THE TRIBUNAL OF INQUIRY INTO LEAKAGES OF EXAMINATION QUESTIONS

Under the powers conferred upon me by section 1 of the Tribunals of Inquiry Decree 1966 and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, MAJOR-GENERAL YAKUBU GOWON, Head of the Federal: Military Government and Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, hereby constitute and appoint a Tribunal to be called the Tribunal of Inquiry into Leakages of Examination Questions with the terms of reference as hereinafter appear; And for this purpose I appoint—

Mr Justice D. A. R. Alexander

Mr P. C. Asiodu

Rev. Fr. Pedro Martins

Mr E. A. Molaio

to be members of the Tribunal with full power and authority to hold public hearing, save where the chairman is of opinion that it is necessary in the public interest or otherwise howsoever to exclude persons from the hearing or any part of the hearing :

AND I direct that Mr Justice D. A. R. Alexander aforesaid shall be the Chairman and I appoint Mr R. S. G. Agiobu-Kemmer to be the secretary to the Tribunal:

AND I further direct that any three members of the Tribunal of whom one shall be the Chairman, shall constitute a quorum:

And it is hereby declared for the avoidance of doubt that this instrument shall be deemed for all purposes to have had effect from 29th November 1967 and accordingly all meetings of the Tribunal held on and since that date shall be deemed to have been held under and pursuant to this instrument and the Tribunal hereunder shall hold or continue the inquiry, as the case may be, in such place or places and upon such dates as the Chairman may determine:

Terms of Reference

The Tribunal as hereby constituted shall with all convenient speed continue to inquire into leakages of examination questions generally:

AND in particular it shall—

- (a) investigate the causes of the recent leakages of examination questions of the First School Leaving Certificate held recently in Lagos and of the West African School Certificate examination thereafter held in Lagos and other parts of Nigeria;
 - (b) as far as possible determine responsibility for the leakages; and
- (c) in the light of (a) and (b) above make recommendations which will assist both the Federal Military Government and the West African Examinations Council in their efforts to prevent a recurrence of leakages of examination papers in the future, as the Tribunal may think fit.

AND I hereby require the Tribunal to submit its report to me in Lagos within one month after the date hereof or within such extended period as I may hereafter allow in writing.
