EXCHANGE CONTROL, ORDINANCE, 1950-

(No. 35 of 1950)

Exchange Control (Import and Export) (Amendment) Order, 1960

Commencement: 28th January, 1960

In exercise of the powers conferred by sections 21, 22 and 31 of the Exchange Control Ordinance, 1950, the Federal Minister of Finance has made the following Order:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Exchange Control (Import and Export) (Amendment) Order, 1960, and shall be of Federal application.
- 2. Subsection (1) of section 4 of the Exchange Control (Import and Export) Order, 1950, is further amended—
  - (a) by the deletion in the fourth line of paragraph (a) of the amount "£10" and the substitution therefor of the following amount—

"£50";

(b) by the deletion in the sixth line of paragraph (a) of the amount "£100" and the substitution therefor of the following amount—

"£250";

(c) by the deletion in sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph (a) of the words "the Gold Coast" wherever they occur.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This Order raises the amount of sterling, Central Bank of Nigeria or West African Currency Board's notes which a traveller may take out of Nigeria to £50 and the previous limit of £100 on the currency notes of other territories is raised to £250.

It also deletes the Gold Coast (now Ghana) from the list of British West Africa Territories to which travellers going direct from Nigeria can take West African Currency Board's notes without restriction.

### Notice of Establishment of Epetedo Market

Commencement: 28th January, 1960

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Markets Ordinance, the Lagos Town Council, with the approval of the Minister of Lagos Affairs has established the following area as a public general market to be known as EPETEDO MARKET.

#### DESCRIPTION
