#### Salvatore Giuseppe Scavuzzo Deportation Order 1972

#### Commencement : 23rd December 1972

I, the Federal Commissioner for Internal Affairs, being of the opinion that SALVATORE GIUSEPPE SCAVUZZO at present in Nigeria ought to be classed as a prohibited immigrant and acting under the power conferred upon me by section 18 (2) of the Immigration Act 1963 hereby order the said SALVATORE GIUSEPPE SCAVUZZO to be deported from Nigeria as a prohibited immigrant by the first available means and I direct that the said SALVATORE GIUSEPPE SCAVUZZO shall thereafter remain out of Nigeria.

This Order may be cited as the SALVATORE GIUSEPPE SCAVUZZO Deportation Order 1972.

### Trade Disputes Emergency Decrees (Extension) Order 1972
