PORTS ORDINANCE, 1954

Nigerian Ports Authority (Pilotage Boards) Order, 1960

Commencement: 14th January, 1960

The Nigerian Ports Authority, in exercise of the powers and authority vested in them by section 48 of the Ports Ordinance, 1954, and of every other power in that behalf vested in them do hereby make the following Order—

1. This Order may be cited as the Nigerian Ports Authority (Pilotage Boards) Order, 1960, and shall be of Federal application.

Citation and

2. There shall be a pilotage board for—

(a) each of the pilotage districts established by sections 2 and 4 of the Nigerian Ports Authority (Pilotage Districts) Order, 1959 (L.N. 252 of 1959); and

(b) the three pilotage districts established by section 3 of the Nigerian Ports Authority (Pilotage Districts) Order, 1959.

(c) the two pilotage districts established by section 5 of the Nigerian Ports Authority (Pilotage Districts) Order, 1959.

3. Each pilotage board shall consist of the Harbour Master of the port mentioned in sections 2, 3, 4 and 5 respectively of the Nigerian Ports Authority (Pilotage Districts) Order, 1959 and such members as may be appointed by the Authority by notice in the Gazette with the approval of the Minister.

ROYAL NIGERIAN NAVY ORDINANCE

(No. 28 of 1956)

Nigerian Navy (Amendment) Regulations, 1960

Commencement: 14th January, 1960

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 18 of the Royal Nigerian Navy Ordinance, 1956, the Governor-General has made the following regulations—

Citation and application.

Amendment of regulations. L.N. 90 of 1958.

Amendment of regulation 2. 1. These regulations may be cited as the Nigerian Navy (Amendment) Regulations, 1960, and shall be of Federal application.

2. The Nigerian Navy Regulations, 1958 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations) are amended by the insertion before the words "Nigerian Navy" wherever they occur of the word "Royal" and may accordingly be cited as the Royal Nigerian Navy Regulations, 1958.

3. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is amended by-

(a) the deletion of the definition of "the Paymaster" and the substitution therefor of the following—

"the Paymaster" means the officer detailed to be responsible for the receipt, custody, control and disbursement of public funds of the Royal Nigerian Navy;

(b) the insertion after the definition of "the Special List Agreement" of the following definition—

"the Supply Officer" means the senior officer of the Supply and Secretariat Branch of the Royal Nigerian Navy;".

Amendment of regulation 27. 4. Regulation 27 of the principal regulations is amended by the deletion of the word "Paymaster" and the substitution therefor of the following—"Supply Officer".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

These regulations amend the Nigerian Navy Regulations, 1958, in two respects:—

- (i) to reflect the recent conferment of the title "Royal" on the Nigerian Navy; and
- (ii) to provide for the designation "Supply Officer" and to divide between that officer and the Paymaster the duties now carried out by the Paymaster alone under regulations 26 and 27.
