THE NATIONAL HONOURS ACT 1964 (1964 No. 5)

The Honours (Police) (Amendment) Warrant 1970

Commencement: 1st April 1970

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 1 of the National Honours Act 1964 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Head of the Federal Military Government hereby issues the following warrant:—

- 1. For article 3 (3) of the Honours (Police) Warrant 1966 there shall be substituted the following—
 - "(3) The Long Service Medal may be awarded to any member of the police force, other than a member of the Nigeria Special Constabulary, who has completed twelve years continuous service with exemplary record of character, that is to say—

(a) in the case of a senior police officer he is in every respect worthy of that distinction; or

- (b) in the case of a member of the force below the rank of cadet assistant superintendent of police his conduct sheet shows that:
 - (i) he has not suffered any punishment during the period of twelve years immediately preceding the date of recommendation for award: or
 - (ii) he has not suffered any punishment during the period of six years immediately preceding the date of recommendation for award and has not suffered more than six punishments during the whole period of his service."
- 2.—(1) This warrant may be cited as the Honours (Police) (Amendment) Warrant 1970 and shall apply throughout the Federation.
 - (2) This Warrant shall be deemed to have come into force on 1st April 1970.
