(13) A State Officer shall ensure that an entry of registerable interests under subparagraph (9) is updated and to notify the office of any changes in the registrable interests, within one month of each change occurring.

16. (1) A State Officer shall not participate in a tender for the supply of goods or services to the office.

(2) Notwithstanding subparagraph (1) a company or entity associated with the State Officer shall not be construed as trading with the office, unless—

- (a) the State Officer has a controlling shareholding in the company or entity; or
- (b) the State Officer is a director of the company; or
- (c) the State Officer is a managing partner in a law firm providing services to the office.

17. (1) A State Officer shall not solicit for contributions from the office or any other person or, public entity for a public purpose unless the President has, by notice in the Gazette, declared a national disaster and allowed a public collection for the purpose of the national disaster in accordance with the law.

(2) A State Officer shall not participate in a public collection of funds in a way that reflects adversely on the State Officers' integrity, impartiality or interferes with the Performance of the official duties.

(3) Nothing in this clause shall be constructed as prohibiting a State Officer from making voluntary contribution.

18. (1) Subject to Article 76(2) of the Constitution or any other written law, a State Officer shall not open or continue to operate a bank account outside Kenya without the approval of the Commission.

(2) A State Officer who has reasonable grounds for opening or operating a bank account outside Kenya shall apply to the commission for approval to open or operate a bank account outside Kenya.

(3) A State Officer who operates or controls the operation of a bank account outside Kenya shall submit statements of the account annually to the commission and authorize the commission to verify the statements and any other relevant information from the foreign financial institution in which the account is held.

(4) Subject to subparagraph (1) and (2), a person who is appointed as a State Officer in the office and has a bank account outside Kenya shall, upon such appointment close the bank account within 3 months or such other period as the Commission may prescribe by notice in the Gazette

(5) Subject to subparagraph (4) a State Officer may open or continue to operate a bank account outside Kenya as may be authorized by the Commission in writing.

19. (1) A State Officer shall not be an agent of, or further the interests of a foreign government, organization or individual in a manner that may be detrimental to the security interests of Kenya, except when acting in the course of official duty.

(2) For the purposes of this paragraph—

- (a) an individual is a foreigner if the individual is not a citizen of Kenya; and
- (b) an organization is foreign if it is established outside Kenya or is owned or controlled by a foreign government, organization or individual

20 (1) A State Officer shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that public property in his or her custody, possession or control is taken care of and is in good repair and Condition.

(2) A State Officer shall not use public property, funds or services that are acquired in the course of or as a result of the official duties, for private activities of activities that are not related to the official work of the State Officer.

(3) A State Officer shall return to the office all the public property in his or her custody, possession or control at the end of the election or contract term.

(4) A State Officer who contravenes subparagraph (2) or (3) shall, in addition to any other penalties provided for under the Constitution, the Act or any other law, be personally liable for any loss or damage to the public property.

21. (1) A State Officer shall not directly or indirectly use or allow any person under the officers authority to use any Information obtained through or in connection with the office, which is not available in the public domain, for the furthering of any private interest, whether financial or otherwise.

(2) A State Officer shall not be deemed to have violated the requirements of subparagraph (1), if the information given—

- (b) pursuant to a court order;
- (c) for purposes of educational, research, literary, scientific or other purposes not prohibited by law; or
- (d) in compliance with Article 35 of the Constitution and the relevant law.

22. A State Officer shall, at all times, carry out the duties of the Office with impartiality and objectivity in accordance with principles and values set out in Articles 10, 27, 73 (2) (b) and 232 of the Constitution and shall not practice favouritism, nepotism, tribalism, cronyism, religious bias or engage in other preferential treatment of another State Officer, Public Officer or a member of the public.

23. A State Officer who has a duty to give advice shall give honest, accurate and impartial advice without fear or favour.

24. (1) A State Officer shall not allow himself of herself to be influenced in the performance of his or her duties by plans or expectations for or offers of future employment or benefits.

(2) A State Officer shall disclose, in writing, to the Commission, all offers of future employment or benefits that could place the State Officer in a situation of conflict of interest.

25. A former State Officer shall not be engaged by the Office in a matter in which the State Officer was originally engaged in as a State Officer, for at least two years after leaving the office.

26. A State Officer shall not knowingly give false or misleading information to any person.

27. A State Officer shall not falsify any records or misrepresent information to the public Conduct of private Affairs

28. A State Officer shall conduct their private affairs in a manner that maintains public confidence in the integrity of the Office.

29. (1) A State Officer shall not bully another State or Public Officer or any other person.

(2) For purposes of subparagraph (1) "bullying" includes blackmail, coercion, threats, intimidation or repeated offensive behaviour which is vindictive, cruel, malicious or humiliating whether or not is intended to undermine a person and includes physical assault.

30. (1) A State Officer shall not—

- (a) cause anything to be done through another person that would constitute a contravention of this Code, the Constitution or any other law if done by the State Officer or
- (b) allow or direct a person under their supervision or control to do anything that is in contravention of this Code, the Constitution or any other law.

(2) Subparagraph (1) (b) shall not apply where anything is done without the State Officer's knowledge or consent or if the State Officer has taken reasonable steps to prevent it.

31. (1) If a State Officer considers that anything required of him or her is in Contravention of the Code or is otherwise improper or unethical, the State Officer shall report the matter to the Commission.

(2) The Commission shall investigate the report and take appropriate action within ninety days of receiving the report.

32. A State Officer who believes or has reason to believe corrupt act or unethical malpractice has occurred or is about to occur in the office shall take all necessary measures to prevent it from continuing or materializing in addition to any other appropriate action.

33. A State Officer shall not use social media in a manner that is prejudicial to public interest, national cohesion or that otherwise constitutes a breach of any law.

34. A State Officer shall maintain appropriate standard of dress and personal hygiene at all times.

35. (1) A State Officer shall exercise independence in the discharge of his duties and shall not allow himself to be subjected to political or any other internal or external influence that is detrimental to public interest.

(2) A State Officer shall not influence or attempt to influence the decision of any other State or Public Officer or public entity on any matter.

(3) A State Officer shall not in any way interfere with the duties of any other State Officer Public Officer or public entity.

36. (1) A State Officer shall in the exercise of oversight over implementation of projects not interfere with such implementation in any way.

(2) A State Officer shall not influence the undertaking of any project without prior planning or budgeting.

(3) A State Officer shall not demand or accept any kickbacks, gifts, benefits or other favours from contractors or other persons or entities who are engaged in implementation projects.

(4) A State Officer shall not compromise or abet comprising of standards of any project.

(5) A State Officer shall, subject to the law, disclose all relevant information regarding any project to any person requiring such information.

37. A State Officer shall ensure equal and equitable distribution of resources to all persons and any section of the population in his area of jurisdiction and shall not confer any undue advantage to any person or section of the population.

PART III – ENFORCEMENT OF THE CODE

38. (1) any person may lodge a complaint alleging a breach of this code by a

(2) Breach of this Code amounts to misconduct for which the State Officer may be subjected to disciplinary proceedings including removal from office;

(3) Where a Breach of this code amounts to violation of the Constitution, the State Officer may be removed from the office in accordance with the applicable laws.

(4) Where an allegation of breach is made to the Office, the person alleging the breach shall submit a petition setting out the grounds and facts of the alleged violation to the Authorized Officer of the Office

(5) Upon receipt of the Complaint, the Office shall register and carry out investigations into the complaint, and may take action against the State Officer in accordance with the Act, Standing Orders of the Assembly, any Regulations made by the Commission under the Act or other law that for the time being governs the conduct of State Officers in the Assembly

(6) If upon investigation into the alleged breach of the Code, the Office is of the opinion that civil or criminal proceedings out to be preferred against the respective State Officer, it shall refer the matter to

- (a) The Commission, with respect to civil matters; and
- (b) The director of Public Prosecutions with respect to criminal matters.

(7) Where the complaint is made to the Commission, the Commission shall take such action against the State Officer as it deems necessary in accordance with its mandate under the law.

(8) Notwithstanding sub-paragraph (5), the Commission may, subject to the law, take any additional action it deems appropriate in relation to any breach of the Code or require the Office to take any action against a State Office who has breached the Code.

39. A State Officer shall not in any way victimize any other State Officer or Public Officer or any other person for any lawful action or omission.

40. The Authorized Officer or Accounting Officer of the Office shall at all times comply with such orders or directives as may be

issued by the Commission from time to time towards the implementation and enforcement of this Code.

PART IV—GENERAL PROVISIONS

41. A State Officer or the office may request the Commission to give an advisory opinion on any issue relating to, but not limited to—

- the application of chapter six of the constitution;
- the application of the Act or any other applicable law or regulations dealing with the ethics and integrity of State Officers;
- the application of the Public Officer Ethics Act 2003, or any other law or regulations dealing with the ethics and integrity of public officers.
- the application of this Code.
- an ethical dilemma or
- any other matter incidental to the promotion of the ethics and integrity of State Officers and public officers generally.

42. The office shall collaborate with the Commission to ensure that the State Officers and public officers serving in the Office are sensitized on leadership and integrity issues at least once a year.

43. Each State Officer shall take personal responsibility or compliance with the provisions of this Code

44. The Authorized Office or his designate shall cause to be prepared and submitted to the Commission an Annual Report on the progress made in implementation and enforcement of the Code in a prescribed format by the Commission.

45. The Office may with approval of the Commission amend this Code.
