Antiquities (Monuments) Declaration (No. 3) Notice, 1959

Commencement: 26th May, 1959

Whereas the Antiquities Commission has submitted an application in accordance with subsection (4) of section 14 of the Antiquities Ordinance, 1953 (hereinafter referred to as the Ordinance) for the declaration as a monument of the antiquity as set forth in the Schedule to this notice:

AND WHEREAS the application has been considered by the Governor-General in Council:

Now THEREFORE in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (5) of section 14 of the Ordinance the Governor-General, after consultation with the Council of Ministers, hereby gives the following notice—

- 1. This notice may be cited as the Antiquities (Monuments) Declaration (No. 3) Notice, 1959.
- 2. The antiquity set forth in the Schedule to this notice is declared to be a monument.
