Notification of intetion to Erect Power Transmission Lines

(Old Town-Area 48-Kanengo-Kauma-Kamuzu Barracks)

In accordance with section 39 of the Electricity Act, (No. 22 of 2004) notice is hereby given that Electricity Supply Corporation of Malawi Limited (hereinafter called "the Corporation") intends to erect an overhead power transmission line (hereinafter called "the Line") from LL A Substation at Old Town Power Station to Kamuzu Barracks via Area 48, Kanengo and Kauma Substations in Lilongwe.

1. Particulars of the line are as follows-

Length

30,543 meters

Wayleave width

30 metres (15 m either side)

Voltage

66,000 Volts

Description

The line shall be of single circuit delta construction of three phase wire from Lilongwe A Substation to Kamuzu Barracks Substation. Type of conductor used shall be stranded Parakeet (ACSR) housing a nominal cross section area of 282 square millimeters. The type of earth wire will be a 48 core optic fibre ground wire (OPGW). The line will be constructed on monopole steel structures from Lilongwe A Substation (at Old Town) to Area 48 Substation and the rest will be constructed on steel lattice towers i.e. from Area 48 Substation to Lilongwe B Substation (at Kanengo) to Kauma Substation up to Lilongwe C Substation (at Kamuzu Barracks).

2. The Proposed line route shall be as follows-

The Lilongwe Ring power line starts from Lilongwe A Substation at Old Town going to the west side of existing 66 kV Nkula-Lilongwe line and passing to the east of Lilongwe Golf Club. It crosses Lilongwe River into Katete Farm where it makes almost a 60° angle and heads southwards where it crosses the Western Bypass Main Road. The line runs in parallel of the Western Bypass Road and crosses Lilongwe River, the Likuni Road and Mchinji Road near the Lilongwe-Mchinji Roundabout and the MRA Complex Offices up to Area 47 Njewa on the west of Kaunda Road. It goes further passing through the Police Compound Houses and Ntandire where it crosses the road running to the west of the existing 66kV wooden pole line and lands into Area 48 Substation.

The line comes out of the Area 48 Substation into Area 47 and then crosses the Area 18-Area 49B Gulliver Road to reach Area 18B running parallel to the Nankhaka Stream on the eastern side, passing through Area 30 and Kanengo Factory in Area 28. It proceeds further to cross the railway line to the eastern side of Ngona Village of T/A Chitukula and lands into Lilongwe B Substation at Kanengo.

From Lilongwe B Substation, the line moves eastern wards to cross the Lilongwe-Mzuzu M1 Road where it turns at a 900 angle and goes south wards (towards Lilongwe City) in parallel with the M1 Road and turns east into Area 43 Extension. It crosses Namisikidzi Stream and lands into Kauma Substation.

The line goes out of Kauma Substation and moves south wards in parallel with, and to the west of the existing 66kV wooden pole line passing through Kauma Village and crosses Kauma River. It proceeds into Area 12 and crosses the City Centre-Presidential Drive Road into Area 34 to the east of the Presidential Villa. It moves further to cross the Lilongwe River before it finally lands into Lilongwe C Substation at Kamuzu Barracks.

Any owner, lessee, or occupier over whose land the intended transmission lines passes, is informed that plans for construction are available for inspection at the Corporation's Office at Umoyo House in Blantyre, Magetsi House in Lilongwe and ESCOM Regional Office in Mzuzu. Route plans can also be inspected at Millennium Challenge Account-Malawi Offices at Pamodzi House in Lilongwe and the Lilongwe City Council at any time during normal business days (Monday to Friday) from 07.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Notice is further given that objections by any owner, lessee or occupier of land affected by the intended transmission line must be served on the Corporation in writing within 30 days from the date hereof at the offices of the Corporation.

Notification of intetion to Erect Power Transmission Lines

(Telegraph Hill-Katoto-Sonda-Luwinga)

In accordance with Section 39 of the Electricity Act, (No. 22 of 2004) notice is hereby given that Electricity Supply Corporation of Malawi Limited (hereinafter called "the Corporation") intends to erect an overhead power transmission line (hereinafter called "the Line") from Telegraph Hill Substation at Nsongwa area to Luwinga Substation via Katoto and Sonda Substations in Mzuzu.

1. Particulars of the line are as follows-

Length

26,250meters

Wayleave width

15 metres (i.e. 7.5m either side)

Voltage

33,000 Volts

Description

The line shall be of single circuit horizontal construction of three phase wire from Telegraph Hill Substation at Nsongwa area to Luwinga Substation via Katoto and Sonda Substations in Mzuzu. Type of conductor used shall be ACSR housing a nominal cross section area of 150 square millimeters. The type of earth wire will be a 48 core optic fibre ground wire (OPGW). The line will be constructed on wooden pole structures from Telegraph Hill Substation up to Luwinga Substation.

2. The Proposed line route shall be as follows--

The Mzuzu Ring power line starts from Telegraph Hill Substation at Nsongwa area going to the east side of existing 33kV Telegraph Hill-Mzuzu Power Station line and passes through Nkupe Village where it makes a 90 degree angle to the east going into Kamchibazi Village in Masasa area. It makes another 45degree angle to the south and passes through Chisi Village to the east of Masasa Community Day Secondary School then goes into Kaboko Village and Gesha location along the dambo area up to Katoto Substation.

From Katoto Substation, the line goes eastwards and crosses the Mzuzu-Lilongwe M1 Road where it continues to run along the dambo area at Nambo and Area 4. It makes a 90 degree angle northwards and crosses Malivenji Road into Kamweko Village in T/A Kampingo Sibande before it makes another 90 degree angle south-westwards to pass through Zanyengelela Village to the north of Sonda Primary School. It proceeds into Sonda Lundu Village before landing into Sonda Substation.

The line comes out of the Sonda Substation westwards in parallel with the in-going line up into Sonda Lundu village where it turns 60 degrees north—eastwards—crossing—Lunyangwa—river—and—passses—through T/A Ntwalo's villages of Mzaza, Kazangali, Vwenya and Makhwila to the south of the Mzuzu city Council disposal area at Dunduzu. It then crosses the Mzuzu-Karonga M1 Road into Matemanga Village and turns 90 degrees angle eastwards to run in parallel with the 33kV Luwinga-Bwengu powerline. It passes through Chikwati Munthali Village to the east of Nkhorongo Primary School and proceeds into Kafwili Nyirongo Village before it finally lands into Luwinga Substation.

Any owner, lessee, or occupier over whose land the intended transmission lines passes, is informed that plans for construction are available for inspection at the Corporation's Office at Umoyo House in Blantyre, Magetsi House in Lilongwe and ESCOM Regional Office in Mzuzu. Route plans can also be inspected at Millennium Challenge Account-Malawi Offices at Pamodzi House in Lilongwe and the Mzuzu City Council offices at any time during normal business days (Monday to Friday) from 07.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Notification of intetion to Erect Power Transmission Lines

(Karonga-Songwe T-Off)

In accordance with Section 39 of the Electricity Act, (No. 22 of 2004) notice is hereby given that Electricity Supply Corporation of Malawi Limited (hereinafter called "the Corporation") intends to erect an overhead power distribution line (hereinafter called "the Line") from Karonga Substation to feed into the existing 33kV Karonga-Chitipa overhead power line.

1. Particulars of the line are as follows-

Length

3,000 meters

Wayleave width

15 metres (7.5m either side)

Voltage

33,000 Volts

Description

The line shall be of single circuit horizontal construction of three phase wire from Karonga Substation to feed into the existing 33kV Karonga-Chitipa power line. Type of conductor used shall be ACSR housing a nominal cross section area of 150 square millimeters. The type of earth wire will be a 48 core optic fibre ground wire (OPGW). The line will be constructed on wooden pole structures from Karonga Substation to feed into the existing 33kV Karonga-Chitipa power line.

2. The Proposed line route shall be as follows-

The power line starts from Karonga Substation moving westwards in parallel with the Chaminade/Airport road where it crosses the road and makes a 45degree angle towards northwest to pass through Mwakifwamba Village to the east of Paladin Africa Offices and National Bank Staff houses. It crosses the Chaminade/Airport road and also crosses over the 11kV Karonga-Chaminade power line to the west of the Karonga Airfield and goes into Mwanganda village upon crossing over Chaminade/Airport road. The line then passes to the west of Bwiba Primary School to make a 45degree angle northwards and crosses Chankhalamu stream to move along the dambo area before it feeds into the existing 33kV Karonga-Chitipa power line at Peter Mwangalaba village near the Roman Catholic Church.

Any owner, lessee, or occupier over whose land the intended transmission lines passes, is informed that plans for construction are available for inspection at the Corporation's Office at Umoyo House in Blantyre, Magetsi House in Lilongwe and ESCOM in Mzuzu. Route plans can also be inspected at Millennium Challenge Account-Malawi Offices at Pamodzi House in Lilongwe and the Karonga District Assembly offices at any time during normal business days (Monday to Friday) from 07.30 a.m. to 4.30 p.m.

Notice is further given that objections by any owner, lessee or occupier of land affected by the intended transmission line must be served on the Corporation in writing within 30 days from the date hereof at the offices of the Corporation.
