AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF THIRTY-SEVEN MILLION, SIX HUNDRED AND FORTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED AND SIXTY POUNDS TO THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR ENDING ON THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SIXTY.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the Federation of Nigeria as follows—

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation (1959-60) Ordinance, 1959.

2. The Accountant-General of the Federation may, on the warrant of the Governor-General or the Minister of Finance, pay out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Federation of Nigeria during the year ending on the 31st day of March, 1960, any sums not exceeding in the whole the sum of Thirty-Seven Million, Six Hundred and Forty-Seven Thousand, One Hundred and Sixty Pounds, being the total of the amounts set forth opposite Heads 21 to 61 in the Schedule.

3. The said sum of Thirty-Seven Million, Six Hundred and Forty-Seven Thousand, One Hundred and Sixty Pounds shall be appropriated to the purposes and in the manner expressed in the Schedule.

4. The moneys granted by this Ordinance are intended for the services in respect of which moneys will become payable within the year ending on the 31st day of March, 1960, and any balance thereof unissued at the end of the month of March of that year shall lapse and not be available for making payments in any subsequent month.
