The Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology (Declaration of Pensionable Appointments) Order, 1960

Commencement: 1st December, 1960

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection 4 of section 15 of the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology Ordinance, the Federal Minister of Education hereby makes the following order—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology (Declaration of Pensionable Appointments) Order, 1960.
- 2. The number specified in the second column of the Schedule of the offices specified in the first column of the Schedule shall be deemed to be pensionable appointments as from the date specified in the third column of the Schedule.

This order is made under section 15 (4) of the Nigerian College of Arts, Science and Technology Ordinance (Chapter 135) for the purpose of giving retrospective effect to certain pensionable posts in the College's establishment.

PROCLAMATION



NNAMDI AZIKIWE Governor-General

of Nig

By His Excellency The Right Honourable Dr NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria.

Whereas it is provided by section 36 of the Firearms Ordinance that the Governor-General may by proclamation prohibit the possession of any firearms or ammunition in any part of the Federation either absolutely or subject to such restrictions or conditions as may be specified:

AND WHEREAS by a proclamation made under that section dated the sixteenth day of November, 1960, and published in the Official Gazette of the Federation No. 73 of Volume 47 as Government Notice No. 2257 of 1960 the possession of all firearms and ammunition was prohibited absolutely in Obosi Local Council area and Onitsha Urban County Council area from the Port Harcourt Road southwards to Idemili River, west to the River Niger, and east to Obosi:

AND WHEREAS the Prime Minister of the Federation has advised that it is desirable to prohibit also the possession by natives of Obosi of all firearms and ammunition in that part of Onitsha Urban County Council area which is not included in the said proclamation:

Now, THEREFORE, I, NNAMDI AZIKIWE, Member of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief of the Federation of Nigeria, acting in accordance with the advice of the Prime Minister of the Federation, do hereby—

- (a) prohibit the possession by any person of all firearms and ammunition in Obosi Local Council area and Onitsha Urban County Council area from the Port Harcourt Road southwards to Idemili River, west to the River Niger, and east to Obosi; and
- (b) prohibit the possession by any native of Obosi, that is to say any person who is a member of a tribe indigenous to Obosi, of all firearms and ammunition in that part of Onitsha Urban County Council area which is not included in paragraph (a).

The proclamation dated the sixteenth day of November, 1960, and published in the Official Gazette of the Federation No. 73 of Volume 47 as Government Notice No. 2257 of 1960 is revoked.

PUBLIC HEALTH ORDINANCE (CHAPTER 165)

Public Health (Declaration of Infectious Diseases) Notice, 1960

Commencement. Commencement: 1st December, 1960

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 (1) of the Public Health Ordinance the Governor-General, in accordance with the advice of the Council of Ministers, has given the following notice—

Citation and application.

1. This notice may be cited as the Public Health (Declaration of Infectious Diseases) Notice, 1960, and shall apply to the Federal Territory of Lagos.

Declaration of infectious diseases.

2. The following diseases of an infectious or contagious nature are hereby declared to be infectious diseases within the meaning of the Public Health Ordinance, that is to say—

Anthrax (Human)

Chickenpox

Dysentry (Amoebic, Bacillary, Unclassified)

Influenza

Leprosy

Measles

Paratyphoid

Pneumonia

Poliomyelitis-Acute (Paralytic, Non-paralytic)

Rabies (human)

Relapsing Fever (Louse borne, Other)

Tetanus (Neonatal, Other)

Tuberculosis

Typhus (Louse borne, Other)

Whooping Cough

Revocation.

3. The declarations of infectious diseases set out on pages 1977 and 1978 of Volume IX of the Revised Edition of the Laws of the Federation of Nigeria and Lagos, 1958, are revoked.

This notice sets out a revised list of diseases declared to be infectious diseases within the meaning of the Public Health Ordinance, additional to those written into the Public Health Ordinance which are—plague, cholera, yellow fever, smallpox, cerebro-spinal meningitis, diphtheria, scarlet fever, typhoid and sleeping sickness.
