THE APPROPRIATION BILL

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill provides for the making of payments from the Consolidated Revenue Fund to defray so much of the estimated non-capital expenditure of the Government of the Federation during the financial year 1963-64 as is not already charged on that or any other public fund.

A BILL

FOR

AN ACT TO AUTHORISE THE ISSUE OUT OF THE CONSOLIDATED REVENUE FUND OF FIFTY-SEVEN MILLION, NINE HUNDRED AND SIXTY-THREE THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED AND EIGHTY POUNDS FOR THE SERVICE OF THE YEAR ENDING ON THE THIRTY-FIRST DAY OF MARCH, ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FOUR; AND TO APPROPRIATE THAT AMOUNT FOR THE PURPOSES SPECIFIED IN THIS ACT.

BE IT ENACTED by the Legislature of the Federation of Nigeria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

- 5 1.—(1) The Accountant-General may, when authorised so to do by warrants signed by the Minister of Finance, pay out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, the sums specified by the warrants, not exceeding in the aggregate fifty-seven million, nine hundred and sixty-three thousand, one hundred and eighty pounds.

- 10 (2) The amount mentioned in the foregoing subsection shall be appropriated to heads of expenditure as indicated in the Schedule to this Act.

- 15 (3) No part of the amount aforesaid shall be issued out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund after the end of the year mentioned in subsection (1) of this section.

Short title
and extent.

2. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 1963, and shall apply throughout the Federation.
