PORTS ACT (CAP. 155)

Ports (Declaration of Port Limits) Order 1975

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 6 of the Ports Act, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, Lieutenant-Colonel Shehu Musa Yar'adua, Federal Commissioner for Transport, hereby make the following Order:—

Commencement: 8th December 1975

- 1. The limits specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be the limits of the ports of Lagos, Port Harcourt, Calabar, Koko, Sapele, Forcados, Burutu, Warri, Degema and Bonny, respectively, for the purposes
- Forcados, Burutu, Warri, Degema and Bonny, respectively, for the purposes of the Act.

 2. The ports limits shall include all water-ways, creeks and swamp-land below the highest astronomical tide level and all beaches, moles, piers, of ports
- below the highest astronomical tide level and all beaches, moles, piers, jetties, slipways, quays and other works extending beyond the natural line of the line of the high water level. All ocean beaches within 100 metres of this high water level shall be deemed to be within the limits of the ports.
- 3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Ports (Declaration of Port Limits)
 - (2) The Declaration of Port Limits Order 1965 is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

Section 1

LIMITS OF THE PORT OF LAGOS

The limits of the port of Lagos shall be confined by parallels of Latitude 6 degrees 20 minutes North and 6 degrees 35 minutes North and by Meridians of Longitude 3 degrees 10 minutes East and 3 degrees 32 minutes East.

LIMITS OF PORT OF PORT HARCOURT

The limits of the port of Port Harcourt shall be confined by parallels of Latitude 4 degrees 40 minutes North and 4 degrees 50 minutes North and by Meridians of Longitude 6 degrees 59 minutes East and 7 degrees 09 minutes East.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The Order re-defines the limits of the ports of Lagos, Port Harcourt, Calabar, Koko, Sapele, Forcados, Burutu, Warri, Degema and Bonny in order to have effective control and jurisdiction over the creeks and waters of the ports and their respective navigable channels.

INSTRUMENT CONSTITUTING THE IMPORTATION OF CEMENT BY THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE TRIBUNAL OF INQUIRY

Under the powers conferred upon me by section 1 of the Tribunals of Inquiry Decree 1966, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, Brigadier Murtala Ramat Muhammed, Head of the Federal Military Government, Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces, hereby constitute and appoint a tribunal (to be called "the Importation of Cement by the Ministry of Defence Tribunal of Inquiry) with the terms of reference hereinafter appearing:

AND for this purpose I appoint-

Mr Justice M. B. Belgore

Mr M. A. Agate

Mrs R. A. Omotoso

Mr K. Oshisami

to be members of the tribunal with full power and authority to conduct an inquiry in accordance with the provisions of the Tribunals of Inquiry Decree 1966:

AND I direct that Mr Justice M. B. Belgore aforesaid shall be the chairman and that the inquiry shall be held in public save where the chairman is of opinion that it is necessary in the public interest or otherwise howsoever to exclude persons from the hearing or any part of a hearing:

AND I further direct that two members of whom one shall be the chairman, shall constitute a quorum, and the tribunal shall hold the said inquiry at such place or places and upon such dates as the chairman may determine.

Terms of Reference

- 2. The tribunal shall, with all convenient speed, inquire into-
- (a) the circumstances under which it became necessary for the Ministry of Defence to order 16 million metric tonnes of cement from overseas sources for issue, on repayment, to its building and civil engineering contractors;
- (b) the system adopted for placing of orders for the supply of cement to the Ministry of Defence from overseas sources and for selecting the suppliers of such cement :
- (c) whether any officer of the Ministry of Defence or any other person enriched himself improperly in consequence of orders placed by that Ministry for the supply of cement:
- (d) whether any public officer either by design or in collusion with some foreign interests not only defrauded the Federal Government but also intended to sabotage the development efforts of the Government by deliberately congesting our sea ports;
- (e) all such other matters relating to the importation of cement by the Ministry of Defence as the tribunal may deem fit.
- And I hereby require the tribunal to submit its report to me in Lagos not later than 30th November, 1975 or such later date as I may allow in writing.
