"The Tribunal hereby endorse the agreement reached between the parties and makes award as follows :—

(a) That Nigerian Agip Oil Company Limited through their recruiting agent Florina (Nigeria) Limited do cause to be paid to all its workers with effect from 1st April 1974 wages in accordance with the scales recommended by the Public Service Review Commission and accepted in the published views of the Federal Military Government on the Commission's Report and further do ensure :

(i) That conditions of service of the workers be at least as provided for, in the labour Decree 1974 and in any other enactments for the time being in force in Nigeria, subject to negotiations as to further improvements and reviews as may be agreed from time to time and generally,

(ii) That all agreements reached and contained in the memorandum of agreement be implemented with immediate effect.

(b) That Florina (Nigeria) Limited do re-engage with immediate effect all the workers who, in consequence of this dispute, had been laid off."

"The Tribunal upholds the agreements reached by the parties and makes awards accordingly :

1. That the daily minimum wage at Nigeria Glass, Containers, Metal Manufacturing Company Limited shall be ₦2.31 per day and the effective date of this new rate shall be 1st October 1974.
2. That the new rate shall be payable from 1st April 1975 and that the arrears of six months, that is to say, from 1st October 1974 to 31st March 1975 shall be paid by three consecutive equal monthly instalments beginning from June 1975.
3. That a wage structure shall be embodied in the conditions of service to be drawn up within 6 to 9 months of the date of signing the minutes of Management/Union meeting held on 22nd March 1975.
4. That all agreements reached which are contained in the minutes of Management/Union meeting on 22nd April 1975 be implemented."

Nigerian Enterprises Promotion (Exemptions) (No.2) Order 1975

Commencement : 1st April 1975

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 9 of the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Decree 1972 (as amended by the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion (Amendment) Decree 1973) and of all powers enabling me in that behalf I, Colonel Muhammadu Inuwa Wushishi, Federal Commissioner for Industries, with the approval of the Federal Executive Council, hereby make the following Order :—

1. The body specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order being a body engaged in the business described in the second column of the said Schedule is hereby exempted from the provisions of section 5 of the Nigerian Enterprises Promotion Decree 1972 in so far as the provisions of that section preclude the body as aforesaid from being owner or part owner of the enterprises specified in Schedule 2 to the Decree.

Companies (Special Provisions) (Exemption) (No. 3) Order 1975

Commencement : 18th August, 1975

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 1 (3) of the Companies (Special Provisions) Decree 1973, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Federal Executive Council hereby makes the following Order :—

1. The foreign companies listed in the first column of the Schedule to this Order being companies engaged in the projects specified in the second column of the said Schedule are hereby exempted from the provisions of Part X of the Companies Decree 1968 for the periods respectively set against each company in the third column of that Schedule.
