THE SUPREME COURT (AMENDMENT) RULES 1979

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 121 (2) of the Constitution of the Federation, the Supreme Court of Nigeria hereby makes the following Rules :—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Supreme Court (Amendment) Rules 1979, and shall be read and construed as one with the Supreme Court Rules 1977, and shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1979.

2. Order 9 of the Supreme Court Rules 1977 is hereby amended by adding thereto immediately after rule 7, the following new rule as rule 8—

8. The Court may, where it considers the circumstances of an appeal to be exceptional, or that the hearing of an appeal must be accelerated in the interest of justice, waive compliance with the provisions of Order 9, in so far as they relate to the preparation and filing of Briefs of Argument, either wholly or in part, or reduce the time limits specified in the Order, to such extent as the Court may deem reasonable in the circumstances of the case.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note does not form part of these Rules but is intended to explain the effect)
