### DEEDS REGISTRIES REGULATIONS: DEEDS REGISTRIES ACT, 1937

The deeds registries regulation board has under section 10 of the Deeds Registries Act, 1937 (Act No. 47 of 1937) read with section 9 of that Act, made the regulations. approved by the Minister, as set out in the Schedule.

These regulations come into operation one month from the date of publication of this notice.

#### **SCHEDULE**

#### **Definitions**

1. In these regulations any reference to "the Regulations" means the Deeds Registries Regulations promulgated under Government Notice No. 180 of 1 July 1996 as amended by Government Notice Nos. 36 of 17 February, 2004 and No. 77 of 13 April, 2007 and corrected by Government Notice Nos. 193 of 19 July, 1996 and No. 312 of 4 December, 1996.

#### **Amendment of regulation 8 of the Regulations**

- **2.** Regulation 8 of the Regulations is amended by the substitution for subregulation (1)(a) of that regulation of the following subregulation (1)(a):
  - "(1) (a) in the case of a natural person, by means of his or her full names, marital status and identity number, assigned by the Minister of Home Affairs under section 4 of the identification Act, 1996 (Act No. 21 of 1996) and reflected in the identity document issued under section 5(1) of that Act: Provided that where an identity document has not been issued to the person concerned, such person shall be identified by means of his or her full names, marital status and date of birth or, if his or her date of birth is not known, by such other proof as the Registrar may require with regard to his or her identity; or".
