## NIGERIAN LEGION ACT 1964 (1964 No. 18)

## The Nigerian Legion Electoral (Amendment) Regulations 1966

Commencement: 16th July 1966

In exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph 6 of Schedule 1 of the Nigerian Legion Act 1964 and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Executive Council has made the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Nigerian Legion Electoral (Amendment) Regulations 1966 and shall be read as one with the Nigerian Legion Electoral Regulations 1965 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal regulations").

Citation.

- The principal regulations are amended—
- (a) by substituting for regulations 20 and 21 the following new regulations but retaining the marginal notes—

Amendment of principal regulations.

- "20. If at the expiration of the time for the delivery of nomination papers the number of persons validly nominated does not exceed the specified number of persons that may be elected members in respect of a constituency, the persons validly nominated shall be declared elected.
- 21. If after the expiry of the time for the delivery of the nomination papers the number of persons validly nominated exceeds the specified number of persons that may be elected members in respect of a constituency, a poll shall take place in accordance with the provisions of these regulations."
- (b) in regulation 33 (1) by substituting for the words "of the candidate of his choice" the words "or in a constituency where the specified number of persons to be elected exceeds one, the names of the candidates of his choice";
  - (c) by substituting for regulation 38 the following new regulation—

"Plural voting 38. For the avoidance of doubt it is declared that where more candidates than one may be elected in the constituency in which the voter is registered, the voter may vote for the number prescribed for the constituency or for such lesser number as he may think fit; but subject thereto a voter shall not vote for more candidates than one, or record more than one vote in favour of any candidate."

## IMMIGRATION ACT 1963 (1963 No. 6)

## Prohibition of David Leslie Ivor Loshak from entering Nigeria Order 1966

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said section 18 (3) of the Immigration Act 1963 and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Executive Council has ordered that the immigration into Nigeria of the said DAVID LESLIE IVOR LOSHAK is prohibited accordingly.
