TRADE DISPUTES DECREE 1976 (1976 No. 7)

Trade Disputes (Delegation of Certain Statutory Functions) Order 1978

Commencement: 13th April 1978

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Ministers' Statutory Powers and Duties (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, as modified by the Constitution (Miscellaneous Provisions) (No. 2) Decree 1967, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, Major-General Henry Edmund Olufemi Adefope, Federal Commissioner for Labour, hereby make the following Order:—

1.—(1) The functions conferred on the Federal Commissioner for Labour under the provisions of Trade Disputes Decree 1976, mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, are hereby delegated to the Director (Industrial Relations) (hereinafter called 'the Director') Federal Ministry of Labour.

Delegation of certain statutory functions. 1976 No. 7.

- (2) In exercising the functions delegated under this section, the Director shall have regard to any directions on matters of policy which may from time to time be given to him by the Commissioner.
- (3) Nothing in this Order shall prevent the Commissioner from exercising any of the functions hereby delegated.
- 2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Trade Disputes (Delegation of Certain Statutory Functions) Order 1978.

(2) The Trade Disputes (Delegation of Certain Statutory Functions)
Order 1976 is hereby revoked.

TRAFFIC WARDEN SERVICE DECREE 1975

(1975 No. 21)

Traffic Wardens (Maximum Number of Persons) Notice 1978

Commencement: 1st April 1977

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 2 (3) of the Traffic Warden Service Decree 1975, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, the Head of the Federal Military Government hereby gives the following notice:—

1. The maximum number of persons to hold appointments as traffic wardens throughout the Federation is hereby fixed at two thousand and eight hundred.

2. This Notice may be cited as the Traffic Wardens (Maximum Number of Persons) Notice 1978 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 1st April 1977.
