Objects and Reasons

Under the present law an Appeal Commissioner should be paid by reference to the meetings which he attended. This Bill amends this provision and empowers the Minister, with the approval of the Council of Ministers, to fix rates of remuneration and allowances for Appeal Commissioners.

"(f) shall be paid such remuneration and allowances as may be determined by the Minister with the approval of the Council of Ministers."

Objects and Reasons

Under the present law a member of a Scrutineer Committee should be paid by reference to the meetings which he attended. This Bill amends this provision and empowers the Minister, with the approval of the Council of Ministers, to fix rates of remuneration and allowances for members of Scrutineer Committees.
