The Communications Regulatory Authority of Namibia, in terms of regulation 9 of the "Regulations Regarding Transitional Procedures for Telecommunications and Broadcasting Service Licences and Spectrum Use Licences", in *Government Gazette* No. 4737, Notice No. 171, dated 17 June 2011, herewith gives notice that the persons referred to in the table below, who hold licences to provide broadcasting services have, submitted information forms to the Authority for license review purposes.

In terms of Regulation 9(2) of the "Regulations Regarding Transitional Procedures for Telecommunications and Broadcasting Service Licences and Spectrum Use Licences", any person who has an existing or deemed broadcasting service license that does not appear on the list must submit their license and/or information form required by Regulation 4 in writing to the Authority within fourteen (14) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, after which the Authority will publish a second notice in the *Government Gazette* setting out a revised list.

After the fourteen (14) day period, the Authority will publish a second notice in the *Government Gazette*, after which the public may submit comments in writing to the Authority within a period of thirty (30) days from the date of publication of the second notice in the *Government Gazette*.

PLEASE NOTE:

The list only relates to broadcasting service licences and does not relate to telecommunications service licences or to spectrum use licences. The Authority will publish in the *Government Gazette*, separate lists for telecommunications service licences and spectrum use licences.

WARNINGS:

In terms of section (9)(10)(a) of the Regulations Regarding Transitional Procedures for Telecommunications and Broadcasting Service Licences and Spectrum Use Licences, no new licence will be issued to any licensee that does not provide all of the information required in the time permitted.
