CUSTOMS TARIFF ORDINANCE, 1958

(No. 60 of 1958)

Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) Order, 1961

Commencement : 11th May, 1961

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 6 of the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1958, the Governor-General acting in accordance with the advice of the Council of Ministers, has made the following Order—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) Order, 1961, and shall be of Federal application.

Citation and application.

2. The Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1958 (which relates to exemptions from import duties of customs) as the same was replaced by the Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) Order, 1959, is amended by the addition after item 66 of the following new item—

Amendment of Second Schedule No. 60 of 1958. L.N. 84 of 1959.

“66A. Tinplate of iron and steel not exceeding .016 inch gauge.”

NOW THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of section 3 of the Industrial Development (Income Tax Relief) Ordinance, 1958, the Governor-General, acting in accordance with the advice of the Council of Ministers, has made the following Order :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Industrial Development (Income Tax Relief) (Electrical Apparatus and Appliances) Order, 1961, and shall be of Federal application.

(a) the industry set out in the Schedule hereto shall be a pioneer industry; and

(b) the products set out in the Schedule hereto shall be pioneer products of the industry.
