# UNIVERSITY COLLEGE HOSPITAL ACT (CAP. 205)

## University College Hospital (Hospital Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 1975

*Commencement : 28th August 1975*

In exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 15 of the University College Hospital Act, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the University College Hospital Board of Management, with the approval of the Federal Commissioner for Health, hereby makes the following regulations :—

1. Part I of the First Schedule to the University College Hospital (Hospital Fees) Regulations 1973 is hereby amended as follows—

(a) in paragraph A entitled "Exemption from all charges", for sub-paragraph (c) thereof, there shall be substituted the following—

"(c) Persons receiving treatment or advice for pulmonary tuberculosis or incurable malignant diseases.";

(b) immediately after sub-paragraph (d) in the said paragraph A, there shall be added a new sub-paragraph (e) as follows—

"(e) The holder of a post in the permanent establishment of the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Ibadan."; and

(c) in paragraph B1 entitled "Charges for Maintenance and Accommodation only", sub-paragraph (e) shall be deleted.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the University College Hospital (Hospital Fees) (Amendment) Regulations 1975.

### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note does not form part of the above Regulations but is intended to explain the effect)*

The Regulations amend the University College Hospital (Hospital Fees) Regulations 1973 by exempting from payment of fees staff serving as consultants to the University of Ibadan Teaching Hospital and who render full-time service, and (in addition to patients suffering from pulmonary tuberculosis) other patients suffering from incurable and other malignant diseases.
