PUBLIC ORDER (LAGOS) ACT (Cap. 169)

Notification of Public Meetings and Processions Order, 1964

Commencement: 26th October, 1964

In exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (1) of section 4 of the Public Order (Lagos) Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Notification of Public Meetings and Processions Order and shall come into force on the 26th day of October, 1964.

Citation and Commencement.

2. Whenever any public meeting or public procession is intended to be held in Lagos, not less than twenty-four hours notice of such meeting or procession shall be given to the Commissioner of Police, Federal Territory or in his absence, to the Assistant Commissioner of Police, Lagos Police Area.
