DETERMINATION OF TOTAL ALLOWABLE CATCH IN RESPECT OF ROCK LOBSTER

Under section 38 of the Marine Resources Act, 2000 (Act No. 27 of 2000), and on the advise of the Marine Resources Advisory Council, I determine that the Total Allowable Catch in respect of rock lobster for the allocation of quotas during the 2001/2002 rock lobster season commencing on 1 November 2001 and ending on 30 April 2002, is 400 metric tons. The 400 metric tons are allocated in relation to each area mentioned in the first column of the table below, for the purpose of allocating quotas in respect of the period specified in the second column, in the proportion specified in the third column.

IMPOSITION OF LEVY IN RESPECT OF THE HARVESTING OF MARINE RESOURCES

Under section 44(4) of the Marine Resources Act, 2000 (Act No. 27 of 2000), after consultation with the Marine Resources Advisory Council and with the approval of the Minister of Finance, I impose a levy for the benefit of the Fisheries Observer Fund in respect of the harvesting of marine resources as set out in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

1. A person who engages in harvesting in Namibian waters in terms of a right, an exploratory right or a fisheries agreement, must pay -

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- (a) a levy of N\$21,70 for each hour during which that person is engaged in such harvesting, irrespective of whether or not -
 - (i) fish has been caught; or
 - (ii) a fisheries observer is on board the fishing vessel used in the harvesting.
- 2. The person referred to in paragraph 1. must pay the levy referred to in that paragraph -
 - (a) to the Fisheries Observer Agency: c/o PriceWaterHouse Coopers, PO Box 12, Walvis Bay; and
 - (b) within 7 days of reporting on shore after harvesting.

ELECTORAL ACT, 1992: NOTIFICATION OF THE RESULTS OF THE BY-ELECTIONS IN THE KARIBIB CONSTITUENCY OF THE ERONGO REGION AND THE OSHIKANGO CONSTITUENCY OF THE OHANGWENA REGION

In terms of section 92(1) of the Electoral Act, 1992 (Act No. 24 of 1992), the following particulars in respect of the results of the by-elections for the Karibib Constituency and Oshikango constituency, respectively, held on 19 December 2001 are published in the Schedule as follows:

- (a) in Column 1 of the Schedule, the constituency;
- (b) in Column 2 of the Schedule, the total number of votes counted in the constituency with the total number of rejected ballot papers shown in brackets;
- (c) in Column 3 of the Schedule, the name of each candidate with an indication opposite his or her name of the political party by whom the candidate was nominated and of which the candidate whose name is underlined has been declared duly elected as a member of the regional council for the Erongo region or Ohangwena region, as the case may be, with effect from 19 December 2001; and
- (d) in Column 4 of the Schedule, the number of votes recorded for each candidate.
