## Currency (Miscellaneous Provisions) Notice 1979

Commencement: 2nd July 1979

In exercise of the powers conferred by section 19 (b) of the Central Bank of Nigeria Act and section 4 (3) of the Decimal Currency Decree 1971, and of all other powers enabling it in that behalf, the Central Bank of Nigeria hereby gives the following Notice:—

- 1.—(1) The Central Bank of Nigeria (in this Notice hereafter referred to as "the Bank") shall as from 2nd July 1979 reissue the N1, N5 and N10 denominations of the naira respectively each bearing the devices set out in Table A of the Schedule to this Notice.
- (2) Accordingly, all existing currency notes of the N1, N5 and N10 denominations each bearing the devices set out in Table B of the Schedule to this Notice which are legal tender in Nigeria on 2nd July 1979 shall, as from that date be called in by the Bank on payment of the face value thereof.
- (3) All existing currency notes of the N1, N5 and N10 denominations specified in Table B of the Schedule to this Notice and which are legal tender in Nigeria on 2nd July 1979 shall continue to be legal tender in Nigeria up to and including 2nd October 1979 and as from 3rd October 1979, the said currency notes shall cease to be legal tender in Nigeria.
- 2. This Notice may be cited as the Currency (Miscellaneous Provisions) Notice 1979 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 2nd July 1979.
