AMENDMENT OF LEGAL AID REGULATIONS: LEGAL AID ACT, 1990

Under section 24 of the Legal Aid Act, 1990 (Act No. 29 of 1990), I have amended the Legal Aid Regulations published under Government Notice No. 374 of 31 December 2018 by the substitution for paragraph 6 of Annexure B of the following paragraph:

"Civil matters in High Court or Supreme Court

- **6.** (1) A legal practitioner conducting a case on the instructions of the Director in the High Court or Supreme Court may claim an amount equal to 50% of the fees as set out in the High Court Rules or the Supreme Court Rules, as the case may be.
- (2) An instructed legal practitioner conducting a civil matter may be paid an amount equal to 75% of the amount on the invoice.
- (3) For the purposes of subregulation (2), "instructed legal practitioner" means a legal practitioner instructed by another legal practitioner, who does not practise in the same law firm or institution as the first named legal practitioner, the Government Attorney, the head of a law centre or the Director, to render advocacy services related to proceedings in any cause or matter, regardless of whether such instructed legal practitioner practises with or without a fidelity fund certificate issued in terms of the Legal Practitioners Act, 1995.".

ANNOUNCEMENT OF PROHIBITION ON IMPORTATION OF LARGE PREDATORS AND ALIEN SPECIES OF WILD ANIMALS: NATURE CONSERVATION ORDINANCE, 1975

In terms of paragraph (b) of subsection (2) of section 49 of the Nature Conservation Ordinance, 1975 (Ordinance No. 4 of 1975), I make known that under paragraph (a) of that subsection, I have placed a prohibition on the importation into Namibia of large predators and alien species of wild animals as set out in the Schedule.
