IMMIGRATION ACT, 1962

The Sidi Hamda Baba—Deportation Order, 1963

Whereas on the 24th day of July, 1963, before the Magistrates' Court, Lagos, Sidi Hamda Baba, was charged with offences contrary to subsection one of section 15 of the Immigration Act (Chapter 84) (now repealed):

AND WHEREAS the said Court in exercise of the power conferred by subsection one of section 16 of the said Act has, without proceeding to conviction, recommended that the said Sidi Hamda Baba be deported from Nigeria:

AND WHEREAS I, ALHAJI SHEHU SHAGARI, Federal Minister of Internal Affairs, after considering the recommendation aforesaid, have thought it fit to make a deportation Order:

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by subsection one of section 20 of the Immigration Act, 1963, it is hereby ordered that the said Sidi Hamda Baba, described as a French citizen, born in 1926 at Noma, Mauritania, shall leave Nigeria on the first available opportunity and remain thereafter out of Nigeria.

MERCHANT SHIPPING ACT, 1963

Registration of Shipping (Exemption) Notice, 1963

Commencement: 9th September, 1963

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (2) of section 307 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1962 the Federal Minister of Transport has exempted ships not exceeding fifteen tons employed solely on the coasts or inland waters of Nigeria (except fishing boats) from registration under the Act.
