Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) Order 1968

Commencement : 29th April 1968

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 7 of the Customs Tariff Act 1965, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Federal Executive Council hereby makes the following Order :—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Duties and Exemptions) Order 1968 and shall apply throughout the Federation.

(2) This order shall come into operation on 29th April 1968.
