An Ordinance Further to Amend the Nigerian Coal Corporation Ordinance, 1950 (No. 29 of 1950).

[18th February, 1960]

Commencement.

Title.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the Federation of Nigeria as follows —

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Nigerian Coal Corporation (Amendment) Ordinance. 1960, and shall be of Federal application.

Short title and application. Repeal and replacement of section 5 of Ordinance No. 29 of 1950.

- 2. Section 5 of the Nigerian Coal Corporation Ordinance, 1950, is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor:—
- "Appointment of General Manager and delegation of functions.
- 5. (1) There shall be an officer of the Corporation, to be known as the General Manager, who shall be responsible for the execution of the policy of the Corporation and the transaction of its day-to-day business.
 - (2) The General Manager shall be appointed by the Corporation with the prior approval of the Minister.
 - (3) The Corporation shall delegate to the General Manager such of its functions as are necessary to enable him to transact efficiently the day-to-day business of the Corporation and, for this purpose, may, from time to time, issue written instructions under the common seal.
 - (4) The General Manager shall not be a member of the Corporation, but shall have the right to be present at all or any meetings of the Corporation, except when any matter involving him personally is being discussed, and shall be furnished with copies of all notices, agenda and minutes of all meetings of the Corporation.".
