ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, 1947
(No. 43 of 1947)

Road Traffic (Registration of Military Vehicles)
Regulations, 1958

Date of Commencement : 1st April, 1958

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 34 of the Road Traffic Ordinance, 1947, the Governor-General, after consultation with the Council of Ministers, has made the following regulations :—

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Road Traffic (Registration of Military Vehicles) Regulations, 1958, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1958.

(2) Regulations 3, 4 and 5 shall apply in respect of all military vehicles in Nigeria.

(3) Regulation 6 shall apply to Lagos.

2. In these regulations—

"military vehicle" means any motor vehicle or trailer owned by the Government of the Federation and used solely in the service of the Nigerian Military Forces.

3. (1) There shall be an officer of the Nigerian Military Forces at the Headquarters of the Nigerian Military Forces, to be known as the officer in charge of registration of military vehicles.

(2) The officer in charge of registration of military vehicles shall—

(a) as soon as any motor vehicle or trailer is taken into the service of the Nigerian Military Forces, register the same as a military vehicle, or cause it to be so registered, in Form MB in the First Schedule to these regulations;

(b) assign to each military vehicle so registered a separate registration number consisting of not more than four digits;

(c) furnish to the central registrar of licences a copy of the form of registration; and

(d) issue in respect of each military vehicle registered as such a certificate of registration in Form MF in the First Schedule to these regulations.

(3) On receipt of the form of registration of a military vehicle the central registrar of licences shall enter the particulars therein contained in the register kept by him in accordance with regulation 3 of the Road Traffic Regulations, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

4. (1) The registration number assigned to any military vehicle in accordance with regulation 3, together with the letters 'MF' shall be the identification mark of such vehicle for the purposes of the Ordinance and of any regulations made thereunder.

(2) The certificate of registration of any military vehicle shall be carried in the vehicle at all times when the vehicle is on any highway or in any public place.

Cancellation of registration as military vehicle.

5. When any motor vehicle or trailer ceases to be registrable as a military vehicle—

(a) the officer in charge of registration of military vehicles shall cancel the registration of such motor vehicle or trailer as a military vehicle, withdraw the registration number assigned to it under regulation 3 and cause the identification mark to be removed and inform the central registrar of licences of the name and address of the new owner of the motor vehicle or trailer by an endorsement of Form MB.

(b) the central registrar of licences shall cause the fact that such motor vehicle or trailer has ceased to be registered as a military vehicle to be recorded in the register kept by him under regulation 3 of the principal regulations;

(c) the new owner of the motor vehicle or trailer shall be responsible for registering the same in accordance with the provisions of the Ordinance, or of the principal regulations, as if such motor vehicle or trailer had not been previously registered under the Ordinance.

Exemptions.

6. (1) The provisions of the Ordinance and of the principal regulations set out in the first column of the Second Schedule to these regulations shall not apply in respect of any military vehicle registered as such so long as the requirements of these regulations and any conditions specified in the second column of the said Schedule are complied with.

(2) Save as aforesaid, the Ordinance and the principal regulations shall apply in respect of military vehicles as they do in respect of other motor vehicles and trailers owned by the Government of the Federation.
