MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1951: MERCHANT SHIPPING FEES REGULATIONS

The Minister of Works, Transport and Communication has under section 356 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act No. 57 of 1951) -

- (a) made the regulations set out in the Schedule;
- (b) repealed Government Notices Nos. R.740 of 5 May 1972, R.366 of 28 February 1986 and R.572 of 28 April 1967; Regulation 4 of the Eyesight and Medical Examination Regulations promulgated by Government Notice No. R.1 of 7 January 1977; Regulations 27, 28, 29, 30 and 31 of the Examination Regulations for Certificates of Competency as Fisherman and Marine Motorman promulgated by Government Notice No. R.2653 of 29 November 1985;

Regulations 46, 47, 48 and 49 of the Examination Regulations for Engineer-Officers promulgated by Government Notice No. R.2655 of 29 November 1985; Regulation 8 of the Examination Regulations for Certificates of Competency for Deck Officers promulgated by Government Notice No. R.2656 of 29 November 1985; Regulations 32, 33 and 34 of the Certificates of Qualifications Regulations promulgated by Government Notice No. R.2654 of 29 November 1985; Regulation 12 and Annex 3 of the Tonnage Regulations promulgated by Government Notice No. R.1129 of 6 June 1986; Annex O of the Registration of Ships Regulations promulgated by Government Notice No. R.36 of 10 January 1989; and

(c) amended Government Notice No. R.2080 of 14 October 1977, by the deletion of the expression "R3" in regulations 3(3), 5(1) and 8(2) of the Record Books Regulations.

CHAPTER I GENERAL

Definitions

- 1. In these regulations, any word or expression given a meaning in the Act has that meaning and, unless the context indicates otherwise -
- "Directorate" means the Directorate: Maritime Affairs of the Ministry of Works, Transport and Communication;
- "Ministry" means the Ministry of Works, Transport and Communication;
- "Permanent Secretary" means the Permanent Secretary: Works, Transport and Communication;
- "radio installation" means a radio installation as defined by the applicable radio installations regulations promulgated under the Act;
- "record book" means a Mariner's Record Book and Certificate of Discharge;
- "the Act" means the Merchant Shipping Act, 1951 (Act No. 57 of 1951);
- "tons" in relation to a ship, means the gross tonnage units which are recorded on the relevant International Tonnage Certificate or the Namibian Tonnage Certificate.

Application of regulations

2. These regulations shall apply to any inspection, survey, issue of a certificate or other service performed in terms of these regulations by a surveyor or other staff member in the Ministry.

By whom fees are payable

3. The fees prescribed by these regulations for the survey or inspection of a vessel are payable by its owner and the fees prescribed by these regulations for any other service or certificate are payable by the person requesting such service or certificate.

When fees are payable

4. (1) No certificate or other document referred to in these regulations shall be issued unless the prescribed fee has been paid.

(2) If the person requiring a survey, inspection or other service cannot keep the appointment, he or she shall notify the proper officer of his or her intention to cancel the survey, inspection or other service at least 24 hours before the appointed time, failing which the full fee for such survey, inspection or service shall be payable.

To whom fees are payable

5. The fees prescribed by these regulations shall be payable to the proper officer who shall issue an official receipt for the amount paid.

Issue of certificates

- (2) When a certificate or other document is issued in duplicate, no fee is payable for the duplicate.
- (3) The following fees shall be payable for a copy of a certificate or other document referred to in these regulations:

CHAPTER II FEES FOR THE REGISTRATION OF SHIP

Fees payable for registration of ship

- 7. The following fees shall be payable in respect of the registration of a ship:
 - (a) Inspection of ship's marking and carving:
 - (i) Inspection of the marking and carving of a ship N\$200,00.
 - (ii) No separate fee shall be payable for the inspection of the marking on account of the change of the name of a ship if that ship is, at that time, undergoing a survey for tonnage measurement for the purposes of registration or re-registration;
 - (b) registration of a ship or re-registration of a ship in Namibia upon -

- (i) registry anew on change of ownership.
- (ii) registry anew on sale of ship under certificate of sale; or
- (iii) registry anew as a result of alterations to ship:

Over 100 tons	N\$ 570;

- (c) (i) granting of new certificate of registry in lieu of original being mislaid, lost or destroyed;
 - (ii) registry of alterations to ship, except registry anew as a result of such alterations;
 - (iii) transfer or transmission of ownership in ship;
 - (iv) transfer of registry from one port to another;
 - (v) registration of deed of mortgage;
 - (vi) registration of deed of cession;
 - (vii) registration of transmission of interest in mortgage;
 - (viii) registration of discharge of mortgage:

CHAPTER III FEES FOR TONNAGE MEASUREMENT

Where fees shall be payable for tonnage measurement

8. The owner of a ship that is measured for tonnage shall pay at the port at which the ship is measured, the fees prescribed by regulation 9.

Fees for measurement of ship for gross and net tonnage

9. (1) The following fees shall be payable for the measurement of a ship in terms of regulation 8:

Registered length of ship	Fee
under 24 metres	N\$ 600
24 metres to 36 metres	N\$ 1 200
over 36 metres to 55 metres	N\$ 3 000
over 55 metres to 68 metres	N\$ 6 000
over 68 metres	N\$ 8 400

- (2) Where a ship is measured by or on behalf of a foreign government the fee payable for the verification of the tonnage computation shall be ... N\$1 200,00.
- (4) The fees for re-measurement, where such re-measurement includes the calculation of the volume of the hull below the upper deck, shall be the fees prescribed by subregulation (1).
- (5) Where a ship is re-measured as a consequence of any alteration in the form or capacity of a ship, not being an alteration affecting the volume of the hull below the upper deck, the following fees shall be payable:

Registered length of ship	Fee

- (8) The fees payable in terms of this regulation cover the issue of a tonnage certificate and any number of visits made by the surveyor to the ship concerned for the purpose of each measurement or re-measurement.

CHAPTER IV FEES FOR CERTAIN SURVEY SERVICES

Survey of passenger ship for safety certificate

- 10. (1) (a) Subject to subregulation (2), the following fees shall be payable for the survey of a passenger ship for -
 - (i) the issuing or renewal of a passenger ship safety certificate or a local general safety certificate; or
 - (ii) the issuing of a record of safety equipment:

- (b) The survey referred to in paragraph (a) shall cover -
- (i) up to two visits which a surveyor may have to make to the ship before drawing up his or her report; and
- (ii) all parts of the ship, excluding the hull when such survey requires the ship to be dry docked, slipped or lifted by synchro-lift or crane,

but shall not cover the survey of radio installations.

- (3) The fees prescribed by subregulation (1), shall be doubled for the survey of a newly constructed passenger ship or a passenger ship undergoing rebuilding or refurbishment for the issue or renewal, as the case may be, of any certificate referred to in subregulation (1).

Survey of ship other than passenger ship for cargo ship safety construction certificate

11. (1) The following fees shall be payable for the survey of a ship other than a passenger ship for a cargo ship safety construction certificate:

(2) The fee prescribed in column 2 in subregulation (1) shall be doubled in respect of a survey for the issue of a cargo ship safety construction certificate of a ship the keel of which was laid twenty or more years before the date of the survey.

Survey of ship other than passenger ship for cargo ship safety equipment certificate

- 12. (1) (a) The following fees shall be payable for the survey of a ship other than a passenger ship for -
 - (i) the issuing or renewal of a cargo ship safety equipment certificate;
 - (ii) the inspection of such ship for an annual survey; or
 - (iii) the issue of a record of safety equipment:

- (b) The survey referred to in paragraph (a) shall cover two visits which a surveyor may have to make to the ship before drawing up his or her report.

Survey of vessel other than passenger ship for local safety certificate

- 13. (1) (a) Subject to subregulation (2), the following fees shall be payable for the survey of a vessel other than a passenger ship for the issuing of -
 - (i) a local general safety certificate; or
 - (ii) a record of safety equipment:

- (b) The survey referred to in paragraph (a) shall cover -
 - (i) up to two visits which a surveyor may have to make to the vessel before drawing up his or her report; and
 - (ii) the survey of all parts of the ship, including the survey of the hull of a trailer-borne ship when carried out simultaneously, but excluding the survey of the hull when such survey requires the ship to be dry docked, slipped, or lifted by synchro-lift or crane,

but shall not cover the survey of radio installations.

- (2) The fees prescribed by subregulation (1) shall be doubled in respect of ships over 25 tons for the survey of a newly constructed ship or a ship undergoing rebuilding or refurbishment for the issue of the certificate referred to in subregulation (1).

Survey of ship in dry dock

14. (1) The following fees shall be payable for the external and internal survey of a ship's hull and the issue of a dry docking certificate:

- (2) The fees prescribed by subregulation (1) shall cover -
 - (a) up to three visits which the surveyor may have to make to the ship before drawing up his or her report; and
 - (b) a visit to a workshop in a port for the inspection of any of the ship's machinery that requires inspection in a workshop.

- (a) "fishing vessel" means any vessel used for catching fish or other living resources of the sea for financial gain or reward, and -
 - "Class A" means a fishing vessel of 45 meters or more in length operating outside the exclusive economic zone and all other fishing vessels of 75 meters or more in length;
 - "Class B" means a fishing vessel of less than 45 meters in length operating outside the exclusive economic zone:
 - "Class C" means a fishing vessel of less than 75 meters in length operating solely within the exclusive economic zone; and
 - "Class D" means a fishing vessel operating solely within 40 nautical miles of a coast station, whether or not such coast station is a remote-controlled coast station; and
- (b) "exclusive economic zone" means the exclusive economic zone of Namibia as defined in the Territorial Sea and Exclusive Economic Zone of Namibia Act, 1990 (Act No. 3 of 1990).

Survey of unseaworthy ships

- (3) Where a ship is detained or requires more than one visit as a result of deficiencies identified during an inspection under the port State control system, fees equal to those prescribed by subregulation (1) shall be payable for each subsequent visit.

- (2) (a) The fees prescribed in column (1) of the table in subregulation (1) shall cover up to two visits which the surveyor may have to make to a ship before drawing up his or her report.
- (b) If further visits are necessary before the surveyor's report can be drawn up, the additional fee payable per surveyor-hour or part thereof shall be N\$200,00
- (3) Where a surveyor carries out a survey for the issue or renewal of a load line certificate at the same time as a survey for a safety certificate for a passenger ship or a cargo ship safety construction certificate, half the fee applicable to that particular ship as specified in column (1) of the Table in subregulation (1) shall be payable.
- (4) No fee shall be payable where a surveyor carries out an intermediate survey at the same time as a survey for a safety certificate for a passenger ship or a cargo ship construction certificate.
- (5) The fees in column (1) of the table in subregulation (1) shall be payable for an assignment of freeboard.

When to pay fees for examination

25. A candidate shall pay the examination fee prescribed by this Chapter prior to the date of the examination and no candidate shall be allowed to sit for the examination unless he or she produces to the examiner the receipt for the fee paid.

Where to pay fees for examination

- **26.** The examination fee in question shall be paid to the nearest proper officer who shall issue a receipt stating -
 - (a) the name of the candidate;
 - (b) the amount paid; and
 - (c) the grade of the examination.

Refund of fees

27. Where a candidate is unable to undergo the examination for which fees have been paid he or she may apply in writing to the proper officer for the refund of such fees and if the proper officer considers the application to be based upon reasonable grounds, he or she shall forward the application to the Permanent Secretary, who may authorise a refund.

Forfeiture of fees

28. If a candidate fails by default to undergo the examination for which fees have been paid, such fee shall be forfeited.

Replacement of documents

37. Unless the loss was due to shipwreck or fire on board ship the fee payable for the issue of a certified copy of a lost, mutilated or damaged certificate of competency, qualification or mariner's record book shall be N\$100,00.

CHAPTER VII FEES FOR DISCHARGE OF SEAMEN

Fees for discharge of seamen

- (3) Where the discharge of a seaman is effected on board ship at a port outside Namibia at the specific request of the master or owner of such ship, the proper officer may levy such subsistence and travelling allowance as he or she is authorised to levy in terms of the laws applicable to the Public Service.

CHAPTER VIII EXTRA AND SPECIAL ATTENDANCE FEES

Hours and dates of general attendance

- **39.** (1) Where the attendance of a surveyor is required on Saturdays, Sundays or public holidays or at any other time outside normal working hours, the person requiring attendance shall make application to a proper officer on the prescribed form and shall guarantee the payment of the fee prescribed by subregulation (2) and shall pay that fee on demand.
- (3) If the attendance of a surveyor is required outside normal working hours, the person requiring such attendance shall, in addition to the prescribed fees, pay the surveyor's reasonable subsistence and transport expenses.

Surveys outside Namibia

40. Where the attendance of a surveyor is required outside Namibia, the person requiring such attendance shall pay the surveyor's reasonable travelling and subsistence expenses.

Travel and subsistence expenses

41. Where the attendance of a surveyor is required at any place within Namibia, the person requiring such attendance shall pay the surveyor's reasonable travelling and subsistence expenses.

Deposits

42. The Permanent Secretary or the proper officer may, in his or her discretion, prior to allowing the attendance referred to in regulation 39, 40 or 41, demand a deposit of an amount sufficient to cover the costs that may be incurred.
