THE LEGAL EDUCATION (AMENDMENT) DECREE 1966



Decree No. 23

[7th April 1966]

Commence-

THE FEDERAL MILITARY GOVERNMENT hereby decrees as follows:-

1. In section 3 (c) of the Legal Education Act 1962 (by virtue of which a person does not become entitled to a qualifying certificate until he has successfully completed a course of practical training which lasted for not less than one year), for the words from "which lasted" to the end of the section there shall be substituted the words "which was conducted under arrangements made by the council and which (including time spent in taking an examination at the end, but excluding any interval between the conclusion of the examination and the announcement of the results thereof) lasted for a period fixed by the council as an academic year".

Reduction of required period of practical training.

2. This Decree may be cited as the Legal Education (Amendment) Decree 1966 and shall apply throughout Nigeria.
